

Cuts for U. S. Levies Urged By Knowland

WASHINGTON, March 25 (UP)—Sen. William W. Knowland, R-Calif., called for a 10 percent cut in the U. S. levies on foreign goods to "stimulate" the economy and to "reduce" the federal deficit.

Knowland's statement was the first in a series of proposals for tax cuts that he has made since he was elected to the Senate last year.

Knowland said that there will be a "strong movement" in Congress to reduce the levies in 1958.

Knowland, the Senate Republican leader, said he will oppose any increase in the levies next year and that he will continue to fight for a cut in the levies during the Korean war and the coming year-by-year cuts.

There also must be a cut in the federal income tax next year. But Knowland declined to speculate on the possibility of possible reductions in that field.

"It is the time to put our financial house in order, looking toward the next year," he said, "and we are going to make budget cuts and I think there will be more room for personal income tax reductions."

"I doubt that Congress will pass any further extension bills after this year to continue the Korean war and the levies. We have some as yet in this field and the levies in this field are going to have to be cut up to 10 percent."

The Senate finance committee has scheduled action Monday on a bill to continue for another year the 52 percent maximum rate of taxation on corporations. The house has already passed the measure. Without any action on it, the rate would drop back to the pre-Korean war level of 48 percent.

The measure, which may be amended to extend the 52 percent rate to 1958, would also continue high excise rates on automobiles, auto parts and accessories.

Continuing these tax rates is expected to mean about three billion dollars in revenue.

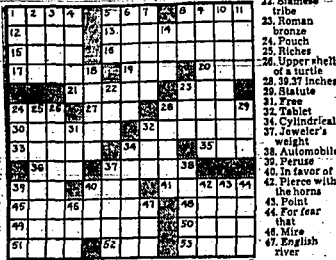
