India Will Not Join West in Condemnation of Reds' Action in Hungary Revolt

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Sept. 13 (U.P.)—India declared itself today flatly against any condemnation of Russia and the Hungarian regime for the brutal suppression of last year's freedom revolt in Hungary. Despite the position taken by India, a recognized leader of the "Asian neutrals" group, efforts to weaken a 37-power resolution condemning the Soviet Union appeared doomed. The United States, with the unanimous support of 35 other nations, rejected a resolution submitted by Burma to replace the word "condemns" with "deplores" in the resolution.

Members forswore a crushing defeat for this move and an overwhelming approval of the resolution was submitted when it came to a vote tonight or tomorrow.

Ambassador Arthur B. Hall told the general assembly's special session that India's attitude does not mean that it is in any sense approving of the Soviet action in Hungary.

We feel we must, both in the interest of Hungary itself and in the larger interest involved, turn away from the course of condemnation which would weaken the resolution's effect.

Strike May Up Phone Lines In South Idaho

IDAHO FALLS, Sept. 13 (U.P.)—A general strike by the Communications Workers of America against Western Electric company could have widespread effect in southern Idaho, the head of the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph company's Idaho operations said today.

A strike against Western Electric would tie up installation work on a number of exchanges, said J. W. Heckman of Boise, company vice president for Idaho. If the strike were to occur, the company would be forced to shut down or interrupt telephone service at several exchanges.

A three-million-dollar project for conversion of a distal line in the area is being completed by the crews at the other cities named.

Heckman said that the company is making minor installations.

BONN, Germany, Sept. 12 (AP)—The opposition Socialists appealed to West German voters last night to elect Chancellor Konrad Adenauer in the general election Sunday and "one-party rule."

The Socialists announced that in no circumstances would they join Adenauer's Christian Democrats in a coalition government after the election.

Adenauer's Christian Democrats hit back with a warning that the "freedom and unity of our people" are at stake. They reminded voters of the booming economy and told them they never had it so good.

The latest public opinion straw poll makes the 61-year-old Adenauer an odds-on favorite to win a third term.

Volunteers' Help Is Credited For Success of Polio Clinic

Clerical work and uncounted hours of volunteer workers from Twin Falls Grange No. 216 has been a deciding factor in the success of the Twin Falls county polio immunization clinic.

The clinic, in operation from 1 to 5 p.m. each Wednesday at the county health department office on Ship-Ahove street, was formed through the efforts of members of the Grange community service committee, the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, Twin Falls Grange members, of the Boy Scouts and others.

The program includes an adult polio immunization clinic which calls for three shots of the Salk vaccine.

Mrs. Irvin Bodensstab, chairman of the Grange community service committee, estimates 75 per cent of the children in Twin Falls county schools and school district 411 have received the shot.

"The clerical work for the weekly clinics has been done alternately by the Twin Falls Grange women and the Women of the Moose."

Friday, Mrs. Bodensstab said, "it is hard to estimate the number of hours spent in setting up the program. Hundreds of phone calls have been made and many miles driven."

Twenty Grange members have taken an active part in the program, putting in over 500 hours and driving over 1,000 miles.

As of July 1, a total of 3,462 shots had been administered. Mrs. Bodensstab says the program has cost very little to children.

A \$1 charge is made for shots given to adults. Mrs. Bodensstab explains the money received goes into a "revolving fund" to provide money so children may receive immunization without charge.

73 Cases of Polio Listed

WASHINGTON, Sept. 12 (AP)—The U. S. public health service reported 73 new cases of paralytic polio last week, bringing to 1,229 the total since Jan. 1.

The comparable figures last year were 202 and 4,347, respectively. The health service has attributed the sharp reduction in the incidence of paralytic polio to the new Salk vaccine.

The agency said 244 polio cases, including the 73 of paralytic type, were reported during the week ended Sept. 7, this compared with 854 in the same week last year.

It listed 4,130 cases of all types since Jan. 1, compared with 9,759 during the same period of 1956.

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Faubus Given Sharp Attack By Knowland

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Sept. 13 (AP)—Sen. William F. Knowland, R-Calif., in a fighting speech last night said he deplored the actions of Gov. Earl Faubus of Arkansas for his stand on civil rights.

"No person, not even the governor of Arkansas, has the right to abrogate the United States constitution in civil rights," Knowland said.

The senator addressed 600 Republicans at a \$100-a-plate fund-raising dinner. He also condemned "some labor leaders" for their actions that have "shocked all Americans."

"Shocking Facts!" Knowland said. "The Senate and House of Representatives have passed resolutions condemning the actions of labor leaders who have shocked the rank and file of labor itself," he declared.

The senator mentioned that some labor leaders have marked him for political oblivion because of his labor stand.
