AGED BURLEY MAN DIES FROM HURTS RECEIVED IN CRASH

BURLEY, Dec. 19—Burley's traffic fatality record, spotless since 1952, was marred Wednesday with the death of George Platts, 61, former city employe, at the Cottage hospital with injuries received when hit by a car at a Burley intersection on 5th and Cornner Courts. The fatality was the 37th in 1956 and Cassia county's 10th. Two weeks ago Burley received an award from the National Safety Council for having had no traffic fatalities within the city limits during 1955.

In 1903 and 1904, Mr. Clark helped survey the railroad route between Huntington and The Dalles. He also helped with work on the Yellowstone branch of the Oregon Short Line.

Board Claims Land Surplus To Air Force

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—An air force board has suggested that about 6,500,000 acres out of the total of more than 14 million acres used for bombing and gunnery practice in the United States and Alaska are no longer needed.

It said the advent of new planes, new bombing training techniques and guided missiles had changed the requirement for training areas.

Spokesmen explained that as an example, a large amount of bombing practice is now done with electronic radar bombing scoring system, whereas previously live bombs were used generally. The report is now being studied by the air staff.

Biggest of the proposed cuts in air force bombing areas is the Topopahus range in Nevada, a part of which is used by the atomic energy commission for a bomb test. The board suggested that 3,200,000 acres in that bombing and gunnery range be excess to needs.

The next biggest acreage to be used as excess is at Wendover, Utah, 10,000 acres. Other acreages include Craters of the Moon, Idaho, 40,000 acres; Split Rock, Wyo., 40,000.

If the recommendations of the board are approved, the method of dealing the property surplus to the needs of the air force will be the same as used in other government surplus operations. The other two military services, the army and navy, will be given first opportunity to acquire the acreage. If they do not need the land, it then goes to general service administration for disposal to other agencies or private ownership.

John F. Dulles To Keep Post; Charts Duties

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—John Foster Dulles, appearing hale and hearty despite his recent cancer operation, is planning to stay on as secretary of state for a long time.

There had been speculation that Dulles might resign soon, but he is busy charting his future activities in the No. 1 cabinet post. He tentatively plans to fly to the Far East next March to attend a meeting at Canberra, Australia, of the Southeast Asian Treaty Organization.

Dulles hasn't talked about resigning despite his Nov. 3 operation for intestinal cancer. The best guess is that Dulles won't think about quitting until he reaches his 70th birthday on Feb. 25, 1958.

Some people believe chances are about 50-50 that Dulles will stay on for all of President Eisenhower's second term, depending, of course, on the President's wishes and his health.

Interior Secretary Studies Proposal For Development of Indian Oil Lands

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—Secretary of the Interior Fred A. Seaton is studying a new proposal for development of oil and other resources on Indian lands.

It would enable the Indians to gamble for more profits for their resources. It also would provide the Indians with a way to initiate oil development on their land without waiting for oil companies to become interested enough to offer competitive bids.

Seaton was asked to study the new proposal as a result of a contract for oil development which he recently rejected.

The contract was between the Delhi-Taylor Oil Corporation, Dallas, Tex., and the Navaho Indians for oil exploration on five million acres of land on the Navaho reservation.

The Navahos protested bitterly when Seaton, representing the government in its role of protecting its Indian "wards," stepped in to reject the contract. Seaton acted after Oliver La Farge, president of the Association on American Indian Affairs, and others questioned whether

the Indians were getting a fair deal.

Paul Jones, chairman of the Navaho tribal council, and Norman M. Littell, general counsel for the tribe, urged Seaton to take a new look at the development program and the possibility of letting the Indians negotiate deals such as the Delhi-Taylor contract.

In rejecting the contract, Seaton questioned its legality and said it was in effect a lease agreement. The law precludes the leasing of any Indian reservation lands for oil and gas development without advertising for competitive bids.

The Navahos contended that the contract was not a lease and was authorized "by the inherent power of the Navaho tribe as owner of its own lands."

Under the rejected contract Delhi-Taylor would have explored for oil on the Navaho land and split the profits 50-50 with the tribe. Under the leasing laws the oil companies bid bonuses for the right to explore on Indian lands. After the Indians receive the bonuses all they get thereafter is one-eighth of the royalties, or 12 1/2 per cent of the

said that 12 other oil companies have been conducting geophysical work on the Navaho land that the contract covered and that several of the companies decide in their own time indicated a desire to enter into leases on a competitive basis.

