Plane Mishap Claims Life Of Philippines' President; Vice President Takes Post

MANILA, March 18 (AP)—Vice President Carlos P. Garcia took over the reins of government of the Philippine nation and the free world mourned the plane-crash death of President Ramon Magasaysay. Garcia flew in from the SEATO conference in Australia. Magasaysay's charred body was found in the wreckage of his plane on a Cebu island. Garcia took the oath of office as fourth president of the Philippines.

The 60-year-old vice president took the oath of office at the Philippine republic before Chief Justice Ricardo Paras. He will serve until after next November's presidential election, which now promises to be a wide-open fight.

A staunch supporter of Magasaysay's foreign policy, Garcia is expected to continue the late president's policy of strengthening American-Philippine friendship.

The new president took oath before a group of 100 newsmen. He planned no change in the cabinet and would himself continue to fill the post of secretary of foreign affairs he had held under Magasaysay.

Magasaysay, 49-year-old champion of democracy and bitter foe of communism, perished early yesterday when his twin-engine plane crashed in dense jungle just after leaving Cebu for Manila.

Only one passenger, a Philippine newsmen, survived the crash which claimed the lives of 26 persons, including several top government officials and educators, several Philippine newsmen and members of Magasaysay's staff.

The plane was returning from giving two commencement speeches in Cebu.

Close guards were placed around the wreckage as officials made clear they had no ruled out the possibility of communist sabotage. As defense secretary, Magasaysay had received the communist Kibel rebel movement in the infant island republic.

Messages of condolence poured in from abroad to the Philippine government. Magasaysay's widow and their three children.

From abroad the cruiser Canberra, which carried the president, was ordered to return to the Philippines, the United States, and the Philippines.

Gen. Douglas MacArthur, who knew Magasaysay in World War II, expressed sympathy to the dead president's family.

Envoy Told U.S. 'Firm' In Mid-East

WASHINGTON, March 18 (AP)—The United States promised Israel today "to use its influence in seeking the objectives of peace and tranquility" in the Middle East. Secretary of State John Foster Dulles told Israeli Foreign Minister Golda Meir the United States "stood firmly" by the hopes and expectations it had expressed for the troubled area in connection with withdrawal of Israeli troops from Egyptian territory. The United States previously had expressed hope that the United Nations would play a major role in the dispute.

ABOARD EISENHOWER ESCORT SHIP, March 18 (AP)—President Eisenhower saw supersonic Terrier missiles from the cruiser Canberra knock down a high-flying drone target plane off the Bahamas today. The President was given the demonstration of America's guided missile might as the Canberra took him on a leisurely get-well cruise in tropical waters prior to his Bermuda conference later this week with the British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan. Fresh Water From Seas Is Savant's Aim

WASHINGTON, March 18 (AP)—The Navy is moving closer to the goal of providing unlimited supply of fresh water for ships and bases, government scientists said today.

Research on cheap methods of desalinating ocean water will make a significant step forward this summer when the construction of three pilot plants on the east and west coasts, and on the east and west coasts, will be completed.

If these plants work as well as the present aspect, said David S. Jennings, head of the interior department's office of the interior, "the Navy's office is certain that the process reasonably certain that the process will be brought down to cost of about 10 cents per 1,000 gallons."

That would be a major breakthrough in research. The most difficult part of the process is the desalination of water, which is a process that has been known for centuries, but which has not been made commercially feasible until recently.

A good many years of research and experimentation will be necessary, he indicated, to reduce costs to the point where major cities would consider it economical to run a pipeline from the nearest ocean rather than from their reservoirs from rivers and lakes.

Noted Evangelist Prepares for Huge Campaign: "Taking N.Y. for Ch

The "New York Crusade" are planning to meet in Billy Graham's blacked-out limousine.

Their objective: To take New York City for Christ.

The crusade is an evangelistic tour—a large-scale campaign in a career of large-scale campaigns, and its preparations began a half-century ago.

"We face the city in fear and trembling," says Dr. Graham. "There are so many more here we faced such overwhelming obstacles, and at the same time had greater opportunities."

The crusade doesn't begin for two months—on May 15—for more than a week after the Easter season has been getting ready for it, and in recent weeks, the preliminaries have been under way.

Headquarters for the advance party is in an eight-room office suite on the fifth floor of a building overlooking Times Square.

There, amid the clatter of typewriters, the ringing of telephones and the coming and going of local reporters and others, a full-time staff of about 15 is laying the groundwork for the biggest drive in the biggest city.

What is hoped for, Dr. Graham says, is a "break through to the conscience of New York."

"Unfortunately," he adds, "the religious resistance that is evident

multitudes, Dr. Graham says, that the "heavy responsibility" lies with the city—all or all-of-it—the city, he says he is relying to the prayers of the people to break across the country, and abroad.

"New York must become the most important city in the world, not on earth," he says. "If we did not, believe I feel individual actors' lives would be paying for us, we would not dare to attempt this crusade."

Already contacts have been made with church supporters in about 50 countries—many of them in areas where Dr. Graham has preached—and will be having the support of the New York undertaking.

Neighborhood "prayer group leaders" will be named for each of New York city, to organize prayer sessions in homes, offices and churches.

Starting April 1, the American Broadcasting company's local station, WABC-TV, will carry a daily "Prayer for New York" from 11:15 p.m. Monday through Friday.

The campaign has been booked in Madison Square Garden for a seating capacity for 20,000 for six weeks ending June 30, but it may well overflow into the Polo Grounds in the summer.

To serve at the rallies, about 500

ushers, 3,000 alternates and 6,000 counselors are being recruited. They will be housed in hotels, dormitories, churches, a school or youth hostel, and in other quarters.

The crusade will follow the Graham system, a trademark of recommendation of local pastors, and must follow a nine-day training course which will begin one week before the crusade begins.

They agree to confer individually with persons who make suggestions for Christ at the meetings, and to follow up on their own choice, and give follow-up programs.

A New York committee will maintain contact with the crusade for months after the campaign ends, to give further help to those who make decisions to get established in church life.

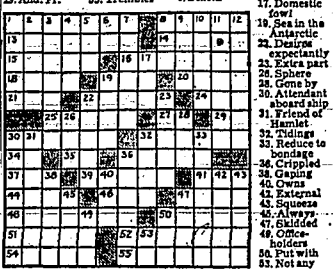
