Charter of Freedom Eyed For East Europe Nations At Meet of NATO Heads

PARIS, Dec. 13 (UP)—West Germany today proposed a "charter of freedom" for eastern European nations to win independence from Soviet rule. The move had strong U.S. backing.

The German proposal was made by Foreign Minister Heinrich von Brentano at today's secret NATO council meeting and won immediate and full backing by Secretary of State John Foster Dulles.

Dulles urged the council to write this "declaration of independence" into the final communiqué of the NATO meeting as a solemn resolve of the Atlantic community.

The NATO ministers also adopted a three-nation proposal today that would weld the seven-year-old alliance into a compact political unit capable of common action inside and outside NATO's geographical boundaries.

The "freedom charter" should call for peace and freedom for all European nations and all countries under foreign domination and promise of a free world.

But he warned that freedom for the nations behind the Iron Curtain should not be sought by economic, political, or military pressure or force. The pressure should be applied through the point made earlier this week by Dulles.

Brentano told the 16 foreign ministers not to give into spectacular and possibly risky actions with regard to eastern Europe. He said that a chain reaction led by the Kremlin and its still-powerful satellite states would lead to a breakdown of the NATO alliance.

Brentano, representing a country which has been with the NATO since its inception, urged the NATO ministers to give a strong resolution demanding independence for the eastern European nations.

The NATO ministers' meeting members took together was made by the "three great powers" — the U.S., Great Britain, and France.

Other NATO members included Canada, Belgium, Luxembourg, Norway, Denmark, Greece, Turkey, Portugal, Spain, and Italy.

Russian Casualties Reported; Gigantic Strike Is Extended

VIENNA, Dec. 13 (UP)—Defiant Hungarian workers extended their general strike indefinitely today. From the provinces came reports of new fighting and heavy Russian casualties. Budapest's industrial plants remained closed in protest against the arrest and imprisonment of two top labor leaders. Provincial plants also stayed closed because of widespread arrests of other labor leaders. In swift reprisal, the government seized control of the 18 separate iron and steel plants which make up Budapest's Csepel island industrial complex. It dissolved the workers council there, appointed a government commissioner to run the plant, and placed control of Budapest's giant Budaörs factory, formerly a subsidiary of Standard Electric, under government control.

Reports reaching Vienna said "at least 300" Russian soldiers have been killed in other hundreds wounded in almost continuous fighting around the Pecs coal mines in southern Hungary.

A Hungarian doctor who left Budapest this morning brought out this news, as well as reports that the "total" strike still gripped all towns and villages he passed on the way to the Austrian frontier.

The violence and economic paralysis continued as the Soviet-sponsored mining puppet Premier Imre Nagy's government sought to control the strike and lighten its harsh control over the country.

Other reports that the Soviets were rushing in new troops to deal with the strike, and that the strike was spreading to other parts of Hungary, were also reported.

Cuban Sugar Mills Report Lobby Funds

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP)—A Senate committee investigating lobbying activities has been told that a group of 8-owned sugar mills in Cuba spent \$50,000 on legislative activities in the United States sugar market last year.

Earlier this week Oor Roberts-Smylie proclaimed a state-wide observance of the anniversary in cooperation with the state league. Mrs. Bert H. Morris, local league president, noted Thursday that "in many parts of the world, the struggle for civil liberties is just beginning." She called on both citizens and public officials to support the concepts of civil liberties, adding that a foundation for respecting the rights of others should be laid.

