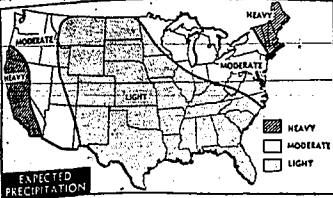

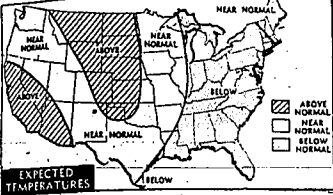

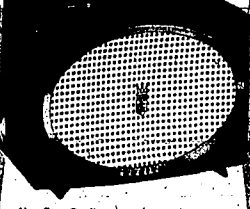

Blind Man Is Bridge Game "Life Master"

CHARLOTTE, N. C., Dec. 11 (UP)—"There's great sportsmanship in it," says Arthur Dye, a blind man who has become a contract bridge life master. The Charlotte osteopath who lost his vision at 17 in an accident says he has been playing bridge since the game was invented in 1825. "I started as a boy with what and where. Bridge followed naturally," says Dye. It is necessary to acquire 300 points in the American Contract Bridge League to become a life master. In New Orleans this week Dr. Dye did just that. The stocky champion plays with marked cards. He puts his own markings in Braille on the corners. "But don't let some opponents grow lery when your sensitive fingers pass over the cards in dealing," he was asked. "No indeed," Dr. Dye said, "chancing like that would be too obvious. They could see me feeling out the cards. "I think the most wonderful thing about tournament playing is that all the players are so wonderful to me. For instance, every one of the players, when he puts down a card, calls it for my benefit. I've played all over the eastern part of the United States and not a one has failed to do this for me. "Mrs. Dye accompanies her 60-year-old husband on trips but does not play, explaining: "You just not the type for it." Dr. Dye has played with some of the world's outstanding bridge experts—including Charles Goren, Oswald Jacoby and Alfred Shelineau.

Girl Survives Wild Ride on Auto Bumper

CLEARWATER, Pa., Dec. 11—(AP)—Deputy Sheriff Ken Carpenter said today he chased a fast moving automobile three-quarters of a mile to find the driver her small child was riding on the rear bumper.

Adjustment of Trade Policies Eyed by U. S.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11—(AP)—An adjustment of United States trade policies in favor of hard-pressed western farmers is part of a program an expanded aid program now contemplated by responsible administration officials.

The suggested new look in U. S. foreign policy is officially termed a more benign attitude toward the country's allies. It means a gentler or kinder. At the present, Great Britain, France, The Netherlands and Italy are expected to share in some or all of the various aid now being considered here and, doubtless, being discussed in Paris by Secretary of State John Foster Dulles.

Congress and private industry consistently have pressed the U. S. government to help American, that is, to buy American-made goods, even though a foreign manufacturer may be able to offer as good or better.

It is contemplated now that in such circumstances the British or other foreign manufacturer might make a sale even though an American producer could compete equally in price and quality.

Such benign trading would be part of an effort to provide western European allies with dollars toward stabilization of their currencies and their economies. It has been suggested that operators of foreign air lines might also be favored in their efforts to obtain commissions from the U. S. government at the expense of American-owned carriers engaged in foreign service.

It's the law here that there is a Santa Claus.

In a 20-year-old "opinion" news reversed, the state supreme court threatened to enjoin any "misleading" who said there isn't a Santa Claus.

The 1,000-word opinion closed with these stirring words:

"Let legislators 'oppose' the law evolution. If they must, let the Constitution be amended: till it looks like a patchwork quilt; but do not child of its most interesting mystery—Santa Claus. Let him be to succeeding generations what he was to us... a firm faith in childhood, a pleasant indulgence of parenthood, and a happy memory of old age."

This opinion was the work of the late Judge John H. Hatcher. He was 51 years old and residing in the town of the court when he wrote it in 1920. The other four judges concurred. One even wrote a concurring opinion.

The "decision" was official. It was never printed in the official proceedings. It didn't involve a specific case. But a newspaper clipping of the opinion is still pasted on the files of the 1926 court records.

Hatcher began the opinion with a history of Santa Claus. He said that what he knew of little ones of history? They believe in the actual physical existence of Santa Claus. They thrill at the story of the jolly old man who labors so diligently

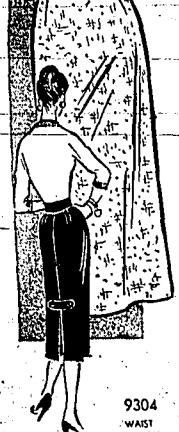

Russian "Best Seller" Causes Headache for Kremlin Chiefs

NEW YORK, Dec. 11 (U.P.)—A major public controversy is raging in the Soviet Union about a novel which is such a hot potato that the communistic party leadership can't even say how to handle it.

