



Agency's Head Notes Possible Work Cutback

WASHINGTON, March 14.—The Eisenhower administration warned yesterday that rising construction costs may force the government to cut back some of its public works projects.

The warning was issued by W. A. Deshaime, commissioner of reclamation. In a speech prepared for delivery to the Associated General Contractors of America, Deshaime told the contractors to "sharpen your pencils" and cut profit margins or "you may kill the goose that lays the golden egg."

"If inflation trends are not quickly checked, there is little doubt in my mind that you will find all but the most essential work curtailed, delayed or stopped," he said. "Certainly we can expect lighter federal budgets and a drastic curtailment of construction costs in the program if construction costs get out of hand."

President Eisenhower told his news conference last week the government may slow down the speed of some projects as an inflationary pressure to ease inflationary pressure.

Deshaime did not indicate whether a slowdown of reclamation projects would cut his agency's current budget or future construction spending increases. The reclamation bureau has asked Congress for \$1.2 billion dollars for construction projects for the fiscal year beginning July 1. He did not curtail specific projects that may be delayed or stopped.

Deshaime said a bill pending in scheduled in April for the 700-foot high concrete arch dam at Glen Canyon on the Colorado river in northern Arizona. This is expected to be the costliest single contract in U. S. reclamation history.

Warning the construction industry it may be "prying itself out of the market," Deshaime said that government contracts that include unreasonable high contingencies or margin or profit, however work is plentiful must be avoided.

'Get Tough' Plan Urged in Produce

ST. PAUL, Minn., March 14.—Farmers must take a hard line from the book of "American industry" and gain more control over their own produce, James O. Patton, National Farmers Union president, declared.

Patton said that farmers should adopt a tough policy of withholding their produce from markets until they get a fair price. "For the blunt fact is that, despite 30 years of national farm programs, farmers were never able to get on a bargaining power in the commodity and money markets," he told delegates to the annual convention of the Farmers Union Central exchange.

Case Against 'Tokyo Rose' Given Delays

SAN FRANCISCO, March 14.—Prosecution proceedings against the "Tokyo Rose" of World War II are to be bogged down in Washington.

And there was a strong indication that the immigration service is considering the possibility of dropping proceedings to deport Mrs. Iva Toivola, "Tokyo Rose."

Bruce Barber, director of the immigration service in San Francisco, indicated he is awaiting word on the case from Washington.

In Washington, a spokesman for the service said the government must still decide whether to go ahead with the proceedings or drop them. He said the case is under study and that the government is "proceeding slowly."

The immigration service ordered the American-born Mrs. D'Aguiro to leave the country or face deportation last March, shortly after she got out of Alderson federal prison in West Virginia.

Mrs. D'Aguiro won a conditional release from the prison in January, 1950, after serving six and one-half years of a 10-year sentence imposed on her in 1946.

Mrs. D'Aguiro was convicted in San Francisco on one count of treason. The charge was the result of her wartime broadcasts over Tokyo Radio in which she tried to demoralize American troops serving in the South Pacific.


She returned to the United States from Japan in 1948. On that occasion, she entered in the custody of army officials to await trial for treason. The department of justice said it had no passport or entry credentials and was an alien.

But her attorney, Wayne Collins, said she was an alien who entered illegally in 1948, she should not have been tried for treason. He said he will argue at her deportation hearing that she is still an American citizen and thus not deportable.

If he does, it will be the third time since he took office Feb. 1, 1936, that Mollet has put the life of his government on the line and has kept his job. The national assembly debates centers on two policy issues.



Egypt Facing Tourist Lack After Exodus

CAIRO, March 14 (AP)—A steaming white sea liner is being used on the banks of the Nile and nearby to help tourists get going up.

No one knows whether the tourists will come back to Egypt to stay in these modernistic western structures and journey out from Cairo to view the pyramids and the sphinx.

Retail business appears to be in the doldrums, with importers of luxury goods hardest hit. Medicines are scarce and whiskey and American cigarette hard to get.

There has been a vast exodus of foreign residents from the time of the Israeli attack to the end of February, some 37,000 foreigners have left by ship and the airfields from Cairo have been jammed.

It is uncertain whether American tourist families, ordered or advised to leave Egypt, will come back in any great numbers.