The achievement of freedom does not end with the adoption of laws and constitutions," she continued. "It must be reaffirmed and re-evaluated daily in the lives and hearts of citizens." 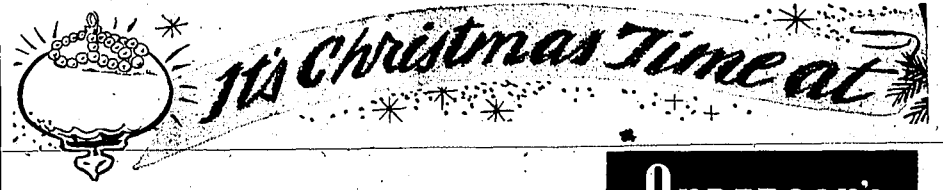

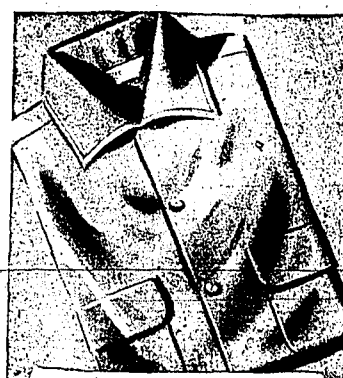

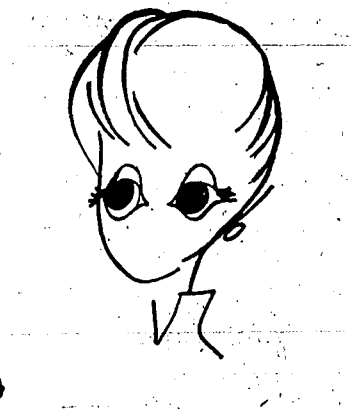

Report Given On Output of County Herds

Production records of more than 1,000 dairy cows in the 71 herds comprising the Twin Falls County Dairy Herd Improvement Association are reported by C. W. Daigh, county agent.

Teachers include Marvin Adam, Phil Cr. unit one; Frank Hudson; Twin Falls unit two, and A. E. Knudson, Castleford unit three.

The monthly report shows the herds averaged slightly less than a pound of butterfat per head. Record of butterfat of the cows were 26 per cent of the cows were dry. Some 500 cows produced more than 40 pounds of butterfat, but only six herds reached that figure.

Gary Custer, Twin Falls, who became leader his herd of five mixed grade last month, had the high herd with an average of 48 pounds of butterfat. John Mirick, Buhl, had the second high herd with 42.9 pounds. His herd includes 19 registered and grade Holsteins, of which two were dry.

With four of 40 registered and grade Holsteins dry, Twin Falls' best herd third place with a 42.2 herd average. J. V. Kaufman, Twin Falls, also with 20 registered and grade Holsteins averaged 41.8 pounds with two dry.

Three herds averaging between 35 and 40 pounds of butterfat include Paul Shriver, Buhl, 28 grade Holsteins, all milking; 39, E. O. Martin, Buhl, 20 mixed breeds milking; 35.2 pounds, and Charles Tippett, Buhl, with five registered Holsteins dry, averaged 35.3 pounds of butterfat.

The high individual producing cow in the high unit and in the association was a registered Jersey owned by E. A. Hanson, Twin Falls. She had a yield of 119 pounds of butterfat from 1400 pounds of milk. This gives her an annual test of 8.5 per cent.

In unit two, a grade Holstein owned by Joe Gorman, Buhl, was high with 81.5 pounds of butterfat from 1760 pounds of milk. A grade Guernsey owned by M. R. Colburn, Buhl, had a yield of 71.5 pounds of butterfat from 1,650 pounds of milk.

All 71 herds were fed some grain and more than 40 unprofitable cows were sold for beef.

Air Force Will Train Men for Using Missiles

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 — The air force next month will start training airmen in how to use the eye-wrecking ballistic missiles which are destined to revolutionize air-atomic warfare.

It is probably will be several years, however, before the airmen will have the actual weapon in hand.

The air force announced late yesterday that it will establish a training base on the west coast for ballistic missile units. The training center will be located at Camp Cooke, Lompoc, Calif., an inactive army base which will be transferred to air force control.

The air force will start occupying the base in January and gradually build up to a 3,000-4,000 man strength. The contemplated manpower is an indication that the base will be the air force's principal center for training the ballistic missilemen of the future.