The Kremlin's difficulty arises from the fact that the logical implications of the novel are exceedingly dangerous for the entire ruling class of the U.S.S.R.

The book, titled "Not by Bread Alone" by young author V. Dudintsev, is a talented and bitter exposure of the Soviet bureaucracy and its methods of operation.

It has aroused tremendous interest among Soviet intellectuals, particularly young people. Its conclusion leaves the distinct impression that careerists in the Soviet bureaucracy who resorted to criminal suppression of idealistic heroes standing in their way still sit in their high places and continue to advance themselves.

This conclusion apparently struck a deep chord of response among the Soviet intelligentsia.

The hero of Dudintsev's book is a brilliant inventor named Lopatkin, and the villain is an industrial executive named Drodov. Already these two names have become bywords with the Soviet reading public. Lopatkin is an ascetic, determined

Merger Boom Worries U. S.; Curb Is Eyed

NEW YORK, Dec. 11 (AP)—Corporations in recent years have been getting married almost as fast as people.

The federal trade commission estimates that mergers and acquisitions throughout industry this year may reach last year's 646—the most in a quarter-century.

The merger trend has caused concern in government circles, and serious thought is being given to tighten legislative controls over corporate marriages.

Diversification sought

A key factor behind the merger fever of the past three years has been the desire on the part of management to diversify operations. Industry spokesmen say the best way to accomplish this is to acquire a going company, rather than start from scratch in a new field.

However, the justice department has been eyeing the mergers with growing concern. It is worried about a lessening of competition in industry.

This week alone the department filed major anti-trust suits against Radio Corporation of America and Owens-Illinois Glass company.

Efforts to give the justice department and federal trade commission greater authority, unless they come to a head when the 85th congress convenes. Legislative efforts to curb mergers failed in the 84th congress, but a new attack is planned.

One idea receiving serious consideration is to give the justice department and federal trade commission in detail their intent to merge or acquire another company.

Government officials say this would insure that the agencies charged with enforcement of the antitrust laws would have full and reliable information on every important projected merger before it happens.

They point out it is easier to stop a merger before it happens than to try to unravel it after the fact. Businessmen, however, generally are opposed to such legislation because they think it would do more harm than good.

Protest Made On Method of Army Search

TOKYO, Dec. 11 (AP)—Japanese employees of a U. S. military post exchange here have complained today they were forced to strip naked to search for stolen goods, an official of the justice ministry said.

He said there were "grounds for belief" that Japanese law was violated in the search.

Men and women employees of Tokyo's Hardy Barretts said they were herded into separate rooms in the basement of the exchange and ordered to take off their clothes.

A spokesman for the U. S. first cavalry division confirmed the report, but said the search was "routine" to prevent stolen goods from finding its way to the black market.

He said the army recovered 100 items of stolen property, including two watches with the P.K. price tags still attached.

Ideas on Justice Given to Children

FARLEIGH, Ky., Dec. 11 (AP)—Ten of William B. Thornton's children got a good impression of legal justice yesterday.

They accompanied their 55-year-old father, a tenant farmer, to court and heard him plead guilty to reckless driving. County Judge W. M. Lee fined Thornton \$10 and \$150 costs.

But he suspended the fine and told the father to spend the money on the children for Christmas. The 10 range in age from 1 to 12, and the Thorntons have another son, 16.

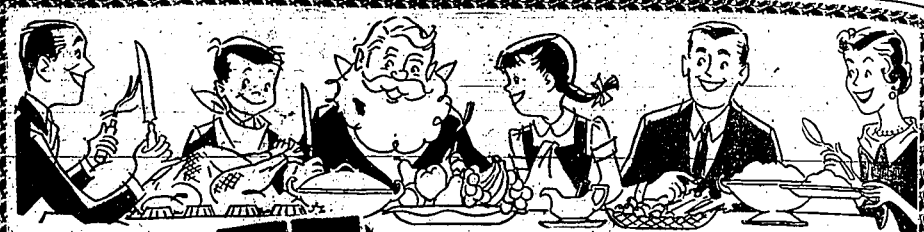

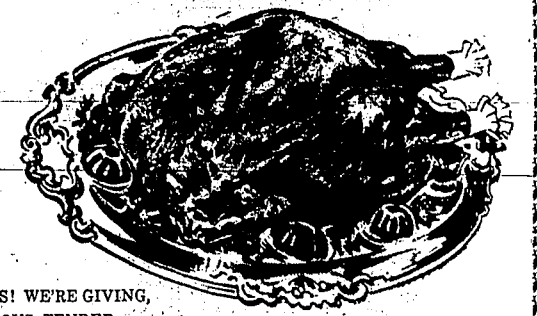