But the Navahos said the companies had never taken the steps prescribed by law in requesting that

the lands be put up for bids. The tribe claims that under present policies the lands are there until the companies decide in their own time to bid on them.

Even though the proposed Delhi-Taylor contract was rejected, the Navahos believe it was responsible for stirring up interest in land in other parts of their reservation.

They point out that three lease sales in November on 336,000 acres brought bonus bids of 33.6 million dollars. This was 13.7 million dollars more than the tribe had received for oil and gas activity in its entire history at the start of this fiscal year.

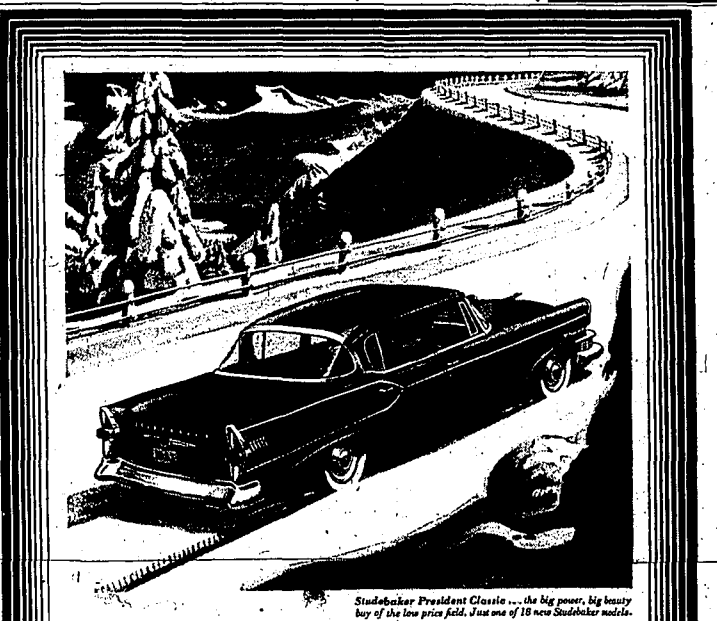
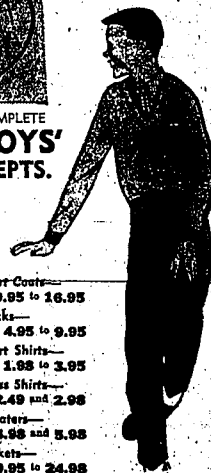

Japan Begins Review of Its Foreign Aims

By UNITED PRESS

Japan, Asia's most dynamic country, is about to start an important review of its foreign policy. The ancient kingdom whose history goes back 2,000 years was admitted to the United Nations yesterday. Probably tomorrow, Japan will undergo a radical change in its political leadership.

Tsunao Tabuchi, the incoming premier, will then direct Japanese policy toward the United States, Communist China and the Asian-African bloc of nations.

No sensational decisions are expected. But it is fairly certain Japan will adopt a more independent attitude toward the United States and will move promptly to increase its trade materially with Red China. When he gets around to it, Tabuchi is expected to ask the United States to set a final date for withdrawal of the troops. It has been stationed in Japan.

Since the end of World War II, Japan has been led by a succession of premiers who have based their policy on close cooperation with the United States.

Tabuchi, however, takes a more critical attitude toward the United States. As soon as he entered politics after the war, and was made finance minister, he started fighting Gen. Douglas MacArthur's occupation policies.

Hungarian Courage Has Given Russia Shattering Defeat; Victory Predicted

This is the last in a series by the one American reporter who stayed in Budapest during the Hungarian revolution and its suppression.

LONDON, Dec. 19 (AP)—Ten million Hungarians, armed with little more than courage, have handed Russia a shattering defeat.

Never again can the Kremlin claim it represents the poor, the down-trodden, the exploited.

The brutal force that holds communism together has been exposed for all the world to see.

Whatever terrible punishment the Soviet Union inflicts on Hungary, in the end they will lose — as few empires in history ever lost before.

For all their charges of "counter-revolution," while terror and fear, the unconcealable truth is that working men and women, intellectuals and youth rose spontaneously and unanimously against them.

One of the small satisfactions of the Hungarian people had during the revolution was to learn from foreign radio stations of the turmoil their uprising caused in communist parties throughout the world.

Peter Fryer, correspondent of London's Daily Worker, reached the end of his communist rope in Budapest. So one night, seated in the British legation, he wrote his resignation while Russian tanks patrolled the street outside.