The base will be under the supervision of Maj. Gen. B. A. Schriever, commander of the air research and development command's western development division in Los Angeles. Schriever's command is developing the ballistic missiles that will travel 1,500 to 5,000 miles in a matter of minutes and demolish their targets with hydrogen bomb warheads.

Turkey, West Germany Put Allies on Spot

By United Press
 West Germany and Turkey have put their allies on the spot in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization talks in Paris.

West Germany wants to know what NATO would do if a revolt broke out in Germany and Russia threw its armed forces against the rebels as it did in Hungary.

Turkey wants NATO to build up its strength in the eastern Mediterranean—especially a fleet of atom-bomber planes—in view of Russia's belligerent attitude in the Middle East.

West Germany and Turkey have good reason to be concerned over the position of their countries at the moment.

Along among the 15 members of the Atlantic alliance, West Germany and Turkey face the Russian red menace, along their frontier. Norway has a narrow frontier facing Russia, but it is far above the Arctic circle and in a military war the odds are in its favor.

Both West Germany and Turkey are convinced that the threat of Russian aggression has been increased if anything, not diminished, by the surge of revolt in the Soviet satellite countries.

It Russia attacked western Europe, West Germany would be in the front line. If Russia started anything in the Middle East, the forces could move only through Turkey.



Russ Students Are 'Restless,' Official Claims

PRINCETON, N. J., Dec. 12 (AP)—The top U. S. intelligence officer said last night he has "well substantiated" reports that the students are becoming restive inside Russia.

Allen Dulles, chief of the central intelligence agency (CIA), said in a speech prepared for a Princeton University conference.

"The level of education has begun to work. The men in the Kremlin have a hard task ahead to hold the process in check."

Dulles said Soviet leaders have "made a fetish of industrial and military power." To achieve their goal, he said, they have denied their people a decent living.

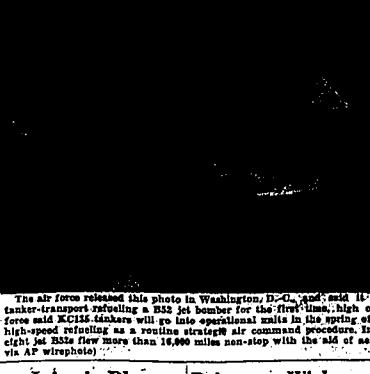
"But in the process of building a modern industrial state, he said the Soviet leaders 'produced a new generation of highly technical, sophisticated and completely educated men and women.'"

These people are beginning to wonder what their government is doing to give them a better life, he said, and he added:

"In particular, there are well substantiated reports that the students are becoming restive, inquisitive and outspoken in their demands for critical examination of the infallibility of a system which produced the abuse of Stalinism."



New Facts on Atomic Power To Be Issued

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP)—The atomic energy commission announced tonight the forthcoming release of "a large additional volume" of technical information needed in the development of a civilian atomic power industry.

Chairman Lewis L. Strauss said the information—jointly held by the United States, Great Britain and Canada—should be available to "all nations" in the "most useful to industry" are concerned, "within six months or less."

He said the action should speed the development of civilian nuclear power in the United States "and at the same time enable us to be of greater assistance to other nations in fulfilling the broad aims of President Eisenhower's atom-for-peace program."

"The information has heretofore been classified in such a way as to keep it from open publication."

Fatal Mishap On U. S. Base

Being Probed

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Dec. 13 (AP)—A major court of inquiry scheduled an investigation today into the fatal shooting of a young prisoner who broke from his guards and failed to halt when ordered.

The names of the prisoner and the guard who shot him yesterday were not released immediately.

Major court officials at the Federal depot here scheduled a court of inquiry immediately following the shooting.

A military spokesman said the prisoner broke away from two guards while being returned to the base after having undergone a medical examination to determine his fitness for confinement.

The spokesman said the prisoner ignored repeated warnings "to halt" and the guard took aim and fired, felling the victim with a single shot. The prisoner died instantly.

Military officials would not disclose the nature of the prisoner's offense or how long he had been confined in the brig. They said the prisoner had been causing "serious trouble" in the brig and the medical examination was ordered.

