# Reds Admit New Clashes Between Russians, Rebels

VIENNA, Dec. 14 (AP)—Communist-controlled Budapest radio today reported new anti-Soviet riots and a major armed clash between Hungarian patriots and Soviet troops in east-central Hungary. A broadcast said the battle took place yesterday at Miskolc, capital of Borsod province. It erupted when Soviet troops moved in to break up anti-Soviet demonstrations. Casualties were not reported. It was a rare admission by the Janos Kadar puppet regime of bitter fighting in the provinces. A later broadcast said anti-Soviet riots flared Monday and Tuesday in the city of Eger, between Miskolc and Budapest.

"Counter-revolutionary elements"—the terminology for the patriots attacked the provincial government building and caused serious damage with hand grenades, said the broadcast. Soviet troops and anti-Soviet and anti-communist leaders, the report added, then clashed.

"I have reached no conclusions," the governor added when asked about a published report that he would make such a recommendation.

# NATO Nations Get Offers of Weapons Developed in U.S.

PARIS, Dec. 14 (AP)—The United States offered today to share with its NATO allies dual-purpose weapons which could fire either atomic warheads or conventional missiles.

Although it was the first step in opening the U. S. atomic arsenal to member nations of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, for the moment they were promised no strictly atomic arms. An American spokesman said U. S. Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson promised the other 14 nations in the alliance the modern weapons and technical data to help develop their own "dual-capacity" arsenal.

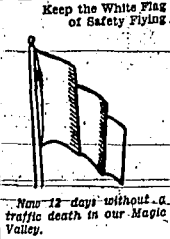

### Chief of Red Cross Denies Aid Criticism

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—The chief of the American National Red Cross, yesterday described as "confusing, misleading and inaccurate" an editorial in the Dec. 11 issue of Life magazine proposing a "food air-drop to Hungary."

The editorial says the brutal fact is that the Hungarian people are not receiving enough food, and medicine being shipped into Hungary by the Red Cross and other agencies.

Life Correspondent Ed Clark in Budapest is quoted as saying "some of the food and goods brought in by the Red Cross is sold in shops at prices out of reach of the average Hungarian."  
"Others say the food for the workers has gone to functionaries and security police," Clark says.  
The editorial then goes on to propose that the United States and other free nations join in parachute drops to places where the ordinary Hungarians can get it. It suggests using unmarked planes, painted with red crosses and flown by volunteer pilots in the name of the United Nations.

In a telegram to Life Publisher Andrew Hekkel, Harriman said he had received an advance copy of the editorial, "with considerable concern."

"The statements it contains," he said, "are confusing, misleading and incorrect on the basis of the best information available to us daily from the international committee of the Red Cross, and could easily do irreparable damage to the efforts of the international Red Cross to provide relief to the people of Hungary."

Harriman cited Red Cross reports from inside Hungary saying no Red Cross supplies have been lost, pilfered, or seized by Hungarian or Soviet authorities, either military or civilian.

### Science Finds New Clues to Origin of Life

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14 (AP)—New clues to the origin of life were revealed today by a scientist who has succeeded in creating biologically active life's basic building blocks.

The scientist is Dr. Philip H. Abelson, director of the Carnegie Institution of Washington.

Abelson, who has been studying the origin of life for many years, has found that the conditions under which life first appeared on earth were quite different from those which exist today.

He has shown that the atmosphere of the early earth was very different from the atmosphere of today. It was rich in methane, ammonia, and hydrogen, and was very reducing.

Abelson has found that under these conditions, simple organic molecules can be formed, and these molecules can then combine to form more complex molecules, such as amino acids and nucleic acids.

These findings are important because they show that the conditions under which life first appeared on earth were quite different from those which exist today. This suggests that the origin of life may have been a very complex process, and that it may have required very specific conditions.

### Theory of "Oscillating Universe" Is Studied by Scientists; Cycle Repeats

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14 (AP)—The universe may be pulsing like a giant heart, expanding and contracting in periods of many billions of years.

