LEWISTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—The Idaho State Grange, disregarding advice of leaders and reversing a stand of a year ago, yesterday gave approval to a bill to work for legislation which would reverse a stand of a year ago. The resolution, passed after heated debate, marked the close of the 46th annual convention of the Grange here. The Grangers voted to meet next year in Boise. Oct. 14-17. Delegates gave virtually unanimous endorsement to a resolution opposing a proposed state sales tax "for any purpose." They also asked the legislature to turn over the buildings at closed Southern Idaho College of Education to a religious organization.

Merchants in Nation Hope for Record Christmas Sales; Early Tone Sluggish

CHICAGO, Dec. 7 (AP)—Merchants here and generally throughout the Midwest and across the country will reach or surpass last year's record level before Christmas, although they report a sluggish start to a slow start in some places.

A national survey showed retail sales ranged from the "best ever" downward.

Discommodities warm weather over much of the country was blamed for some of the sales loss. Eighty-eight percent of the stores reported a decline of nine per cent. At Seattle a 10-day transit strike cut into early holiday trade.

One merchant said, "people aren't holiday minded," in reference to the slow start in some west coast cities. It wasn't the stores' fault, one San Francisco department store brought on Santa Nov. 3 in an effort to spur sales.

Patrick Laughlin, official of the Lazarus company, central Ohio's largest department store in Columbus, said the store anticipated 1936 Christmas sales would be the biggest ever. Home furnishing and appliance sales were setting record highs, he said.

Such other houses reported record sales last month. Sears Roebuck and company said sales for November were "up 12.7 per cent over a year ago."

Montgomery Ward and company spokesman said that a bumper crop of children in the five to 10 age group would boost sales to new highs.

PEARL HARBOR SKELETON

On the rusted hull of the battleship Arizona, which lies at the bottom of the water of Pearl Harbor, the American flag is raised every day from a tiny platform. It is at once a tribute and a powerful reminder.

Britain Once More Asks U.S. Aid to Halt Finance Disaster

NEW YORK, Dec. 7.—Britain once more is looking to Uncle Sam to help her out of another financial mess.

Crises for the pound sterling, which a large part of the world uses to transact business, have come along since the war with fair regularity—1946, 1949, 1952, 1955. The present one looks like a dilly.

Uncle Sam would suffer, too, if the pound sterling were weakened too much. And U. S. foreign policy is based on alliance with England and western European nations. So the British and French troops bander in Egypt and the rout was on, during November the reserves dropped by 275 million dollars, slipping below two billion dollars to the lowest level since December, 1952.

It's going to be a rough winter in England at the best, even with the aid which Uncle Sam is likely to give her. Oil shortages mean more than just the parking of the family car in the garage. They threaten a drop in factory output. This could mean unemployment at

home and a decline in exporting goods, further weakening the position of the pound in relation to the dollar.

The weakness would affect a large part of the world outside the iron curtain. The dollar area covers most of the western hemisphere. The sterling area includes the British commonwealth nations, except Canada. Among them are India, Pakistan, South Africa, Australia, New Zealand. One-fourth of the world's population is in the sterling bloc. American trade with all of them.

American bankers point out that while the crisis in the pound sterling is not enough and the winter's outlook bleak, Britain's financial position is far from desperate yet. Addition to the official reserves

includes close to one billion dollars worth of dollar securities owned by the British government. And it probably has left some of the 60 million dollars worth of short term U. S. government securities it was known to hold until recently.

Weins and his family lived in the Hungarian town of Sopron near the Austrian border—and had little trouble reaching Vienna with their family from there. The brothers got together in Vienna.
