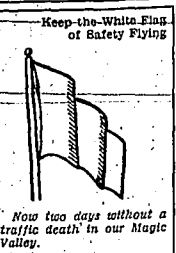

One-Way Use Of Streets Eyed in Plan

Plans considered. He pointed out that Main avenue, as it now exists, is sufficient width for one-way, three-lane operation with parking, and an ultimate plan was included in the report. To convert Main Avenue and Second Avenue into one-way streets would cost \$24,000, Mathias said. He said an additional \$20,000 would be needed for improvements at five points east.

Under the recommended minimum plan, the report says, "the minimum plan will provide the basic functional components required to improve and maintain one-way operation without a large expenditure of funds."

Mathias noted it was important that an information and educational program be inaugurated to advise the public of the conversion to one-way operation. He said the program should stress the changes in travel habits which will be required and point out the many advantages offered by one-way street operation.

The minimum plan calls for the improvement of five points west and intersection and Washington street south. Installation of three-phase traffic signals at five points east; installation of high intensity lighting throughout the downtown area; and installation of three phase traffic signals at intersections and intersection with other traffic signals along the route; installation of one-way signs at intersections and intersections.

"This proposed one-way couplet would provide an economic means of expanding the flow of both local and through traffic, reduce traffic hazards to vehicles and pedestrians and provide a system flexible enough to be adapted to future traffic growth," Mathias said.

Factors contributing to the congestion in Twin Falls at present are: flow of traffic in both directions, conflicts at intersections between turning vehicles, through vehicles and pedestrians; highway 30 contributes an annual average daily through traffic volume in excess of 1,200 vehicles; and Twin Falls is the shopping center of a large farming area.

"According to the motor vehicle registration and population trends in Twin Falls," Mathias said, "the present traffic volume will increase 60 per cent by 1976. The improvements recommended in this report could be expected to handle the increase and the system could be expanded to handle still greater volume."

Regarding the other four plans submitted in the report, Plan "A" consists of improving the existing location of highway 30. The conclusion reached by the highway department turns highway 30 on plan "A" because the "improvement would do little to improve the flow of traffic in the business district and it is doubtful if the expense of improving the present route of highway 30 is justified."

Highway 30 now runs over Fourth Avenue south and west.

Plan "B" is an alternate to the present route. It calls for highway 30 to be re-routed to Main Avenue. This would result in the elimination of parking in the business district on Main Avenue. This report says: "Although the removal of parking in the downtown area would increase the capacity of Main Avenue, the gains would be nullified because of the needs of additional signals and the providing of 200 additional parking spaces within the blocks of Main Avenue."

Plan "C" is essentially the same as the present route except that Sixth Avenue would be used as a connection between Main Avenue and Washington street instead of Second Avenue. Plan "C" bypasses the congested warehouse district but is directly marked for through truck traffic by the city.

Millionaire's Will Okayed in Court

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 21 (AP)—Final distribution of William Randolph Hearst's \$25,000,000 estate has been approved by superior court. The publisher's widow, Mrs. Millie Hearst, receives \$1,800,000, plus a \$4,800,000 trust fund. Trusts of \$2,500,000 were set up for Hearst's five sons, George, 52; William Randolph, Jr., 48; John, 46; and the twins, Randolph and David, 40.

The final accounting before the court yesterday showed that the William Randolph Hearst foundation received \$47,724,071. It was established for charitable purposes during the publisher's lifetime. Hearst died Aug. 14, 1951, at the age of 88.

The accounting showed that executors paid \$3,110,763 in federal estate taxes and \$618,930 in state inheritance taxes.

At present these two streets operate as two-lane, two-way facilities with both diagonal and parallel parking. To convert to one-way operation, three lanes are required on each leg of the couplet.

To obtain three lanes with parking a minimum of 64 feet is required. This would entail widening the street. On Second Avenue north and east, traffic would flow by Bickel

Cost of Living Doubles; Food Prices in Lead

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21 (AP)—Higher food prices have been the biggest factor in virtually doubling the cost of living since 1929. Government figures showed today. The official cost of living index maintained by the U. S. bureau of labor statistics reached a record level in October. At that time, according to bureau figures, food prices were almost 2 1/2 times higher than in 1929.

Costing costs were slightly more than double their 1929 level. Rent, on the other hand, were up about 50 per cent. The figures are based on the buying habits of "moderate-income" city families. The sharpest rises in the cost of living generally and in food and clothing costs in particular took place during the World War II and the postwar years. In the 11 years from 1929 to 1940, the cost of living rose 73 per cent, food prices 115 per cent, clothing prices 87 per cent. In the same period when rent controls were being removed, they climbed another 20 per cent between 1940 and 1945.

6 People Die In Home Fire In Minnesota

Others of the family were sleeping on the second floor. At a hospital after the fire, Mrs. Caduce said "I tried to save my baby, but I couldn't. The flames were too hot." She had burns on her hands and face. Destroyed with the home were piles of Christmas gifts which Mr. and Mrs. Clark and the oldest daughter had purchased yesterday. The blaze tentatively was blamed on an oil burner explosion. The fire happened only five blocks from the location of another fatal fire here earlier this month which claimed the lives of two small girls.

Retiring Banker Recalls Tremendous Changes for Banks in Last 50 Years

TRENDING Dec. 21 — Banks have undergone tremendous changes in the last half-century and are now in the best shape ever, says R. W. Williamson, who is slated to retire from the vice presidency of the First Security bank of Idaho on Dec. 31 at the age of 70.

From his Jerome office, Williamson has supervised First Security operations in Gooding, Jerome, Halley and Shoshone. Up until recently he visited each bank twice a week. Although he has been vice president since 1929, Williamson started his banking career in 1901, when he began working for Boatman's bank, St. Louis, Mo., at the age of 18.

After remaining three years, he moved to Colorado, where he was also in the banking business. Following nearly three years at the Colorado bank, he finally arrived in Jerome in 1909.

"That was the first year they had water on this tract," he recalled, "and they had a little trouble with it that year. It was 1910 before water was really available."

For seven years Williamson worked in the engineering and accounting departments of the Twin Falls Northside Land and Water company, spending a year in the Jerome State bank, owned by the company. In 1917 he joined the staff of the old First National bank in Jerome and stayed with the firm when it was sold to the First Security system.

Williamson reports that with the introduction and perfection of new machinery, bank accounting has completely changed in the last 50 years. "When I started in the 1900s, they were just beginning to use adding machines."

He also terms the development of branch banking "a great improvement" over the old unit system of individually owned and operated banks.

In addition, he feels the Federal Deposit Insurance corporation is "a wonderful thing for both banks and the public. In fact, nearly every change in banking has been for the better," he continued. "Banking in other businesses has profited by its mistakes."

"The government-ordered 'bank holidays' during the depression years as one of Williamson's greatest shocks in his career. "Not only our bank, but all others in Jerome were in good shape at the time," he said, "chiefly because of good loan policies."

He also praised banking legislation passed during the half-century. "Nearly all of it has been passed to directly benefit depositors," he added.

Williamson pointed to the fact that banks now maintain liquid reserves and don't overloan as another reason for the improved position of the industry.

As for his future plans, Williamson reported that he will "take his easy and travel" adding that he will spend the first two or three months of 1952 in Arizona, "to get away from the winter."

Aside from that, Williamson's plans are vague. "I probably do a lot of traveling, however," he said, "I don't have any hobbies to keep me busy."