Public information officer, first Lieut. John Avignone, said it is a standard operating procedure to have two guards accompany a prisoner to keep medical records and to obey orders of the two guards as they left the medical examiners' office. He said one of the other guards called for help as the prisoner broke out running and the other guard fired the fatal shot.

Union Power Is Blasted by NAM Official

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Dec. 13 (U.P.)—The board chairman of the National Association of Manufacturers today warned of a "conspiracy to seize control of the government" and called for a "counterattack" against the "united front" of labor and political power.

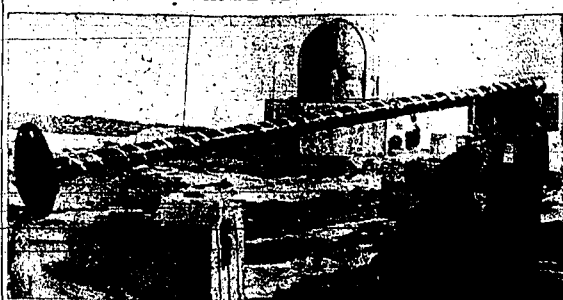
"This reason for political power is not done by one person or by a few labor leaders," he said. "It is done by the whole of the labor movement, and it is not to be left to the other fellow."

He said that the American CIO, P. A. B. Parker told the American Farm Bureau Federation's 38th annual convention.

Unless a countervailing political force is built up which can match the union-political machine, it eventually is going to win a national election, the presidency and both houses of congress," he added.

Earlier, Pat Greenhouse, vice president of the United Auto Workers, told the convention that "some groups have tried through the years to divide the farmers and organized labor."

Nehru Reports on Hungary, Says 25,000 Patriots Killed

NEW DELHI, Dec. 13 (U.P.)—Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru estimated today in parliament that 25,000 Hungarians and 1,000 Soviet troops had been killed in the Hungarian revolution.

Nehru said there is no large-scale fighting going on in Hungary at present but a considerable measure of passive resistance.

He said ambassador to Moscow, K. P. S. Menon reported he found conditions in Budapest "reminiscent of the civil disobedience movement in India" against the British.

Nehru sent Menon from Moscow to Budapest for a first-hand investigation of conditions in Hungary.

The prime minister referred to Menon's long talks with Hungarian Premier Janos Kadar during his Budapest inspection.

"Kadar has no objection to the admission of the U. N. general secretary (Das Dhanrajpal) but at a later stage," Nehru said.

He said Hungary thought the admission of observers at the present time would mean "an infringement of sovereignty."

Nehru said India had great sympathy for the Hungarian people.

"Our approach is to prevent such happenings not only in Hungary but all parts of the world," he said.

Of India's role in the U. N. debate on the Hungarian situation, Nehru said India wants a constructive and not a negative approach and that is the reason he called for the withdrawal of all foreign troops, the key of all the troubles.

He said the central European situation would be far better if "foreign forces are withdrawn by both sides."

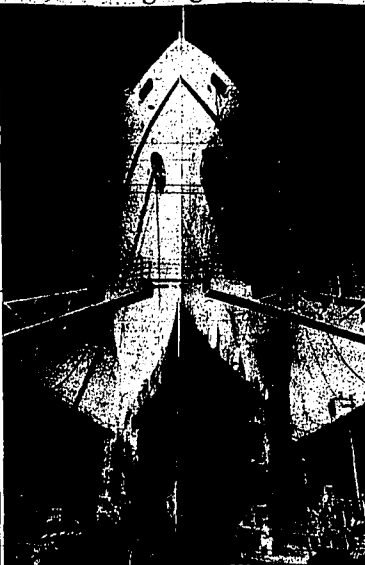

Work's Strain Is Blamed for Theft Activity

BELMONT, Calif., Dec. 13 (AP)—A 35-year-old doctor arrested as a "cat burglar" today became unemployed because of overwork. Dr. John Francis Rioridan, 35, of the San Mateo County hospital, was arrested Tuesday as he stepped out of the burglary which he was charged.

