## Burley Volunteer Firemen to Have Radio Equipment

BURLEY, Jan. 24.—Fire Chief Otis Williams reports 20 volunteer fire radio monitor sets are to be purchased for Burley at a cost of \$4,000. The federal civil defense administration will provide \$1,000 of the amount.

One portable monitor will be placed in the home of each volunteer fireman and the police department will have direct contact with each one. Under the present setup, when a fire is reported a policeman on duty at the city hall listens in on the "fire phone" and each fireman either has to call him or go to the fire department to learn the location of the fire.

Other means of signaling firemen have been discussed but the radio monitor seems to be the most efficient system, Williams said. Only one other community in Idaho has installed a similar system. The monitor can be plugged into any electric outlet in the home.

## Nations View Red Warning On 'Doctrine'

LONDON, Jan. 24 (AP)—Nations of the free world today viewed the Soviet "doctrine" as a warning of Moscow's reply to the Eisenhower doctrine for the Middle East. All agreed it can not be ignored.

The Soviet Communist party newspaper Pravda said yesterday the United States may turn the Middle East into the "new East" hotbed of atomic warfare.

Carrying out reported plans to establish atom-armed American units in Turkey, Iran, Japan and China.

The official Soviet Tass news agency immediately picked up the charge where Pravda left off and warned U. S. allies they might become the first victims of any atomic war. It specifically singled out for warning Britain, France, West Germany, Italy, Turkey, Iran and Japan.

But in Washington, President Eisenhower left open the question of whether U. S. force might be armed with atomic weapons if forced to fight communist aggression in the Middle East.

He said a final decision has not been reached, although his proposed "doctrine" for the Middle East promises to use force if necessary to battle communist aggression.

Mr. Eisenhower also said one of the chief aims of his administration during the next four years will be to achieve a better understanding with the Soviet Union.

Western observers saw the Soviet Union extremely worried by President Eisenhower's recent budget message calling for the U. S. army to increase its number of atomic support commands to back up the ground forces of allied nations.

The military correspondent of the London Times wrote today that "the obvious aim of the Soviet article is to frighten the middle-east countries."

Japan, the only nation-weak to feel the destructive force of an atomic explosion, said it will serve as a base for U. S. nuclear weapons.

"There is no truth whatsoever that Japan is offering a base for atomic warfare," said Chief Cabinet Secretary Hirohito Ichiide.

Philippine officials said the Soviet threat should not be ignored. "The world knows the Soviet Union, like the United States, possesses atomic and hydrogen bombs. Consequently, the warning is not an idle one and should not be ignored."

Some French sources said the Soviet and Tass articles were intended to destroy western unity by exploiting a "superficial" wave of anti-Americanism in Europe following the Suez crisis.

## Yank Money Is Large Item For Japanese

TOKYO, Jan. 24 (AP)—What if all the Yanks in Japan obeyed the constant cry "Yankee go home!"? Aside from the political significance, it would mean a loss of almost half a billion dollars a year to the Japanese—enough to wipe out more than half this island's trade deficit.

The Japanese are beginning to realize this, and many are changing the cry to "Yankee please stay."

Figures released by American officials show Japan still is dependent on U. S. military dollars.

Most of the 470 million dollars spent last year went for official purchases from Japanese firms. But 128 million dollars was spent by individual soldiers, sailors, marines and airmen, buying Talmi mats for their off-base apartments or shipping souvenir kimono back home. Mess halls, officers' clubs and similar activities spent another 87 million.

Japan realized 2.5 billion dollars from its exports during 1950. American sources say it was significant that U. S. military spending equaled 20 per cent of those earnings.

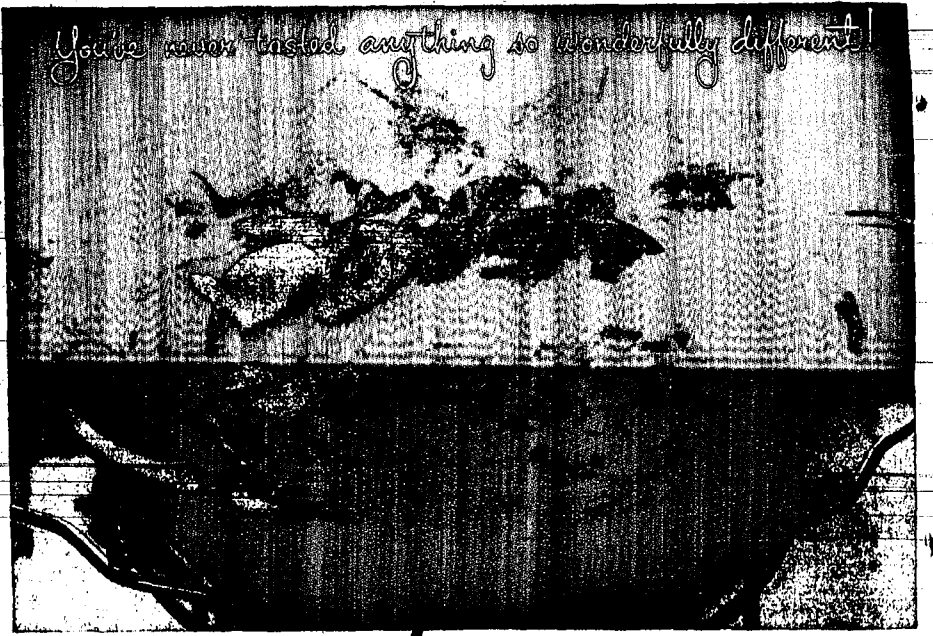

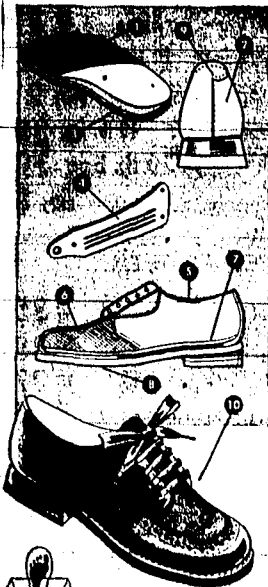

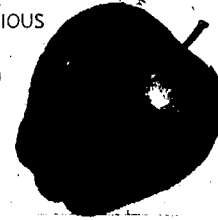

## Lions Club Movement 'Born' 40 Years Ago by Plan to Serve, Make Friends

CHICAGO, Jan. 24 (AP)—The Lions club movement is 40 years old this year. It started with a man who had an idea.

The man was Melvin Jones, 74, founder of the Lions and now secretary-general of the organization. His idea was that men who work together on civic or charitable projects not only serve their communities but become better friends.

"By serving others you build yourself," Jones likes to say. Jones, white-haired but active, can't begin to estimate the number of Lions club luncheons and dinners he's attended.

"One thing about it," he said, "in addition to helping the blind, the crippled children and a lot of other worthwhile undertakings, the Lions always seem to have fun, too."

It wasn't always thus with businessmen's clubs. In 1917 Jones was a new member of the Business Circle of Chicago. Attendance was desultory, meetings dull.

The members debated whether to adjourn each year for six months, from May to October.

Stuffed at the upstairs, the older members elected him secretary. Shortly afterward, Jones proposed a new national organization, taking in independent clubs and chartering new ones. This, the Lions movement was born.
