Bakery Union Faces Charge For 'Squeeze'

WASHINGTON, June 7 (AP)—The House committee charged today that the Bakery Workers union squeezed \$83,470 from workers and employers and gave nearly \$800 to its union vice president, Max J. Kravitz.

Joseph Tencar, former business agent for Bakery Local 3 in New York, testified that the union "put pressure" on all employers in the city to buy 250 tickets to a national dinner for Kravitz in 1956.

Employees also were asked to buy tickets in its souvenir program at a minimum of \$50, he said.

Tencar said he felt employers had no choice. Kravitz, he said, was called the "little dictator" and regulated all bakery union contacts in the city.

Committee Counsel Robert F. Kennedy said the union raised \$33,470 from ticket sales and \$51,000 from the souvenir program.

Out of this, he said, the treasurer at the Waldorf-Astoria cost \$17,000, there were other minor expenses, but the bulk of the money, he said, like this:

"Result of guest of honor, \$1,447; gifts to guest of honor (Kravitz) \$37,000; gifts to wife of guest of honor, \$180.

Kennedy said that when the bills were paid, the dinner fund had \$600 left in the bank—and that went to Kravitz, too.

Idaho Boat Tags Reflect Increase

BOISE, June 7 (AP)—Idaho state prison officials reported today that the penitentiary license plate shop had turned out 9,160 boat licenses to date this year to fill orders by county sheriffs.

The rate of manufacture indicated a sharp increase in registration of boats this year compared with 1956, factory superintendent Virgil Carey said.

Kootenai county, with Lake Coeur d'Alene led in orders for boat licenses with 2,450 plates. Carey said Boise, Clark and Clearwater counties had ordered boat plates for the first time since Idaho began registration of boats.

The 1957 legislature broadened the classifications of boats which must be licensed and the new law apparently accounted for some of the increase in registration, Carey said.

Russians Give Finland Offer Of More Trade

HELSINKI, Finland, June 7 (AP)—Waiting Soviet leaders Premier Nikita Khrushchev and Communist party chief Nikita Khrushchev said a wreath on the grave of the late Finnish President J. K. Paasikivi and then started talks with Finnish officials.

Subject discussed during the hour-long talks were not revealed, but it was believed they centered on increasing trade between the two countries.

Paasikivi set the tone for the talks last night when he said more trade would strengthen present friendly relations between Russia and Finland.

The Soviet leaders drove from their hilltop to this morning to the suburban cemetery where Paasikivi is buried and placed the wreath on his grave. It was Paasikivi who laid down the Finnish doctrine of non-involvement in big-power quarrels. He stressed Finnish-Soviet relations through present course.

Khrushchev and Khrushchev also visited a children's hospital and a housing development before going on to a reception and state banquet.

The Soviet leaders, the first top Russian party officials to visit non-communist country since last fall's Hungarian uprising, arrived in Helsinki and were given the red-carpet treatment by top Finnish government officials.

At a dinner given by Finnish premier V. J. Suvelainen last night, Khrushchev made it quite clear that the Soviets placed their hands on top of the agenda for discussion.

TV "Inanity" Draws Blasts

ASHVILLE, N. C., June 7 (AP)—Carl Sandburg started a gathering of 3,000 women from across the nation last night by denouncing television commercials for "inanity, silliness and cheap trickery."

Building beside him on the stage of the convention of the General Federation of Women's clubs was a controversy. He said he had preceded him on the program.

Sandburg launched into his criticism of television, movies, radio and other entertainment media.

"More than half the commercials are so filled with inanity, silliness and cheap trickery that they make you wonder why you watch them," he said.

"But Sandburg added, in a milder tone, that television is a medium and we will pay for it. The audience burst into laughter and applauded."

U. S. Radar Grid Protecting Spain

MADRID, Spain, June 7 (AP)—A radar warning net is being strung around Spain for air defense against big U. S. strategic bomber bases and other vital targets in this country, it was disclosed today.

Sketchy details of the new air defense plan were revealed following a visit by the U. S. military command which took control of the multi-million-dollar bases on July 1 and began limited flight operations in Spain, late this year.

