## Scores of Rebels Killed As Hungarian Resistance Spreads into Provinces

BUDAPEST, Dec. 8 (AP)—Reports that scores of Hungarians were killed Saturday in clashes with police and Russian troops indicated the rioting of earlier this week in Budapest has spread to the provinces. An informant said 10 persons in a large crowd of demonstrators were killed in a clash with Russian tanks and Hungarian police in the north Hungarian town of Salgotarjan. The clash occurred when hundreds of Hungarians demonstrated for the release of arrested workers' council leaders. Leaders of Hungarian workers in Budapest have threatened a general strike.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., Dec. 8 (AP)—Five persons were believed killed Saturday night when their twin-engine plane crashed in a snowstorm on the Canadian shore of Lake Ontario. Canadian Provincial police said the wreckage was partly submerged 600 feet off shore near Port Maitland, Ont., and showed no signs of life.

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Dec. 8 (AP)—Thirteen countries drew up a resolution Saturday night whereby the general assembly would condemn the actions of the U. N. charter by the Soviet Union in Hungary. U. S. delegate Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., asked that the assembly take it up Monday.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8 (AP)—Secretary of State Dulles took off for Paris and a NATO council meeting Saturday, prepared to discuss the European pact on the control of atomic weapons. He said he was "confident" that next week's North Atlantic Treaty council meeting "will strengthen the bonds that unite the treaty members."

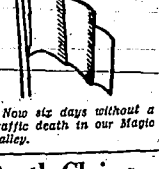

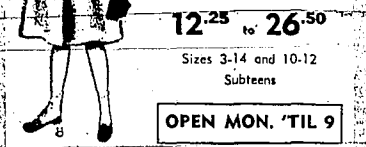

### Welder Spark Is Held Cause Of Dock Blast

NEW YORK, Dec. 8 (AP)—Fire Commissioner Edward P. Cavanagh Jr. today said a welder's spark caused a fire which killed 16 men and injured 20 others in the largest fire in the history of the city since the fire of 1911.

Cavanagh said Friday night that sparks from the torches of ship fitters, making repairs on the roof of the big pier, first burst through a hole in the roof and then spread to cargoes of alcohol, lacquer and varnish.

Twenty men were killed and 246 injured in the fire and blast last Monday. Damages had been estimated at 15 million dollars.

The "primordial" fuses, the commissioner said, "because heated and detonated" and was the competent and producing cause of the tragic explosion.

The manufacturer of the fuses, Union-Blastford company of St. Louis, Mo., said it had shipped "hundreds of millions of feet" of the fuse cord in 20 years without one instance of its exploding in transit.

One phase of the hearing was completed Friday as cross-examination of FNP staff engineers ended.

Public power groups have been opposing the granting of a construction license to FNP and suggested instead that a federal dam be built at Nes Perce rather than the FNP dam at Mountain Sheep and Pleasant Valley.

Ice cream frozen during October totaled 210,000 gallons—well above last year's 179,000 gallons and the five-year average of 175,000 gallons.

demonstrators were killed and others were wounded.  
The informant reported crowds at Debrecen demanded the release of arrested workers and peaceful council members.  
Rioting broke out at 3 p.m. when Russian troops opened fire and fighting lasted late into the night, the informant said. The number of casualties was not known.  
The informant said there were demonstrations and clashes at Tatabanya. Police opened fire and killed several Hungarians, he added.  
Kadar and his minister of State, Gyorgy Marosán, were reported to have told the workers the government considers everyone "counter-revolutionaries" who are not in them — or do not side with them.  
The workers believe Kadar intends to use force, if necessary, to break their resistance.  
Budapest appeared calm — at least the official word of the action by the workers. But Russian armored cars and tanks were on extensive patrol of the city streets and there was only a surface peace.  
There seemed to be no further news from Budapest since the first in the capital since early this week when new forces were moved in to end the line of demonstrations by Hungarian women.  
The last meeting of the worker representatives with Kadar was Friday night in the parliament building, attended by Russian tanks. Minister of State Gyorgy Marosán also took part.  
Kadar and Marosán tried to appear confident they can control Hungary with their new police force, numbering 2,000 in Budapest alone, but workers were not intimidated.  
Railway workers called a strike for Saturday unless their demands were met. Men arrested by police were freed. The three were released Friday night. The council has taken up the demands of Hungarian revolutionaries, including free elections and a return of control to the workers. It has tested bitterly arrests of labor leaders and their detention without charges.

