Three Spectacular Auto Crashes Injure Four as Others Have Close Calls

Motorists, passengers and police officers escaped death or serious injuries in three spectacular accidents in Magie Valley late Wednesday and early Thursday. Two of the accidents happened in Twin Falls county and one on Overland bridge across Snake river between Cassia and Minner counties. Only four persons were injured in the three crashes but three police officers and nine other persons had close calls. Three of the injured persons are patients at Magie Valley Memorial hospital in Twin Falls. In one of the accidents the luck of thinking of a passing motorist saved one man from being run over by a train after the man had been injured in the traffic accident.

German Coed Is Enrolled in Israel Classes

JERUSALEM, Israel, Dec. 20 (AP)—The Hebrew university here has admitted the first non-Jewish student in its 31-year history—a German girl who was enrolled today.

The student is blond Eva Beling, 25, Hamburg, who is preparing a thesis on the integration of German Jews in Israel for her doctorate in sociology.

Miss Beling previously studied at Frankfurt's Goethe university and the Sorbonne in Paris.

University officials said she arrived a few weeks ago, but they hesitated to disclose the news for fear of a public protest by some Jews who hold all Germans responsible for the Nazi extermination of six million Jews.

Miss Beling made a thorough study of modern Hebrew language before coming to Jerusalem and is able to take an active part in the university's academic life, officials said.

When she applied for admission last year she wrote that her request "must seem strange." But the academic secretary replied the Hebrew university "is open to people of good will, irrespective of creed or nationality."

DENVER, Dec. 20 (AP)—A 16-year-old escapee from a California mental hospital, with his 17-year-old estranged wife whom he abducted Monday, was captured here early today when a stolen car he was driving crashed into a ditch during a high-speed chase by police.

The fugitive, Michael Wiegner, and his young wife, Clo Ann Wiegner, were both injured and taken to Denver General hospital where he was described as being in "pretty poor condition" suffering from a punctured lung and ruptured spleen.

Mrs. Wiegner was in serious condition with head injuries, fractured ribs and a compound fracture of the left arm.

A second fugitive from the mental hospital, 35-year-old Jesse Eastman, who is a Sioux Indian and also known as Jesse Red Cloud, was reported to have been in the stolen car during the chase.

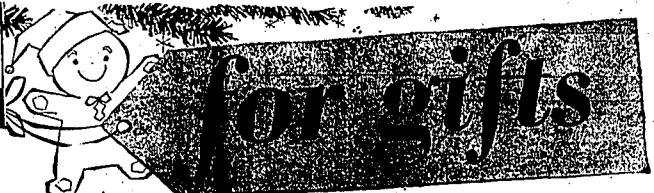

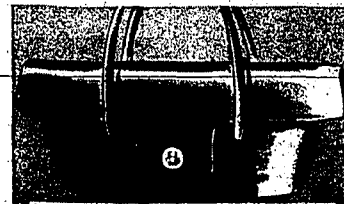

Officials report that the Yugoslav delegates will advise Gomulka to seek economic aid from the United States.

Yugoslavia can hardly be welcomed by the Soviet government, which has trouble enough at home without any chiseling in by Tito.

It may not be entirely a coincidence that just when the Yugoslav delegation started for Warsaw, the Moscow radio opened a new attack on Tito.

Average Soil Bank Payments Boosted But Base Unit Rate Will Remain Same

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20 (AP)—Average soil bank payments to farmers in 1957 will be considerably higher than in 1956 even though base unit rates remain the same.

For example, the national average soil bank payment for wheat in 1956 was \$8 an acre. In 1957 it will be about \$20.94. However, the base unit rate per bushel for each year was \$1.20.

The higher 1957 payments are explained by three provisions of the soil bank law as applied to the 1956 crop.

These provisions stipulated that:

1. A farmer who did not plant wheat in the fall of 1955 for the 1956 harvest because his land was dried out by drought was eligible for a soil bank payment of \$4 an acre.
2. If a farmer planted either winter or spring wheat and it was damaged or destroyed by natural causes such as drought, winterkill, flood and hail, his payment was based on an appraised yield but not less than \$8 an acre.
3. If a farmer complied with soil bank requirements after his wheat was up by mowing, or otherwise disposed of the crop, he was paid on the basis of an appraised yield but not less than \$8 an acre.

