### Two Colleges Hit by Wave Of Vandalism

**BOISE, Oct. 8 (U)—**Officials of the University of Idaho and College of Idaho said today that they will work to improve cooperation between the two schools in the future after incidents of vandalism.

About four carloads of BJC students dropped by the College of Idaho campus Sunday after dark, toppling a signpost and smashing and stealing the letters "BJC" into the campus turf.

About midnight some 70 students were found by Boise police at the scene of the BJC stadium here, where they were busy with their own party but purposeful.

But Vice-President William O'Neil attempted to persuade the students to go home. He said the students "can't afford vandalism."

But later part of the group from the College of Idaho returned, damaged a goal post and set a fire under the Boise school's sign.

O'Neil said they would ask students involved to pay for the damage.

All persons having business before the honorable court must appear in person. The U. S. is scheduled to draw near and give attention for the court is now sitting. God save the U. S. and this honorable court.

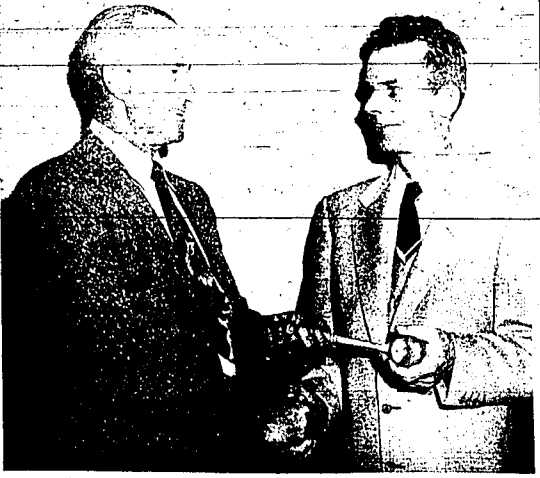
### Quartets Garner Superior Ratings

### Manpower Need Still Increasing

**WASHINGTON, Oct. 8 (U)—**The atomic energy commission said today a survey has indicated the need for scientists and engineers in private-supported atomic energy activities will almost double in the next three years.

The announcement said an estimated 7,000 to 7,500 scientists and engineers were employed in September, 1956, either full or part time, in all types of atomic energy activity supported by private industry. It was estimated this number increased to 9,000 in July, 1957.

"By 1960 the demand is expected to increase to an estimated 10,000," the announcement said.

### Tranquilizers Big Business, Nurses Learn

**BOISE, Oct. 8 (U)—**A nurses' convention was told yesterday that tranquilizing drugs are not cure-all yet.

Dr. Louis Morone, assistant professor of clinical psychiatry at the University of Utah, spoke to the fifth annual convention of the Idaho League of Nurses. That meeting was the forerunner to the 46th annual convention of the Idaho State Nurses association today.

"The present drugs," Dr. Morone said, "are only the forerunners of newer and better drugs to come. They have stimulated a vast increase in interest and research in nervous and mental diseases which should pay big dividends in increased understanding of cause, treatment and prevention."

"The drugs, and other measures, have brought about a small reduction in the number of patients in hospitals, have made it possible to treat some patients without going to hospitals, have made other forms of treatment easier."

Saying that tranquilizers have become "big business," Dr. Morone added that "three out of every 10 prescriptions" now call for their use.

## Two Factions Hold Talk in Tiny Country

SAN MARINO, Oct. 8 (AP)—An anti-communist leader in divided San Marino said last night his side and the rival red regime intend to take the arms away from their volunteer soldiers.

Federico Bigli, unofficial prime minister of the provisional "white" regime, said the darning of the two volunteer militia forces was discussed at negotiations between the two factions.

His announcement that negotiations had opened between the two camps came at a news conference at which he claimed it would be only a matter of days before the communists would surrender.

He said both sides had given assurances during the negotiations that they would disarm their rival groups of volunteers, who have made rifles and submachine guns a common sight in this tiny republic.

No Comment  
The communists were not available for immediate comment.

The old red regime, which had ruled San Marino since the end of World War II, controls the rest of this republic and its government buildings in the village of San Marino.

Defections cut the communists' parliamentary majority and the anti-communists took over the government. The reds ordered elections for Nov. 3 and said earlier they would continue to rule until then.

## Blaze Damage Reaches Peak

BOSTON, Mass., Oct. 8 (AP)—For the second successive year, the United States has suffered a record-breaking total fire loss, it was announced today.

Last year's total loss was \$1,231,876,000, an increase of \$600,000,000 over 1950, the National Fire Protection association said.

A 22-million-dollar increase in large-loss building fires and a 40 million dollar rise in aircraft losses contributed to the record.

During 1950 there were 1,040,150 fires in the United States, 27,000 fewer than in 1949.

Building fires totaled \$24,400 and caused \$1,018,000,000 damage last year. An additional 1,147,760 fires not involving buildings accounted for \$215,876,000 loss.

## Satellite Launching Touches Off Global Wave of Comment

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8 (AP)—Here are some excerpts from what scientists and others are saying on the Soviet success in launching the first earth satellite.

Dr. J. M. Leavitt, director of Field planetarium, Philadelphia, said an authority on outer space, and the army, could have launched its huge Jupiter C guided missile into outer space as a satellite last year "but an astonishing piece of stupidity" prevented it. He said the Pentagon decided to develop another, saying the Jupiter C was designed as a missile. He said it "certainly let the Russians score an astounding propaganda victory over the United States."

Senator Smathers, D., Fla., proposed a senate investigation to determine "the reasons for our failure in keeping pace with the Soviet Union in the development and perfection of the satellite, rocket and intercontinental ballistic missile programs."

Prime Minister Nehru of India said the launching "forces people to realize that our present day policies are outdated. Science and technological advance have gone far ahead of the capacity of human beings to adapt themselves to it."

Pravda, the Russian communist party newspaper, predicted the Soviet success would force the United States to revamp some of its foreign policies and said already some U.S. senators "are showing signs of hysteria."

Toronto Telegram quoted Igor Gouzenko, Russian spy, as saying a Canadian spy ring in 1940, as saying the first in the U.S. missile production set-up enabled Russia to launch the first earth satellite. The newspaper further quoted Gouzenko as writing to President Eisenhower that the Russians "now are months and maybe years ahead with missiles—their countries are sitting ducks."

## Norway Retains Present Premier

OSLO, Oct. 8 (AP)—Prime Minister Einar Gerhardsen and opposition leaders agreed today that Manjasta voters had continued the Social Labor party in office with a re-sounding vote of confidence.

Results from 600 of Norway's 744 election districts indicated the middle-of-the-road Laborites in the general election yesterday, won 78 of the 150 seats in the Norwegian storting (parliament).

Labor held 77 seats in the last storting and has been in power for 22 years.
