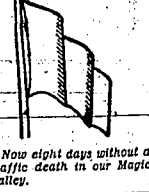

### Many U.S. Cities Hold 'Human Rights Day' to Mourn Brutalities in Hungary

Thousands of Americans from coast to coast paused in prayerful meditation today for the victims of "Human Rights Day" in Hungary.

The "Human Rights Day" movement is urging Americans everywhere today to observe United Nations Human Rights day by lifting their hearts and their prayers to the oppressed people of Hungary.

The pen of church bells at noon sounded the call to prayer in many cities. Flares were flown at half mast in some cities as a day long reminder of the sacrifices made by freedom loving Hungarians.

"On this Human Rights Day," the President said in his statement, "it is for each one of us to recognize that we are one in our Father's house, and that in truly his brother's keeper."

"We cannot shed that responsibility, nor do we want to do so. Let us resolve on this day that the world shall never forget what tyranny has done to our fellow man in Hungary."

Mr. Eisenhower's statement, his most sympathetic to date on behalf of the Hungarians, also said the Soviet terror in Hungary "repudiates and negates" virtually every article in the U. N. declaration of human rights.

"That these human rights have been so flagrantly repudiated in case for worldwide mourning," he said.

Among the cities holding special observances were San Francisco, Port Worth, El Paso, Cincinnati, Albuquerque, Washington and Newport, Ky. New York and some other cities marked the day with special proclamations.

A moment of silence was observed in schools in San Francisco, birthplace of the United Nations, Port Worth and El Paso. San Francisco Mayor George Christopher also asked all residents to join in prayer.

Students at Xavier university in Cincinnati wore black arm bands, and the city council unanimously adopted a resolution condemning Russia. The resolution warned that "it betheoves all free people to regular forcefully their grave concern over the inhumanities that have taken place in violation of human rights."

In Chicago, residents donated an estimated \$100,000 for Hungarian relief in a tag day held last week.

Donations of blood came from 100 air force reservists in the Pittsburgh area for Hungarian patriots injured in fighting the Russians.

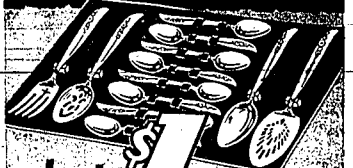

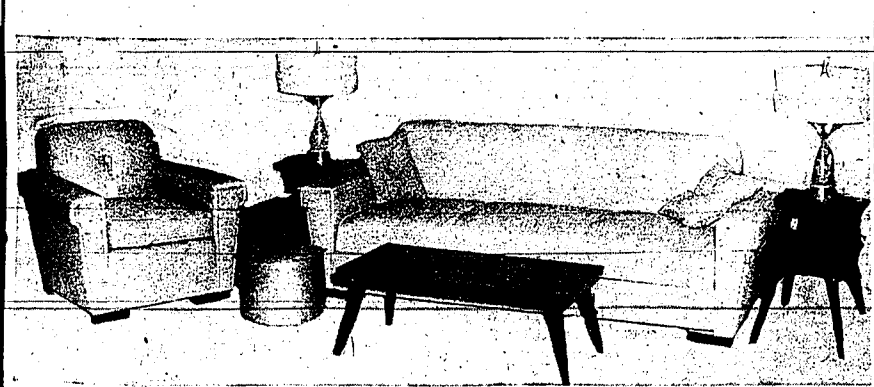

### New, Hot Tip Is Offered for Horse Players

CHICAGO, Dec. 10 (AP)—Science to come up with a hot tip for horse players.

According to an Abbott Laboratories publication, how a horse runs may depend a lot on his red blood cell count.

When the Abbott publication "Who's New?" the theory is that the horse with a red cell count below 5 million cells per cubic centimeter of blood either runs out of the money or is not raced during the best period of the publication said.