The land is sunny and warm again after the chilly and depressing days of February, and the business and merchants of the business are idle.

The British and French who once stroled the lawns of the exclusive Giza sporting club are gone now. Four Britons are on trial as spies. No girls has yet been published on the value of the hundreds of British and French business acquisitions, or "expatriations" since November, but it runs in the millions.



Senate Demos Mapping Plan In Budget Cut

WASHINGTON, March 14 (AP)—Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson, D. Tex., said today "most essential" spending items—prime target is a drive for "substantial" cuts in fiscal 1957.


The house Republican policy committee previously had urged congress to make "substantial" reductions. Eisenhower has said that it is congress' duty to cut the budget.

Removal From Highway Cited as Only System to Cope With Drunken Driver

SAFETY specialists are pointing to the removal of drunk drivers from the highway as the only realistic way to cope with the problem of drunk driving when and only when the necessary realistic approach to the problem is to now free of it have been completely realistic. Not the legislature, not the police and courts, and particularly not the people.

"Don't look for a single scapegoat for we all share in this sacrifice to safety and alcohol. Legislators have written laws with built-in escape clauses; police are frequently too lenient or grow lax because so many of the guilty go free; judges don't want to crusade for punishment which they aren't sure has the support of the electorate, and the people when sitting on juries are notoriously prone to acquit drunk drivers when the charge is anything which will make stiff punishment inevitable.

"We are all horror-stricken that 40,000 people die in traffic last year, perhaps ten thousand of them because of alcohol, but we have refused to take the steps necessary to stop it."

Despite this discouraging history, Dr. Strasser said, the citizens of every state are now facing new developments in the use of the automobile which make an even greater toll of lives so likely that "for the sake of morality alone, we must re-evaluate our position."

Pointing out that cars are becoming faster and more powerful and

new super roads encourage higher speeds, the safety specialists said, "if drinking can cause so much horror now, consider what terror it will bring when some of us, with alcohol-clouded minds and unimpaired senses, try to control runaway cars on the straightaway roads of tomorrow."

Although he is not altogether hopeful that the nation will completely overcome its maddening fondness for alcohol, Dr. Strasser said that he does believe "the trend toward realism and sober recognition of the seriousness of this problem is growing among our citizens, to a degree greater than most of the judges recognize."

As examples of the tougher public attitude toward drunk driving that is needed, Dr. Strasser had two principal suggestions:

1. Provide for automatic consent of the driver to submit to a recognized drunk test, by breath, blood, saliva or urine, any time he is ap-

prehended under suspicion of such a violation. This could be accomplished by legislatively providing that a driver would have to agree to such a condition before being issued an original or renewal of his driving privilege.

"At the present time drivers in most states do not have to submit to such a test if they choose not to, and there is some flyspec-thinking that such a condition might be an infringement of a person's inherent civil rights. The truth is that driving a car is not an inherent civil right, but a privilege granted by the state and revocable by the state. Any logical condition in the public interest can be attached to the granting of this privilege."

Such a scientific method of determining intoxication is helpful to the courts and the motor vehicle licensing departments in providing a factual basis for removing a driver from the road.

"These recognized tests for intoxication also should be specifically declared admissible evidence in every courtroom," in many states (California for example), the present law says only that this kind of evidence may be admissible.

Dr. Strasser reminded that the admissibility of intoxication tests was given a big boost just this past few weeks when the U. S. supreme court ruled in a New Mexico case that a blood test involving intoxication of a drunk driver was in the public interest and upheld the conviction of the driver involved.

"When such tests become standard practice and are available in every drunk driving case," Dr. Strasser said, "the law could be carried out with more uniform justice than the hit and mostly miss manner in which it now operates."

2. "The judges, who possess wide powers of discretion in the interpretation and decision in traffic cases, should be encouraged by the voters to seek a more uniform, stern jus-



Touchy Arabs Object to U. S. Marine on Guard, Mac Notes

TRIPOLI—Arabs' notes from an old date book, with the national flag and the Arabic word for "peace" at the top, were handed to a U. S. Marine on guard duty in Tripoli, Libya, today.

"Example: A group of our Marine department's people are holding a series of conferences in the hotel where I am staying and a man wearing a dress blue uniform is making a speech to the American troops," the notes read.






