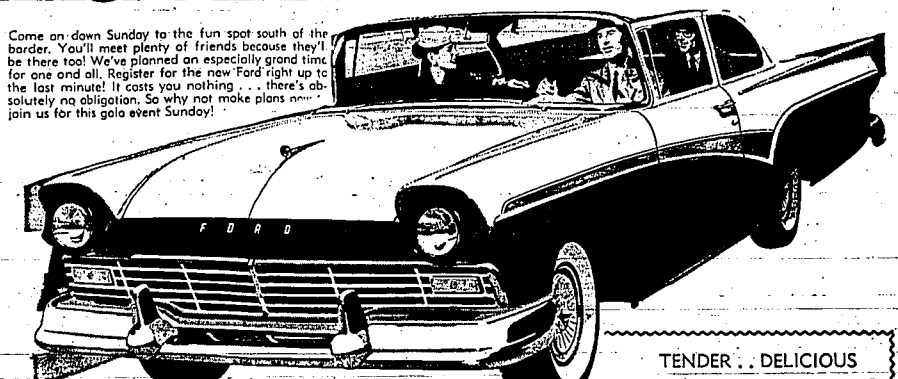

U. S. Disposal On Surpluses Nets Criticism

WASHINGTON, March 28.—(AP)—American disposal of farm surpluses has been criticized by a group of economists from a meeting of a United Nations food and agriculture committee in London. The committee, which is studying the world's food problem, has expressed concern that the United States' temporary surplus disposal program may become more or less permanent in nature and drive smaller exporting countries out of business.

Criticism of American operations came chiefly from South Africa, New Zealand, Australia and Canada.

Pointed attacks on the country's export programs have bobbed up several times in recent years. The American Federation of Agricultural Producers reported foreign exporters' opposition to American disposal operations on the basis of the fact that the United States had had a surplus of wheat for several years.

New Zealand declared surplus wheat for small countries dependent on exports of two or three commodities for foreign exchange.

American representatives insisted that this country has been extremely helpful to small countries in the world. They expressed belief that surplus wheat will be eliminated under the new bank program.

AMARILLO, Tex., March 28.—A love-stricken 16-year-old boy who tried to walk 35 miles through a severe blizzard to see the girl he loved was found slumped on a barbed-wire fence, frozen to death yesterday.

A cowboy, riding the lone-line search of breaks caused by the storm, came upon the boy of Chicago. A Simpson, 16 miles northwest of Amarillo, which had been the boy's destination when he set out last Saturday.

Authorities said Simpson apparently had been overcome by the numbing cold and wind-whipped snow that piled up huge drifts over the week-end.

Wearing a field jacket and dungarees, Simpson headed for a nest by highway to try to hitch-hike a ride to Amarillo late Saturday afternoon after the approaching blizzard had canceled a bus run from Boys Ranch, a home for homeless and wayward boys. Cal Parley, director of the ranch, said Simpson had fallen in love recently with a girl in Amarillo, and was determined to see her Saturday.

The storm struck early that evening, apparently while Simpson was walking toward the city, 35 miles from Boys Ranch. The girl was not identified.

Even before the blizzard began, ranch staff members searched the area, seeking to find and dissuade Simpson from continuing his trip. The search was resumed, on horseback, Monday.

Then yesterday, cowboy Ralph Gettis discovered Simpson's body draped over the fence, 12 miles from the ranch—the 48th victim of the vicious storm that raged across the great plains last week-end.

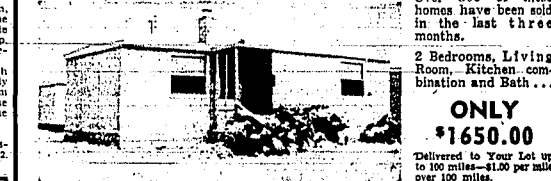

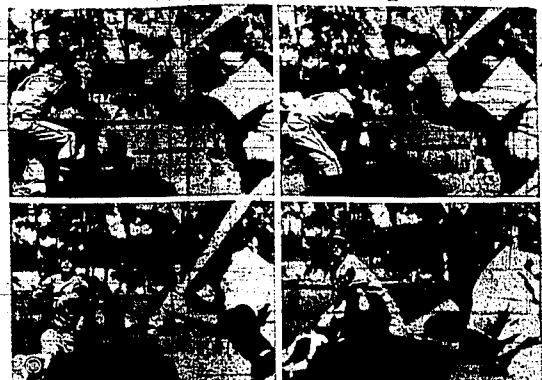

That he had signed the three bills, the governor said today. "I would have no objection to its passage," he said. "I think it is productive of change."

The results of the session just closed indicate that in raising the general sales and use tax with relief spread among the other sources of revenue.

Members of the legislature made the adjournment late after having been in session since 10 o'clock this morning. The session was productive of change in legislative attitude toward this problem has occurred during the session.

At the start of the legislature, Smylie said he had a budget of \$55,500,000 and suggested the educational program be increased. He said a sales tax was not needed now, but added:

"There is little chance that this present tax structure will be adequate to serve the state much longer."

He said Thursday that he still stands on this, adding: "I don't think it is a particularly good long-range answer. But he said the bill sponsor, Rep. Sam Kaufman, R. Ada, was to be commended for his work."

He called the legislature's total appropriation an "extraordinary budget—perhaps more than it need be in some places."

Smylie said he asked the lawmakers to find the needed additional revenue within the present tax structure because the only other alternative was to ask many members of the legislature to publicly violate public commitments.

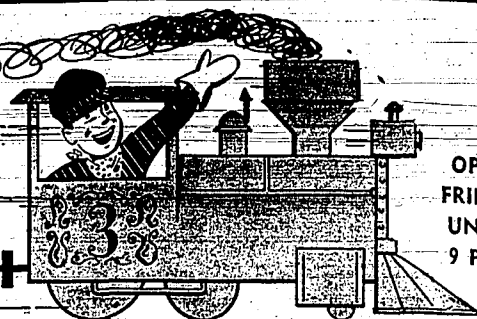

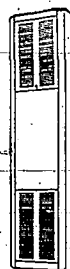

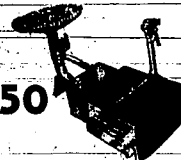