However, Rioridan's neighbors entered one home in his neighborhood, jimmying a rear door with metal rod. After he got inside, he realized someone was at home and fled.

Articles Disappear. Belmont police refused to say they believe Rioridan is the prowler who has entered a dozen or more homes in recent months. Some articles disappeared after the proprietor's visit.

Rioridan himself announced his arrest at an extraordinary press conference yesterday. Present were county authorities and San Mateo county health director and Rioridan's superior.

Rioridan is married and the father of a 7-year-old daughter. After discussing at some length an "obsessive compulsion neurosis," Rioridan astonished newsmen by disclosing he had been arrested as a burglary suspect.

"I feel very bad," he said. "I'm now seeking psychiatric treatment. I am not under any continuous compulsion to do irrational things. I can't remember taking anything. Under the stress of the moment, I acted without—reasoning—until I can't give any reason for it."

Gives Examples. Rioridan likened his act of prowling to the impulse that leads people to fear jumping off a high building or to wonder what would happen if they crossed the highway at high speed.

It was several months ago that I really felt my mind unglued," he said. Chope said Rioridan was "sick as hell."

Called "M". "This man is not a criminal," Chope said. "He has a mental illness. I've been trying for four months to get some help for him. This incident resulted from an emotional strain."

Chope said Rioridan has been working 80 to 90 hours a week and could never be more than 20 minutes away from the hospital. "When he becomes too fatigued, he lacks the strength to fight back the compulsion to do something irrational," Chope said.

BOISE, Dec. 13 (AP)—Sales of new automobiles in Idaho are down more than 4,000 cars from the total at the same time last year, the Eckhardt Service bureau reported today.

The tabulation, prepared for distribution in the state's automobile industry, said that 10,220 new automobiles had been sold in Idaho at the end of November. There had been 22,077 sold at the same time last year.

Sales of trucks also was down, with 2,813 sold in the first 11 months this year and 6,133 during the same length of time last year.

Haiti General Resigns Post; Jurist to Rule

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti, Dec. 13 (AP)—Constitutional rule returned today to Haiti when an unprecedented display of popular sentiment forced Gen. Paul E. Magloire to resign as provisional chief of state.

Magloire resigned yesterday, bowing to the pressure of a nationwide three-day general strike in protest against his assumption of dictatorial powers. He had suspended the constitution and arrested numerous opposition political leaders.

The government was turned over to Chief Justice Joseph Pierre Louis, in accordance with the constitutional line of suc-

cession since there is no vice president. All political prisoners were promptly released, including the chief opposition presidential candidate Louis de Joie.

Magloire handed his resignation to the army chief of staff, Gen. Antoine Levoy, in the National Palace. Levoy immediately announced he would take office from Pierre Louis.

The 56-year-old justice accepted the post as interim chief of state after the army's pledge of support. He said he would turn over the government to the winner of next April's presidential elections.

The speeches of all three principals in the power struggle were broadcast to the nation. They were received with jubilation by the population.

Pierre Louis received the presidential 71-gun salute when he reviewed the palace guard drawn up on the grounds.

Magloire's constitutional six-year term as president ended Dec. 6. He stepped down but promptly regained control again as chief of state and commander of the armed forces.

In addition to ignoring Haitian law requiring him to turn over control to the supreme court, Magloire declared a national emergency and suspended the constitution.

He justified his actions by charging the opposition planned to resort to violence during the election campaign.

Reaction was almost immediate. Port-au-Prince was paralyzed by a general strike which spread throughout the country.

Shops, stores and market places closed down. The lawyers association refused to take cases before the courts and most unaligned labor walked off the job.

