# Bill Would Give New Formula of Help for Schools

BOISE, Feb. 18 (U.P.)—The senate education committee today introduced in the Idaho legislature a bill for enactment of a new minimum education formula which was worked out by a legislative interim committee to replace the present system. The bill would provide that state minimum education funds be distributed to counties on the basis of school average daily attendance, the relationship of school district and county tax assessments to the state's average

for each size school. The new formula would not be subject to the present 16.5 million dollar limit which can be distributed to schools under the existing minimum education formula.

The proposed legislation also would set up a scale of minimum salaries for teachers ranging from \$400 annually for a beginning teacher with two years of college to \$600 for a teacher with a master's degree and 10 years of experience.

The formula would increase the state's contribution to the cost of education by \$1.5 million annually, and would be distributed to schools on the basis of the number of pupils in each school.

# Debates Seen As U. N. Gets Cyprus Snarl

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Feb. 18 (U.P.)—The United Nations took up the Cyprus issue for the third time in three years today, and the bitter debate was expected to strain the western alliance in the critical Middle East.

Britain, Turkey and Greece, NATO allies who are deep in arguments over the future of the island, are expected to present resolutions to the general assembly's main political committee.

Britain and Greece are preparing for two opposing resolutions. It appeared the United States will hold the key to the outcome by its behind-the-scenes efforts to keep Cyprus from opening a new wound in middle eastern politics in the wake of the Greek Cypriot revolt.

## Soviet Aiming At New Slants For Relations

Soviet Russia apparently is looking forward to a new slant in its diplomatic relations with the western world.

That seems to be one reason for the appointment of Andrei A. Gromyko as Soviet foreign minister. Gromyko is an experienced career diplomat, who has headed Russia's diplomatic corps at many international conferences as the No. 2 man in the foreign office.

Deputy T. Shepilov, whom Gromyko replaces, is not a diplomat at all. He is a career propagandist for the Communist party.

Hence, it seems logical to suggest that Russian leaders think the time has come to get a professional, instead of an amateur, back into the post of foreign minister.

It is possible, of course, that the frequently mentioned "struggle for power in the Kremlin" lies behind the switch.

But, for one thing, experienced Moscow correspondents say Russia still has the collective leadership instituted after the death of Josef Stalin.

There are sharp disagreements among the 11 members of the ruling circle in Russia on both domestic and foreign policy.

In this connection, it is mentioned that Shepilov is one of the followers of Communist party leader Nikita S. Khrushchev and Gromyko is one of Deputy Premier Vyacheslav M. Molotov's followers.

This is taken to mean that Molotov, leader of the "tough policy" group in the Soviet government, has won a victory over Khrushchev, who led the "liberal policy" group.

## Arturo Toscanini Paid Last Honor

MILAN, Italy, Feb. 18 (AP)—The body of Arturo Toscanini came home to Milan and La Scala Opera house where he began a career that was to make him one of the world's great conductors.

Toscanini, who died in New York on Jan. 15, had been an idol of Italian music-lovers for more than half a century and great attendances were on hand today to greet the body of the maestro.

The body was flown to Rome and was brought here today by special train for final funeral services and burial in the family tomb on the outskirts of Milan.