**Hyrum H. Martin Claimed by Death**  
BURLEY, Dec. 8.—Hyrum H. Martin, about 71, died early Saturday of a heart attack.  
Mr. Martin was born in Toledo, Ohio. He married Beth White on June 12, 1907, in the Salt Lake City LDS temple. They moved to Ogden in 1917. He retired from the company several years ago. He was secretary of the high priests quorum of the second ward at the time of his death. He served on a Swiss-German LDS mission in 1912.  
Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Thelma Walker, Burley; five grandchildren; three nephews, William H. Martin and Joseph H. Martin, both Burley, and Andrew H. Martin, Salt Lake City; three sisters, Mrs. Olive Lundberg, Provo; Mrs. Leona Curdick, Turley, Idaho; and Alice Martin, Harp.

Funeral services are pending at the McCulloch mortuary.  
**Engineer Studies Canal's Clearing**  
CAIRO, Egypt, Dec. 8.—Raymond A. Wheeler, retired U. S. Army lieutenant general and former Panama canal engineer, arrived Saturday to begin discussions with Egyptian officials on plans for clearing the Suez canal.  
He came in a plane accompanied by 19 experts who will aid in mapping technical aspects of opening the canal, which has been blocked by bridges and ships during the recent military action against Egypt. Dag Hammarskjöld, the U. N. secretary general, is authorized to negotiate contracts for clearing the canal. Wheeler, 71, has been named to aid Hammarskjöld.

### Navy Reports Moon-Satellite Rocket Tested

when any knowledge of plans for test firing.  
Reporters near Cape Canaveral said they began hearing rumors that there seemed to be unusual activity at Patrick air force base. From four miles away, outside the restricted area, they kept watch through binoculars.  
Jim Halbe, reporter for the Orlando Sentinel, saw the spectacle. He said the 42-foot, seven-ton rocket rose slowly and almost silently before it began streaking up and away followed by the pink trail of its rocket fire. He watched the rocket for about 40 seconds before it was lost to view in the night sky.  
After the launching, the navy in Washington issued an announcement containing some details.  
It said that when the rocket reached a 30-mile altitude, a device carrying an automatic radio transmitter, "Minitrack," was ejected and tracked by scientists at the air force base as it descended toward the sea. Minitrack is a miniature radio transmitter which will be used in the earth satellite. It weighs only 15 ounces and sends out a continuous radio signal.  
The Viking also carried, in a nose cone, other automatic "telemetering" equipment and tracking beacons.  
This cone was blown free after 50 seconds of flight and its "reports" checked as it fell toward the sea.  
The new Vanguard launching device includes a curved steel frame arched over which water floods to direct the intensely hot exhaust of the rocket as it builds up thrust at the instant of launching.  
The modified Viking used in Saturday's test is similar to the first of the three-stage rocket engine series designed for the satellite. Three will burn the 30-inch diameter of the satellite into an orbit 200 to 400 miles above the earth.

### Part-Time Work Develops Into Local Firm Selling Products Across Nation

A Twin Falls woman who was on relief in 1934 has turned what started as a part-time means of supplementing her income into a growing manufacturing business which supports about 25 employees and markets its products throughout the nation. Mrs. Christina Petersen, owner of Chris-Line Originals, was left with four children in 1932 and no apparent means of supporting them. For about the next 10 years she did housework, catered for parties, worked in a local department store where she later became head of her department, clerked and did saddle work in a saddle shop and was a night clerk in a hotel.

The history of Chris-Line Originals actually begins when she started in the saddle shop. Although hired as a canvas worker, she also found time to learn leather work and to make buckskin, fringes and suede-coats. Her jacket business covering buckskin, fringes and suede-coats, developed rapidly and she began selling in rodeo performers and others, both from her shop and by mail. In February, 1940, a salesman took her to the University of Wyoming and Montana, and soon after began selling them in Arizona and New Mexico. A California salesman was added later, and four years ago an Ohio salesman began marketing her products in the Midwest.

Her increasing volume, which now includes an outlet in Florida, caused Mrs. Petersen to move her business several times before settling at its present location, 340 Main avenue south. It also changed from a one-woman industry to one which hires seven full-time and another 18 part-time employees, the latter group doing piece work in their homes. Her home workers are primarily handicapped women, or those who have small children or invalids to care for. They cut fringe, make buttons, set on beads and line her jackets.

Bally also developed a new type .300 about improved magnum that shows up "very powerful" in tests.

In addition to machining, Bally turned his attention to stocks, about 10 years ago. At that time he purchased 11 walnut trees and several maples. Using only the stump wood, he patiently aged the wood. Walnut requires four and one-half years of aging and maple is just a year shorter.

When ready, the stumps are sawed into three-inch slabs and the fashioning begins. Bally says there is no way to estimate the number of stocks that can be taken from a stump. He notes a lot of the wood is waste. None of the outer wood can be used and an unseen knot can disfigure an entire stump.

### Officers Intensify Search to Find Mad Bomber of Gotham

NEW YORK, Dec. 8 (AP)—The "mad bomber of Gotham," a past-middle-aged skilled mechanic who has turned his crazed hatred of a private utility company into a 10-year reign of terror in public places, is the object of a redoubled police search.