The mass walkout was the first application of "passive resistance" in the Caribbean island republic. Haitians were generally amazed at the

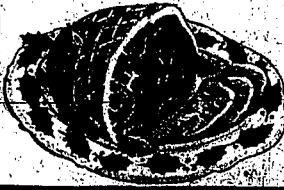

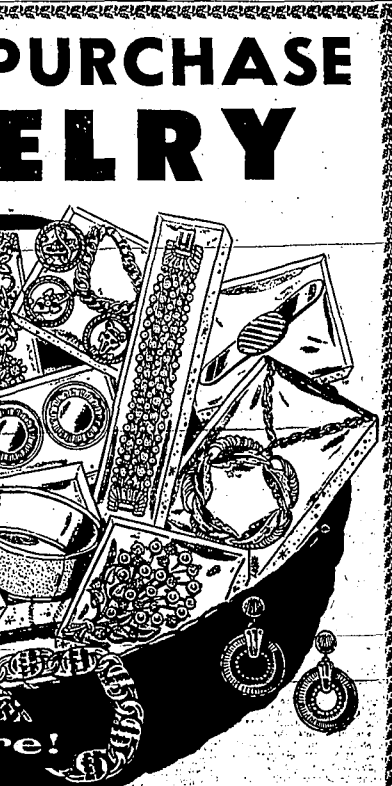

Official Takes Time to Study High Dam Bid

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP)—Secretary of the Interior Seaton said Wednesday it will be several days before he decides whether he favors a high dam at the Pleasant Valley site on the Snake river between Oregon and Idaho.

The federal power commission is now holding a hearing on a proposal for a Pacific Northwest Power company for a low dam at Pleasant Valley and another dam at Mountain Sheep.

Just back from more than two weeks in the Virgin Islands, Seaton said in an interview he has not had an opportunity to study the reclamation bureau's report that a high dam would be feasible. He added it will still be some days before he reaches a decision.

A high dam such as the reclamation bureau favors would provide an estimated 1,200,000 acre-feet of flood storage which the private utility project would not provide.

Such a structure would inundate the 20-mile canyon dam site, farthest downstream of three sites on the Snake for which the Idaho Power development was licensed after a license by the FPC. The Idaho Power development was licensed after the federal government should build a dam at Hole Canyon.

There are indications that the reclamation bureau witnesses will not testify at the FPC hearing. Seaton said in that event he would inform the power commission directly of his decision—if such action were warranted.

At yesterday's FPC hearing, attorneys for public power groups challenged testimony that no solution is in sight to the problem of getting regulatory fish over the proposed Nes Perce dam.

The lawyers cross-examined two FPC witnesses regarding testimony that a new "skimmer" device may solve the problem of getting salmon and steelhead trout over high dams like Nes Perce.

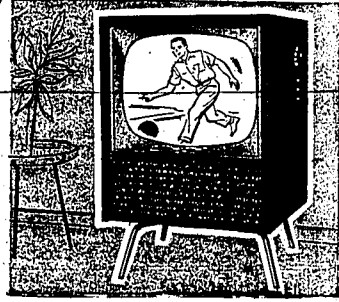

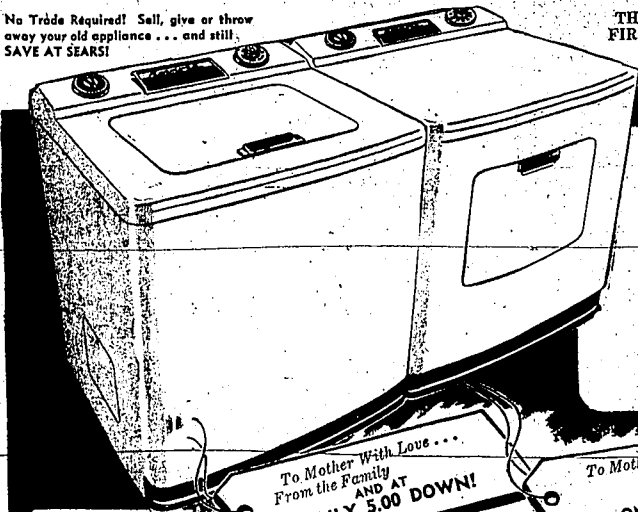

Beef Is Given Top Rating in Meat Markets

By The Associated Press
Beef of one sort or another is served in many American homes this week-end, judging by the special planned for the nation's supermarkets.