The radar net, patterned on the U. S. defense system, will serve to alert jet interceptor units of the U. S. and Spanish air forces. The closest kind of cooperation between the two air services will be demanded, and observers believe, a joint staff will be necessary to direct flight operations.

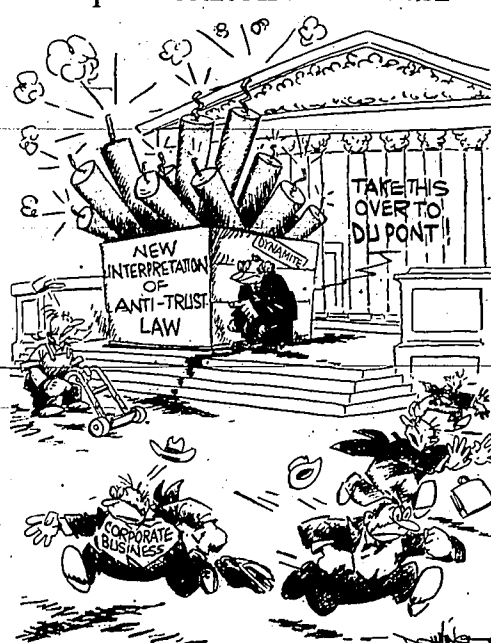

Truce, Rather Than Peace, Keeps Gaza Frontier Quiet; Israel Stays Prepared

GAZA FRONTIER, Israel, June 7 (AP)—An armistice agreement between Israel and Egypt is being negotiated, but the Israeli government says it is not prepared to accept a truce that would leave the Gaza strip, a young Jewish settlement, and the surrounding area in the hands of the Egyptian army.

We had a short reprieve from this after we beat the Egyptians in the Sinai campaign, he said.

But Israel today relies for her peace on the sword. There is no mistaking that. Government leaders asserted frankly that the country must maintain a high degree of readiness in the absence of a peace settlement which will end the state of war existing with the Arab states.

Meanwhile, new settlements are going up all over the country and along the 600 miles of borders exposed to the enemy.

'Boy Wonder' To Try Hand At Tough Job

Maurice Bourgeois-Maunoury, the man who could be the next premier of France, has proven himself not only a government administrator but also a financial expert, a corporate leader, a military hero, and an intellectual.

Bourgeois-Maunoury has accomplished all of this in only 42 years, making him a veritable "boy wonder" of French politics.

Born at Lorient in 1914, Bourgeois-Maunoury was educated at France's finest school, Ecole Polytechnique.

The tall, handsome Radical party member entered the army in 1935 and was named an artillery lieutenant.

His wartime exploits won him the Croix de Guerre and the resistance medal. He was imprisoned twice, a deputy to parliament in 1948.

Returning from the war, his fellow citizens in Lorient elected him a deputy to parliament in 1948.

The soft-spoken, personable Radical won respect from his fellow-deputies for his incisive debates and perceptive commentary on the problems that plagued France after the war.

His government career started to rocket when, in 1954, he was appointed secretary of the budget.

Then, in 1955, he was elected young political star filled nearly every seat in a succession of cabinet posts.

He was named to represent his country at the United Nations in 1955. His financial acumen later won him an appointment as a director of the giant, nationalized, Renault auto works.

Italian Premier Faces Last Vote

ROME, June 7 (AP)—Premier Adone Zoli's Christian Democracy party counts on support from its old right-wing opponents to put it in charge of Italy's new government in a final vote of confidence tonight.

The Monarchist and Neo-Fascist parties joined the Christian Democrats, largest party in Italy, to give Zoli an easy victory in his first confidence test in the senate Tuesday night.

The same line-up was expected to give Zoli a 50 to 50 vote margin when voting begins in the chamber of deputies late tonight on the second and more important confidence test.

Once in office, Zoli would have the task of setting a new government line next spring. Only three major legislative projects stand in his way: The 1957-58 budget, ratification of the European and European common market accords, and action on a long delayed land reform program.