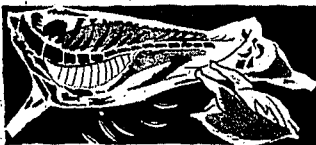

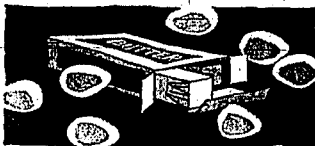

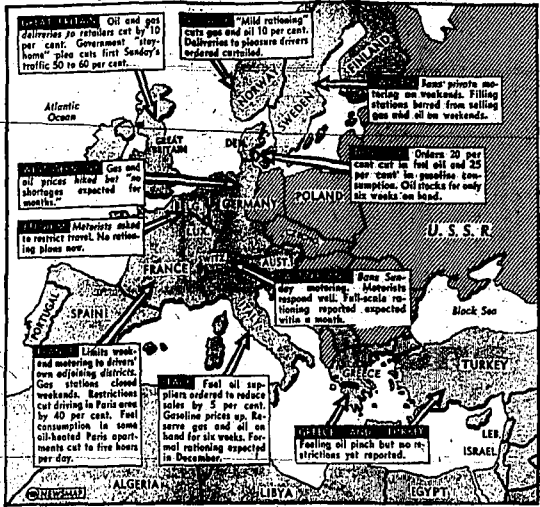

### Mighty Boom Predicted for U. S. Building

NEW YORK, Dec. 10 (AP)—A spectacular boom in the construction industry is just around the corner, according to a top building publication.

By 1966, new construction is likely to be running at a rate 45 per cent above this year's record volume of 44 billion dollars, the December issue of Architectural Forum magazine predicted.

Almost every type of building from farmhouses to factories will share the boom, according to the study prepared for the magazine by Washington economist, Mills Colan.

Reasons Cited

"Tied to an expanding economy, with the promise of strong sales in population, production, and income, building prospects over the next decade are not just bright but dazzling," the magazine said.

It predicted the following highlights:

Total new private construction will climb 41 per cent while public building will be up close to 43 per cent.

Non-residential building, under heavy new laws for more schools, hospitals and commercial structures, will rise nearly 43 per cent to 14 billion dollars.

Residential construction faces a 26 per cent expansion in housing starts to about 17 billion dollars.

Highway building will probably have more impact on construction over the next decade than any other factor in history. Outlays for roads and airfields will rise 70 per cent.

More Gains Seen

Public utilities and other public service facilities will show gains ranging from 36 to 84 per cent.

The magazine based its projections on the 1956 population of 157 million and a gross national product of 315 billion dollars (in terms of 1954 dollars).

Noting that production's share of the gross national product in the past decade has been nine per cent, the study predicted this share will rise to 11 per cent and "probably a bit higher."

This estimate comes from U. S. Coast Guard safety experts here.

FITZBURGH, Dec. 10 (AP)—Santa Claus may have to give an extra jolt to his pack this Christmas Eve. About 40 per cent of all 20-toys are either made of steel or contain steel.

The toy industry, which reported record sales of more than a billion dollars last year, has been using more steel in its products.

In 1956, toy makers bought in excess of 50,000 tons of steel. Much of the steel was used to specification at steel mills.

The steel industry attributed the increased demand to a trend on the part of parents to buy toys that seek toys that imitate tools and appliances used by the adult.

Minors, blazers, sweepers and many other models of streamlined household appliances are finding their place under the pine tree for little kids.

### Mental Health Director Cites Need for Preventive Projects

OROPINO, Dec. 10 (AP)—Idaho mental health director Dr. John L. Butler says that a program of preventive psychiatry not only could reduce the number of human beings who would be hospitalized, but could save large amounts of money which now go to penal and custodial institutions.

Dr. Butler contends that even one specialist "could prevent four or five youngsters each year from going into a life of crime or mental illness."

He said in an interview that the case of Paul D. Matovich, 20-year-old University of Idaho freshman, might eventually cost the state \$100,000. Matovich is the youth from Ketchikan who is charged with murder in connection with a University of Idaho dormitory fire in which three students lost their lives.

"The real tragedy is that this might have been avoided if something had been done about the problem earlier," Dr. Butler said.

He said Matovich had had a problem since he was a child and he would more likely have been a teacher could give him.

State investigators say Matovich admitted setting the campus dormitory fire. And Lieut. Percy Miles of the Spokane police department said that Matovich had a history of mental illness.

Butler said the cost of the Matovich case, "possibly \$100,000, would go far in starting up a preventive psychiatric program."

The present practice, he said, of waiting until an individual becomes a social menace of some type is costly than taxpayers realize. It is better to spend \$100 to prevent a mentally ill criminal person, Butler said.