This theory is based on the work of a group of scientists who are studying the expansion of the universe. They have found that the expansion is not uniform, but that it is actually oscillating.

The scientists believe that the universe is currently in the middle of an expansion phase, but that it will eventually reach a point where it begins to contract. This contraction will eventually lead to a "big crunch," after which the universe will begin to expand again.

This cycle of expansion and contraction is what the scientists call an "oscillating universe." They believe that this cycle has repeated itself many times over the course of the universe's existence.

The scientists' theory is based on the work of Albert Einstein, who first proposed the idea of an oscillating universe. They have used his theory to calculate the rate at which the universe is expanding, and they have found that it is actually oscillating.

Moulton said the flying legislators would fly to Sun Valley Jan. 20, would visit installation at Gowen Field Jan. 27, and would fly to the Mountain Home Air Force Base for a tour of its facilities Feb. 2.

He fled to the Dominican Republic, where he is believed to be hiding out. He is expected to remain in exile for some time.



### Nehru Leaves India to Have Parley in U.S.

**NEW DELHI, Dec. 14 (AP)—**Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru left today by plane for Washington for talks with President Eisenhower that India hopes will bring about an immediate and closer understanding between the two countries.

Nehru, who arrives in Washington Sunday for a three-day visit, was expected to discuss with the president the whole range of world affairs, with particular emphasis on Sino-American and the Middle East.

Observers said Nehru would explain his country's stand between East and West. They pointed out Nehru's recent condemnation of Soviet intervention in Hungary and his unattached foreign policy had created a favorable atmosphere for the talks.

Observers also pointed to Nehru's recent praise of America's stand against colonialism.

Some Indian officials were disappointed that Nehru's schedule would allow only one full day with the president—the other days are filled with formal functions. But it was predicted that even the one day would allow the two men to cover the basic aspects of major world affairs.

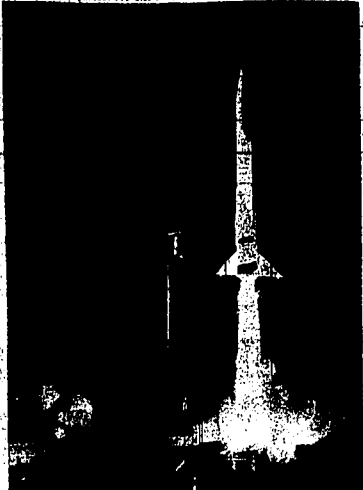

### Critic of U. S. Reforms Gets Premier Post

TOKYO, Dec. 14 (AP)—Taman Ishibashi, 72-year-old economic expert, was virtually assured today of succeeding Ichiro as premier of Japan.

Ishibashi, minister of international trade and industries, was elected president of Japan's ruling Democratic Liberal party, placing him in position for automatic election as premier.

The upset favored party Secretary-General Nobusuke Kishi, 59, of 23, in an open vote at today's conservative national convention here.

The election was paralytic. Hatoyama resigned as prime minister. Hatoyama will step down as prime minister at the opening session of the diet (parliament) next week.

The 60-year-old Kishi considered by some people as too young to succeed Ishibashi as the nation's highest government official, fell when Ishibashi threw his support to Ishibashi on the second ballot.

Ishibashi began his career as an 18-month reporter for the industrial magazine *Orion* in 1917 and 20 years later became its president and publisher. He entered politics as finance minister in the first cabinet of Shigeru Yoshida.

He incurred the wrath of Yoshida's government and of Gen. Douglas MacArthur's occupation headquarters when he fought to block anti-inflation budget and to limit occupation expenses.

MacArthur purged Ishibashi from public office, but he made a political comeback in 1952 when Hatoyama named him commerce-industry minister.

### Churches in America Begin Religious Crusade Against Carnage on Highway

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14 (AP)—American churches are beginning to wage a religious crusade against death on the highways.

