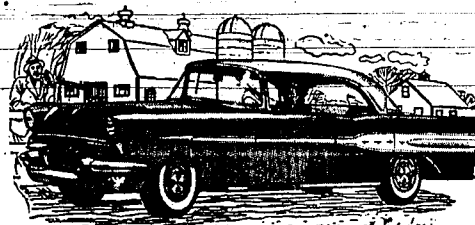

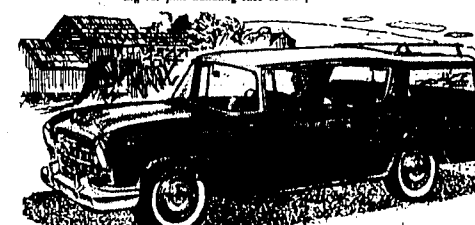

Justice Says Top Court Broke Rule

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22—One of the Supreme Court's most junior justices has accused his colleagues of breaking the court's own rules.

Justice John Marshall Harlan said in an opinion yesterday that the high court is deciding legal issues in the cases before it without first requiring a lower court ruling. It has traditionally done in the past.

A majority opinion written by Chief Justice Earl Warren in a labor case provoked the attack by Harlan and a similar one by Justice Felix Frankfurter. Warren's opinion led Harlan to criticize the court for "unsound, judicial, administration." He said the trend offends our own rules.

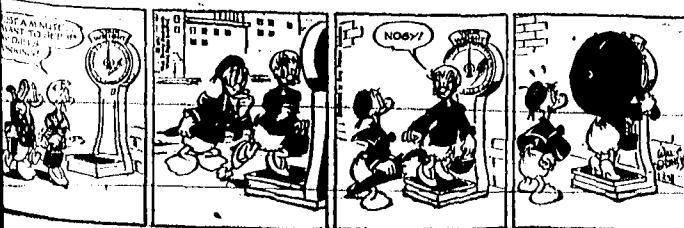

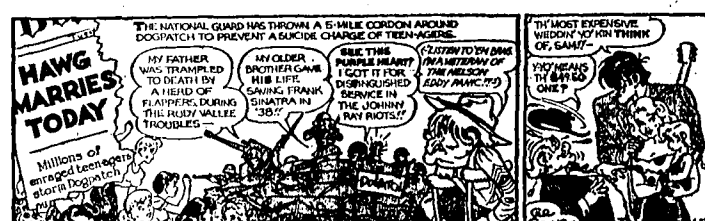
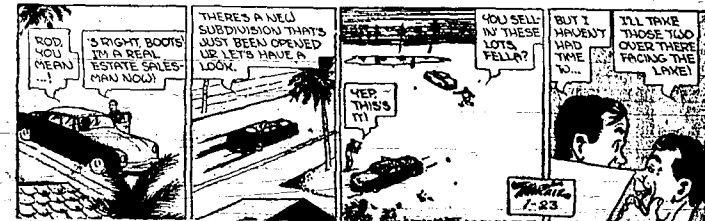