CLEVELAND, O., Dec. 10 (AP)—Industrial production is expected to continue to rise at a rate that the momentum will carry the present prosperity well into 1957, Steel Magazine said today.

# Signs of Serious Wreck Are Used to Solicit Funds; New Racket Is Illegal

CARLSTADT, N. J., (UPI)—There was the mishap, a wrecked car at the crossroads. The wrecked car was the sign of a serious wreck. There was a uniformed man slowing traffic and three men with paper cups soliciting money from passing drivers.

This was the town of Carlstadt, N. J., learning to finance philanthropy with the nation's best collection of paper cups. The Sunday Safety Drive.

By sundown, drivers had contributed \$313.74 to a local cause. The cause was the solicitation of police authority, Carlstadt, and a growing number of American communities, work it this way:

1. A benevolent protective or social club embarks on a local program requiring money.
2. A Sunday or legal holiday—sure to bear bumper-to-bumper traffic—is set aside for fund raising.
3. The articles of terror are borrowed—a wreck or a coffin; signs and posters; a policeman, marshal or constable, or maybe only his uniform.

The morning dawn. The traffic flows through the town, slowed and impeded by the obstructing wreck and policeman in the uniform. It's duck soup for a man with a cup to say... "Slow down and live. Won't you contribute to our safety campaign?"

Nestle anybody does. And only one in a while somebody asks: "What's the money for?"

One of the Carlstadt traffic solicitors answers it this way: "We're buying a sound projector and safety film for the school children."

It's an answer. But even this solicitor admits that "it doesn't really tell 'em anything."

The whole business is as illegal as armed robbery.

According to Col. George W. Ziegler, assistant director of traffic law enforcement in New Jersey: "The law says that nobody can stand in the highway and impede vehicles to solicit contributions. It's a violation that is punishable by arrest and prosecution."

But he's a way of collecting money that's spreading across the coun-

try.

Added testimony comes from one of the nation's foremost traffic-and-safety councils. One expert, speaking for his agency, puts it this way: "This kind of Sunday-scare campaign is baloney, it's extortion and it's dangerous. And besides making people resentful and disrespectful toward the traffic officer's uniform, it is of dubious value in dealing with the very serious problem of traffic safety."

In Carlstadt, the leader of the Sunday Drive agreed that his campaign was extra-legal—but not dangerous.

"After all," he said, "a lot of towns are doing it. And besides, the money is going to a good cause. The kids. Anyway, a couple of New Jersey traffic inspectors came by to see how it was doing and said we deserved congratulations for slowing the traffic down."

He was somewhat disappointed that his campaign had not made more money than the \$313.74. It was

enough, he said, to buy the sound projector, but not enough to buy all the films his group had planned.

Next year, one solicitor said, proceeds from the Sunday Safety Drive will go toward an ice skating rink and playground area for the kids.

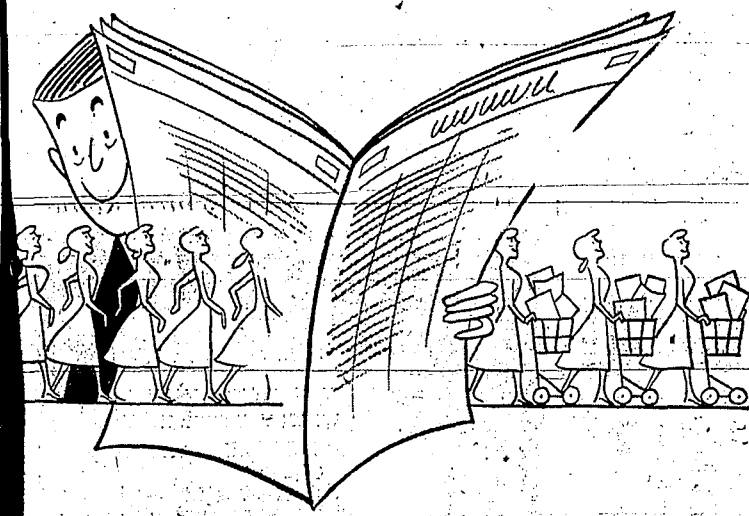
Tomorrow they will be joined in a formal conference by the foreign ministers of the other 12 members of the North Atlantic countries.