They are calling members that reckless driving is not merely dangerous—it is a grave sin. And they are having the books of your car checked to see if you are in violation of a 200-horsepower car is still an important sermon theme.

But lately there has been growing recognition by clergymen that traffic deaths are not the only bad driver. They are also being recognized as the new target of the churches' moral condemnation.

One of the most ambitious efforts to involve in driving safety was made this fall in Greenwich, Conn. For five Sundays, beginning Sept. 30, the ministers of all Greenwich churches emphasized in sermons that one of the quickest ways to reduce the traffic toll would be for all professed Christians to start creating the qualities of love, courtesy and consideration of others when driving a car.

They also pointed out that the fifth commandment—"thou shalt not kill"—is not restricted to delib-

erated murder, but also may be violated by the kind of gross carelessness which results in "accidental" highway deaths.

One sign that the churches mean business about the campaign is the emphasis they are placing on specific, positive applications of these over-all doctrines.

For example, the Methodist church has approved a program in all Methodist Sunday schools a special series of lessons for young people on how to drive safely.

The Christian Herald, widely-circulated Protestant magazine, asks its readers in its current issue, "Are you a Christian at the Wheel?" The article said that "un-Christian attitudes"—impatience, selfishness, a desire to get ahead or show up another driver—are a major cause of accidents.

It also noted that "the sin of neglect" is involved in many highway tragedies. Therefore, it said, frequent and careful inspection of your car's safety features—particularly brakes, tires and headlights—is a moral obligation in the same sense as attending church and reading the Bible.

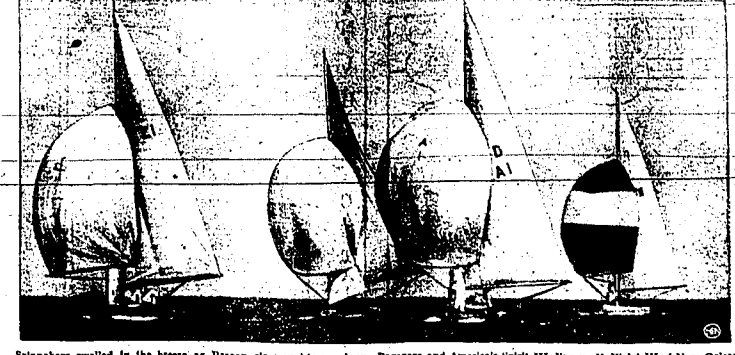

**Stolen Tot; 2, And Parent to Return Home**

LONDON, Dec. 14—Little Tanya Chwasov, who was rescued from a Soviet ship taking her to Russia, will leave tonight for the United States, where her mother promised her "the biggest Christmas party ever."

The 2-year-old girl was reunited with her mother, Mrs. Helena Drazok, Detroit, in a secret rendezvous last night. It was announced today she will take to her mother from the Soviet embassy, where she was kept for two months with her father, Russian-born Alexis Chwasov, pending a custody hearing in a British court.

A friend at the home at which Mrs. Drazok was staying confirmed that mother and daughter were reunited. They last saw each other in a Philadelphia bus station last March.

Mrs. Drazok smothered her daughter with kisses and danced with joy at the reunion. "I began to think I would never get her back," she said, "but now everything is wonderful."

She said Tanya seemed well cared for and quite happy.

"We will both be delighted to get back to America," the mother cried. Justice Sir Henry Wynn-Parry last night ordered Tanya's Russian refugee father, Alexis Chwasov, to return the child to her 24-year-old mother. Chwasov split the bewildered little girl out of the United States and was on his way to Russia two months ago when the British courts intervened at the request of the United States service.

The justice said the Detroit mother should have custody of the girl because the United States has courts competent to protect children.

"I wish to say nothing in the least disrespectful," Wynn-Parry said, "but I am bound to say that I have no similar evidence on which I can act with regard to the USSR."
