Russia Says Revolt In Satellite Halted; Coal Mines Opened

VIENNA, Dec. 17 (AP)—Russia said today the Hungarian revolt had ended, but reports from Budapest said Russian tanks, troops and possibly planes are fighting over the wild mountains north of the capital. The Budapest government was reported sending Hungarian strikers to the coal mines today as forced labor in an effort to avert economic disaster, and a Budapest broadcast today said 664 went to work in the Matra mountain mines today.

State Supreme Court Judge Is Found Dead

CALDWELL, Dec. 17 (AP)—Idaho Supreme Court Justice Donald B. Anderson, 52, was found dead alongside his automobile near Sheriff Dale G. Hale said he died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound. Anderson's body was found about 3:30 a.m. by Caldwell Policemen Carl Griggs and Carroll Eubank about 350 yards off Highway 30 near its junction with U. S. Highway 20 just north of here. Caldwell police said the justice had two head wounds. The first shot reportedly failed to penetrate the skull. Sheriff Hale said the .38 caliber revolver was found by the body.

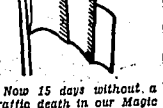

700 Million "Gift" Asked by Britain

MASHAM, England, Dec. 17 (AP)—A Conservative member of Parliament told a political meeting today the United States should give Britain 700 million dollars in recognition of America's "gross injustice" to Britain.

"The United States should recognize the harm they have done to Britain and the gross injustice of their actions over Suez."

"A gift, not a loan or even an interest-free loan, of 700 million dollars would do something to this end."

Although San Francisco is ranked No. 5 nationally, 10th-ranked Dayton was the only team among the national leaders to lose to a college foe. The Flyers, obviously missing graduated stars Bill Uhl and Jim Paxson, took a 65-53 beating from Cincinnati.

Otherwise, the picture of the week-end was that of big men leading high-ranked teams to impressive victories.

Will the SUN) Chamberlain, Kansas celebrated sophomore sky-scraper, led 27 points and earned 23 rebounds to lead the nation's No. 1 team to a 92-76 triumph over Washington. 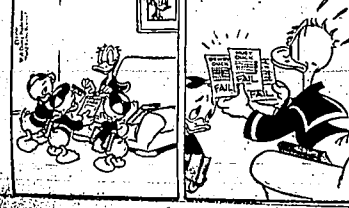

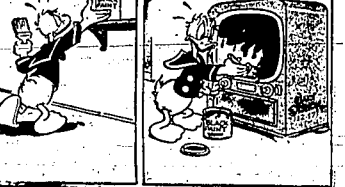

Permit Is Asked To Merge Banks

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 17 (AP)—An agreement was announced today to merge the Antelope Valley bank into the Lancaster bank, subject to approval by stockholders which is expected by Jan. 1.

California Bank has 54 branches in Los Angeles and Orange counties with resources of more than 600 million dollars. The Lancaster bank has resources in excess of seven million dollars.

The merger will not result in any personal changes in the Lancaster bank, according to the joint announcement.

Five Million U.S. Workers Assured of Pay Raises During 1957 Working Year

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17 (AP)—A quarter-million steelworkers will get automatic wage raises next year, half of them averaging from six to 8 cents an hour, the labor department reported today.

The number affected reflects the growth of long-term union-management contracts that call for pay hikes for more than one year as an assurance against annual strikes.

The department said 550 contracts provide for such pay hikes next year, including those in the important steel and automobile industries—usually the wage "pattern-setters."

The department said 90 per cent of the automatic pay hikes range from an average six to an average 11 cents an hour. They affect workers in almost all major industry groups, with the bulk of them in steel, automobile, farm equipment, aircraft, electrical, aluminum and other metal manufacturing and in construction, transportation, food and mining.

Around one million workers in the automobile industry are due for an average six-cent hourly increase and 650,000 steelworkers will get an average 9.1-cent hourly hike.

Around 850,000 railroad employees will get around seven cents an hour in pay hikes and 200,000 soft coal miners 10 cents an hour.

The department also reported that 2.8 million workers are working under wage contracts with cost-of-living allowances based on the government's consumer price index.

That is equal to the record number of workers whose wages were tied to the cost of living in 1952 and nearly twice as many as a year ago.

The United Auto Workers union has continued its cost-of-living contract since 1952. Unions representing non-operating railroad employees and electrical manufacturers have resumed cost-of-living allowances this year and unions in the steel and manufacturing industries adopted them for the first time.