These provisions do not in 1957 and subsequent years. There will be no appraised yield in 1957 as there were in 1956. The yield will be based on average production. Therefore, the so-called drought relief benefits of the soil bank are not scheduled to cut into the 1957 wheat payments to cover the average as they did in 1956.

The same principle applies to other crops whose acreage is put into the soil bank.

Other 1956 national average payment rates per acre based on appraised yield were: corn, \$12; cotton, \$14; rice, \$10; flue-cured tobacco, \$304; and burley tobacco, \$25.74.

An agriculture department official said if 1956 soil bank payments had been made under "normal" conditions, and if agreements had been signed before planting time, the national average per acre payments would have been corn, \$10.02; wheat, \$20.94; cotton, \$16.25; rice, \$9.17; and tobacco, same as 1957.

The department explained that 1957 payments for corn, cotton, and rice will be based on an average county dollars-and-cents rate to be established for each crop. While the county rates will vary considerably, they will average out to about the national rates for the crop.

For tobacco, it will not be necessary to establish county per-acre rates. Accurate farm production in-

formation is available for most types of tobacco, and payment rates will be determined farm-by-farm.

Winter wheat farmers already have signed agreements to put millions of acres in the 1957 soil bank. The department has not yet called for spring wheat signers. The department's goal for all wheat acreage in the soil bank is 12-15 million acres.

Other average goals for soil bank participation are: cotton, 3.2-4.5 million acres; rice, 175,000-220,000 acres; tobacco, 120,000-140,000 acres. The total soil bank goal is 20-23 million acres. There are no plans to include prairie and extra long staple cotton in the 1957 soil bank.

No date has been set for contract sign-ups for any crop except winter wheat.

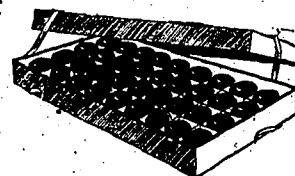

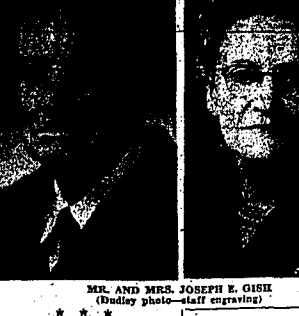

The traditional Christmas turkey is expected to be carved triumphantly to the family dinner table next Tuesday night as the housewife about as well as last year's.

And that is a bit of good news for consumers, since this year's turkey prices are running four or five cents a pound less than the 1945 figures. In the New York area, it means 42 cents a pound for the smaller size and 43 cents in the 18 to 24-pound range.

Hams also are winning favor as the main attraction on Christmas day, and nearly every supermarket will be featuring hams alongside their turkeys. One chain spokesman pointed out that hams are expected to be the best seller of all of New Year's day.

Black Featured

A few chains apparently will attempt to get their customers in a festive mood this week-end by featuring Italian and porterhouse steaks at prices as much as 14 cents a pound below a week ago. In other sections, however, steaks were marked up four to six cents.

Lamb was four to six cents a pound lower in some places, where it was the feature for week-end dinners. Veal was slightly higher in some areas, while roast beef was both up and down.

Eggs, too, moved irregularly.

Lower prices have been seen in the department of agriculture expects eggs to be somewhat more numerous, and therefore cheaper, during the last half of the year.

The department figures the nation's stock will be about as large as in 1945, but that it probably will produce at a faster rate.

Potatoes and onions remained an outstanding buy at virtually all vegetable counters. In many sections, however, the supply of old cabbage produced from during the latter half of the fall months is getting light, and the new cabbage from Arizona and Texas is not yet plentiful enough to be rated any more than a good buy.

Carrots Good Buy

Both western and nearby carrots are good buys, along with such greens as kale and collard, lettuce variety and green squash from southern fields. Spinach, cauliflower, and other winter crops are moderately priced in most places.

Celery, especially the large sizes, is reported more expensive this week, which is usually the case around Thanksgiving and Christmas. Florida citrus such as oranges, grapefruit and tangerines, all of which can dress up a fruit bowl table, are outstanding buys. So are California lemons. Good limes, on the other hand, are scarce.

Some varieties of apples also are good buys. Oranges are reported lower this week, while woodcock—Christmas dinner in some quarters—are said to be higher.