Everything from hamburger to fancy steaks and popperhouse steaks are featured in small packages and in large quantities, and, as might be expected, ribs of beef, round steak and chuck roast seem to be the most numerous items.

Decline Reflected
The lower store prices for beef generally reflect lower wholesale prices of recent weeks, and the housewife good fortune is expected to continue a few more weeks. Next year, however, they'll likely be a bit higher.

Some steaks had stein steak anywhere from 8 to 10 cents a pound below last week, while rib roast was reported from four to 10 cents cheaper in scattered areas. Pork prices were mostly higher, and fryer chickens, which have been low priced for some time, edged up two to six cents in some cities.

Prices Estimated
Preliminary estimates were that Christmas turkeys would be close to the price charged for gobblers at Thanksgiving, although the larger birds might be a cent or two higher. Some chain executives commented that turkey, while a big item at Christmas, does not do as well as it does at Thanksgiving. He noted that many housewives "skip" turkey for the traditional family dinner in recent years.

Housewives looking for fruit bargains should be able to find them in the freezer and on the shelves. Average juice prices, already down a bit, are expected to go even lower because the processors are caught between slumping sales and a big carryover from last year's fruit pack.

Peach Crop Heavy
California packers, who handle the nation's entire supply of cling peaches and fruit cocktails, are loaded. The 1956 pack of clings was 17 per cent over last year, while the amount of fruit cocktail—a mixture of dried peaches, pears, grapes, pineapples and cherries—is up 12 per cent from 1955.

Good buys also are available among the fresh fruits, too. The volume of oranges, grapefruit and lemons coming into city markets from Florida is picking up steadily, and prices of all three are good. Grapes are getting dearer, and apples generally are a bit high. Peaches and turpis, along with

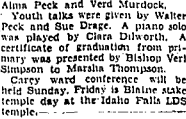

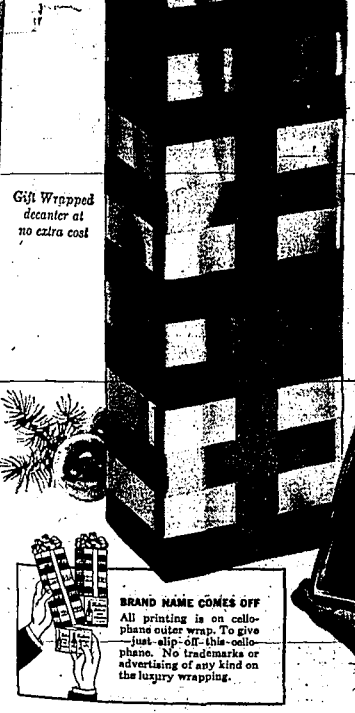

Officials Make New Arrests in Rioting Claims

WARSAW, Poland, Dec. 13 (AP)—Warsaw radio said 83 persons were arrested in connection with the anti-Soviet demonstrations which erupted Monday night in Sietlin.

"The breadstuffs' lines' rioters were charged with having attacked public buildings in the big Baltic port in northwest Poland."

Official reports said the rioters stormed the Soviet consulate, smashing windows and furniture. The riot was touched off by the arrest of a man.

The West Berlin newspaper Morgenpost said the riot started when Polish police tried to arrest a Polish worker who attacked a Soviet sailor. The report said Poles became incensed when "drunken Soviet sailors" called them "dirty dogs" and Polish Party Secretary Wladyslaw Gomulka a "capitalist snake in the grass."

The Morgenpost report could not be confirmed.

Radio Warsaw admitted the disorders amounted to a "mass demonstration" against the Russians. The Polish government officially apologized to the Soviet ambassador and offered to pay compensation for all damages.

A broadcast said an investigation into the riots will be headed by the supreme Polish state prosecutor.