The police are working to beat death. They know time is running out—for in 16 years during which this psychopath has placed 28 and exploded 23, none has been killed, although many have been injured.

The man is intelligent. He has a desire to kill and maim. And he craves publicity, apparently to publicize his feelings against the Consolidated Edison company, a utility serving the metropolitan area.

These facets of his character the police know through his many letters—written to them and to others before and after placement of bombs—and through several hundred thousand man-hours of search into every suspected angle of the case.

Low-power bombs—made of a small section of pipe with steel plugs at each end and triggered by a flashlight battery and bulb connected to a common wristwatch—have exploded in telephone booths, lockers, and men's rooms in railroad terminals, the public library, a subway train, department stores, and

### \$1,000 Quota Set for Drive For Hungary

A goal of \$1,000 has been established for the Twin Falls as its share of the American Red Cross Hungarian relief drive.

Nationally, the Red Cross is asking for five million dollars in emergency funds for food, clothing, shelter and medical supplies in the strife-torn country.

The organization expects to be feeding 200,000 persons by January with another 100,000 needing medical care. It is operating more than 40 refugee camps in Austria now and caring for an additional 8,000 persons living with individual families.

Distribution of the relief material is being directed by a central body of Swiss citizens. The International Red Cross committee has established headquarters in Budapest, staffed by 28 workers, who are administering the program.

The Red Cross is providing free cable communication for refugees in Austria to relatives in the United States.

Seven convoys had carried Hungary up to Nov. 28 carrying a total of 722 tons of coal, food and medicine. Another 2,000 pounds of medicine were sent in by river boats.

In addition to bread, fats, cereals, sugar and powdered milk, the organization is providing medicine, milk, sugar, cod liver oil and flour for all children through 14 years and pregnant women.

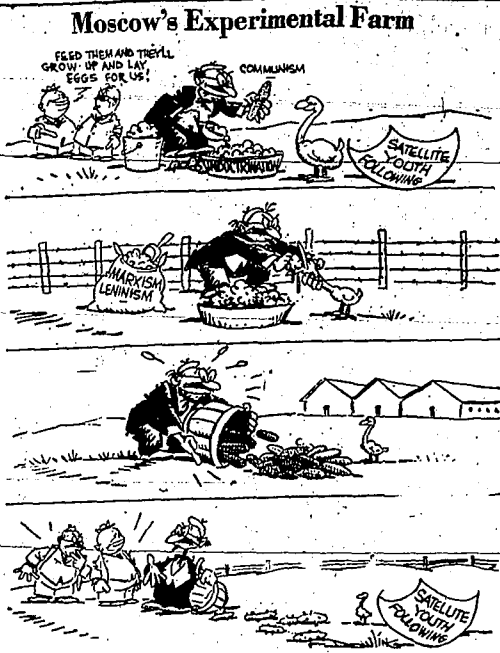

### Tax on Beer Proposed by Idaho Group

BOISE, Dec. 8 (AP)—The Idaho Allied Civic Forces, which for several years has been advocating a five-cent bottle tax on beer in Idaho, said Friday it now proposes a five-mill or one-half cent per ounce tax on the product.

The change was made public in the December issue of the ACF's official organ, "The Idaho Challenge."

The Challenge said the five-mill tax would be no easier one to impose and to collect. The rate would be 5 1/2 cents per 11-ounce bottle, six cents per 12-ounce bottle and proportionately more for larger containers.

The Challenge said 7,226,946 gallons of beer were sold in Idaho last year, or 1,014,619,260 ounces. It said the five-mill tax would raise \$4,071,926, compared to the actual tax of \$192,631 collected on the gallons sold. At this rate, the five-mill tax would raise more than 10 million dollars every two years.

## Salk Vaccine Methods Now Being Tested

POCAHELLO, Dec. 8 (AP)—The southeastern district health department is conducting tests of Salk polio vaccine which may help prove the vaccine can be produced more simply.

Dr. J. W. Wyatt, district director, said Friday partial results of the tests are beginning to point to a new idea—that there might be a cross-immunization between the three polio vaccines.

This, he said, would mean the vaccine manufacturing process could be simplified considerably. Three viruses are known to cause polio and three processed viruses are put into the vaccine.

If cross-immunization is a fact, Wyatt said, the manufacturing process might be simplified to include fewer than the three virus cultures at the present time. The three cultures are grown separately, "killed," tested extensively and then mixed.

Wyatt said Idaho is the only state that he knows to be testing the effectiveness of the vaccine.

"I don't mean to imply that there is any danger in the vaccines now," he said "but we just wanted to see how well it was working."

He said tests are being conducted in Pocatello and Lewiston areas under the direction of the Idaho department of health.