Liquor Sales Competitions Hiking Costs

NEW YORK, Dec. 19.—All that landed up glassware in the ads and in the shop windows can be traced directly to costly competition in one of the most competitive of all businesses. And some companies wish they'd never started it.

It stems from this: Americans annually give each other some 100 million bottles of liquor—most of it around this time of year. Since that's a small market, distillers after these sales vigorously to the delight of the glass, carton and wrapping paper industries.

This year the spurge on decanters and fancy trappings is at a new height. They're fancier, more imaginative, costlier. And for the first time imported whisky is getting into the act.

Can't Stop Some in the industry go in for it religiously, holding that it costs too much for the return they get. But they're afraid to stop the practice unless their rivals do too.

Others they're noted industrial designers to turn out decanters looking like anything from old-fashioned syrup containers to a ship's lantern-bottle that plays tunes, or double for candlesticks—cups that can be used as end tables, their drawers filled with bottles.

Others concentrate on cartons with holiday motifs, some with a needlepoint effect on monk's cloth background.

Attracts Buyer As all this is so expensive as all this is so expensive are convinced that the fancy decanter will lure the gift shopper away from the plain bottle on the shelf. It may make "little differences" to the man buying for himself, as he is selecting a present he feels the fancy glassware makes it look more valuable.

If holiday sales come up to expectations, trade analysts are estimating sales this year as high as 215 million gallons—the first gain in six years.

Whiskey prices have gone up by 25 to 35 cents a fifth of a gallon in some places. In others, the rise comes after the first of the year, and the industry thinks this too should help sales right now.

German Learn Santa Claus Wears Olive Drab Uniform

BY HENRY McLEMORE WÜRZBURG, Germany.—An old German legend which has it that Santa Claus was born in Russia is being doubted by more than 100,000 German kids and old folks as propaganda of the most transparent sort — they know from experience that Kris Kringle wears his olive drab uniform of an American soldier.

Right now, weeks of intensive Christmas for underprivileged children and needy aged are about to pay off in the form of the biggest round of parties the Germans have ever seen. From Bremen on the North sea to Garmisch in the Alps, from the border on the iron curtain to Nuremberg on the border of France, there isn't a single army garrison, big or little, devoid of a Christmas tree and a few presents.

It's absolutely impossible at this point to tell how many German kids are going to enjoy their first family Christmas as a result of the American effort, but one of the tenth infantry division's three regiments is getting set to entertain more than 3,000 in the city of Hamburg and hundreds of soldiers from five regiments already have received invitations to spend Christmas in German homes.

Today they are not even an unpleasant memory. It's safe to say that more Ameri-

can soldiers are going to be dining on Yule goose in German homes than ever before. In the Hamburg area alone, more than 3,000 families already have requested help in catering American soldiers to be their guests on Christmas day. The Germans, too, realize what it means to be away from home on Christmas day.

At a Christmas fair in Heidelberg, American women banded hundreds of cakes and cookies and whomped up batches of fudge and taffy and passed them out to German visitors. One American housewife was disappointed to find that the German men, women and children who were manhandling the cookies she had baked, which had been mixed by presents. But these many wives are one of her friends. It was panache-winking like beavers to put out butter.

She explained what had happened, passed out generous pourings of Arkansas sorghum molasses (which had been hoarding, and served breakfast on the spot) and the fact that it was nearly time for dinner. Ever her top was a snacking access. The consensus of his latches of fudge and taffy and followed set of emphasized what a merry Christmas this promise to be for just about everybody in Germany, regardless of the language he speaks.

Campaign Readied to Inform World About American Aims

NEW YORK, Dec. 19.—Thirty-five million lire and 200,000 francs worth of American goods will be sent to help tell the world the truth about the United States. That we want peace and would not start a war. That we believe our "way of life" offers greater opportunity to the individual than any other system. But that we have no intention of thrusting our system on others. The project is part of President Roosevelt's "people-to-people" partnership program, launched last September to bring workaday citizens into the battle against anti-American propaganda, envy and ignorance. The president set up 40 committees covering every major walk of life and told them to "help make the truth of our personal goals and our respect for the rights of others known to many people overseas."

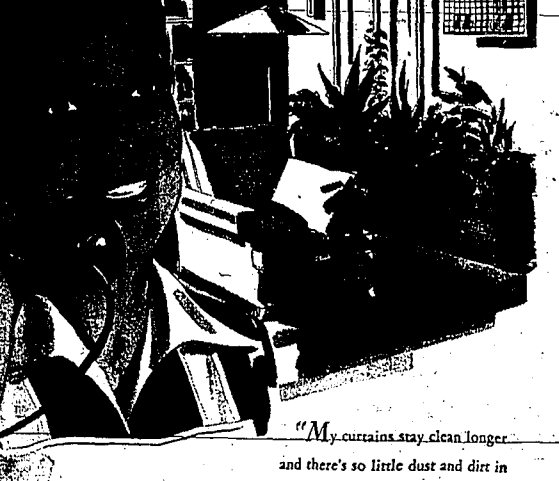
Among the committee chairmen are writer William Faulkner, cartoonist Al Capp, conductor Eugene O'Connell, AFL-CIO President George Meany and Columbia Broadcasting System President Frank Stanton. Recent immigrants and their children will play a key role on grounds they are to be sent to foreign peoples. They will be asked to join a letter-writing campaign to help explain to the land of their ancestors the "American story" which will send greetings abroad on special occasions and aid in the dispatch of calendars, pamphlets and magazines which tell the American position on atoms, department, scientific progress and culture. Every American who goes abroad—and especially the 25 million first and second generation citizens—will be considered a "good-will ambassador."

Directing this "nationalities" committee are Juvenal Marchisio, 64, Brooklyn-born of Italian descent, war-time president of American Relief to Italy, current chairman of the American Committee on Italian Migration. He is a domestic court judge of the City of New York and a Democrat. Col. John Siesak, a Czech-born toolmaker who now is a director or trustee of 20 companies and foundations, a World War I private who rose to under secretary of the army in the Eisenhower administration. He is an engineering executive and a Republican.

Mrs. Wright finished her book in only eight months and now plans to write another, dealing with events as she heard them from secondary inmates.

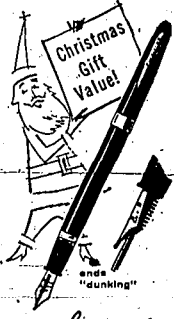
Since leaving the Twin Falls area, she has lived in the Payette and Snake valleys, now making her home in Huston, near Caldwell.

Board States Red Party Is Russia-Ruled

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 (AP)—The subversive control board held yesterday a session at which it stated that the American Communist party is controlled by Moscow.

The board's decision is the latest in a series of moves to register with the department and file its membership and financial data.

Members would be liable to heavy penalties if neither they nor their party registered.

New York, Eugene Dennis, general secretary of the Communist party, said the decision "will, of course, be appealed all the way to the supreme court."

A second decision by the board is necessary because, after the first decision in 1953, the supreme court sent the case back for further proceedings.

The court said it wanted to be sure the board did not act on the basis of any "tainted" evidence. It ordered the board to eliminate the testimony of Harry Gold, Julius Rosenberg, and the late Paul Robeson, or give Communist party members a chance to try to discredit their testimony.

Price Tag Is Put On Waste Wood

BOISE, Dec. 19 (AP)—The state today has put a price tag on the waste wood which it formerly allowed loggers to take from the forests free of charge.

The state land board at a meeting yesterday adopted the new policy of charging \$1 per thousand feet for the waste wood.

State Forester Roger Guzman said the new policy was adopted because of present market conditions for pulpwood, particularly in the Clearwater area of northern Idaho.

Guzman said the state previously had permitted removal of sawlogs, mill material and culls from timberlands free of charge to get logging areas cleared.

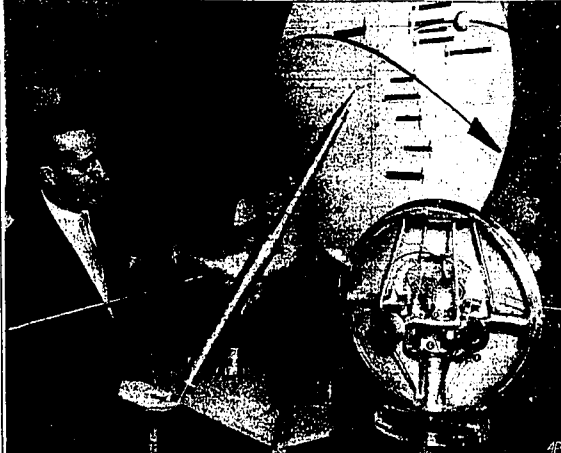

"We have the facilities and the personnel who can do this merchant ship but we feel that it would interfere with our ability to complete the navy contract on time."
