## Farms to Produce High Crop

BOISE, Oct. 15 (AP)—Favorable weather during September is helping Idaho farmers produce another big crop in history, the U. S. department of agriculture reported Tuesday.

The agency said the combined index of prospective production of Idaho crops on Oct. 1 stood at 134.3 per cent of the 1947-49 average. That exceeds the previous all-time record of 132.5 per cent.

During the month production prospects increased for corn, spring wheat, apples, hops, late potatoes, alfalfa, sugar beets and beans. There was no change in the indicated production of hay or sorghum. The report is expected to be less than expected.

The department said weather was "generally favorable" during the month, scattered frosts were reported

in some areas during the second and third weeks of September but the department said they caused only minor damage.

In another report, the department said that production of onions in Idaho was 100 per cent greater than last year and 50 per cent below the 1949-53 average. The agency said that the 1949-53 average was throughout most of the season caused abandonment of considerable acreage.

In still another report the department said that farm wage rates in Idaho as of Oct. stood at 851 per cent of the 1939-41 average. Rates of 16 points in the past year and a new record high for the month.

The average wage per month was \$10.40, compared with \$12.9 a year earlier.

# Teamsters Will Seek Reversal Of New Order

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15 (AP)—Teamsters union attorneys prepared today to ask the U. S. court of appeals to set aside a temporary federal district court injunction preventing Hoffa from taking over command of the nation's largest union for 10 days.

Federal District Judge P. Dickinson today denied the temporary injunction yesterday continuing Beck in office. Beck has agreed to step down before his term expires Dec. 1.

**Power Abuse**

The union was directed to show why a court-appointed supervisor should not pass on the union's major decisions.

The union also was ordered to show why the court should not prohibit the union's officers from spending more than \$5,000 on any one transaction without court approval.

Noting that the Farm Bureau has been at a disadvantage because foreign countries apparently made better use of agricultural trade representatives at negotiations," the bureau said.

# Big Renovation Job for Statehouse Is Continuing; One Wing Is Refurbished

BOISE, Oct. 15 (AP)—That spot before your eyes, governor, is gone—no more. It was really disconcerting," said Gov. Robert E. Smylie. That break in the plaster was a tantalizing attraction for me when I argued cases in the court. It distracted me so that my eyes would stray from the justice.

All rooms in the wing have been painted, including those occupied by Chief Justice William D. Keeton and the four associate justices. Court justices said it had been at least eight years since some of them had been painted.

Carpets and draperies were replaced as needed, some of them for the first time since the wing was constructed.

One of the biggest improvements, from the view of attorneys arguing before the court, was the lowering of the clock over the judges' bench. The master clock system in the capitol built running many years ago and a substitute clock had been hung on the wall, high over the bench. To see it, an attorney arguing before the court, needed to tilt his head.

The thick face of the old clock has been covered by a shield on which was painted an emblem in-vested in the state seal.

## Turkey Looks Over Menace; Remains Calm

ANKARA, Turkey, Oct. 15 (AP) — Turkish political circles spoke with marked restraint yesterday about the surprise arrival of Egyptian soldiers in Syria. The Turks appeared undisturbed.

There were strong indications that Turkey—recently engaged in bitter exchanges with the leftist Arab neighbors—will study the troop movement long and seriously before saying anything publicly.

**Emergency Move**  
The news of the plane-guarded landing Sunday at the Mediterranean port of Latakia, 40 miles south of the Turkish border, apparently caught the government by surprise.

One Turkish source said about 500 Egyptians may have been involved. Estimates in Washington and London were lower, ranging from 1,000 to 1,500. Reports indicated most of the men are in armored units.

Political circles said the foreign ministry's reluctance to comment is due primarily to the fact it has as yet received no reports from its own representatives on the situation.

**Aware of Threat**  
Secondly, these circles said, Turkey has recently established good relations with Egypt and is aware that Syria, Egypt and Saudi Arabia have a military treaty.

There also is evidence here that Turkey might consider the Egyptian arrival as a signal not at Turkey but at Israel. The whole Arab bloc considers Israel an enemy with aggressive aims.

Militarily, the arrival of a battalion or a regiment of Egyptians to reinforce Syria's 100,000-man armed forces would have little effect on the balance of power in the Middle East.

Turkey, with about a half million troops, is believed to have an army corps in the southern provinces along the 450-mile Turkish-Syrian border. Authorities emphasize that Turkish soldiers are posted there only for defensive purposes.

# U. S. Is Said Planning for 'Big' Satellite

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15 (AP)—The U. S. military is reported working toward a 500-pound spy satellite which might scan the whole globe for hostile activities.

With three such all-seeing eyes orbiting on criss-cross paths through space, military sources expressed belief they could keep the world under almost constant surveillance.

**Close Secret**

In view of the current tight security at the Pentagon no source can be given for the report. Nor was there any indication when such a project might be achieved.

Russia has already put a 180-pound satellite into the sky and the United States expects to push a lighter-weight one aloft in the not too distant future.

When asked if a satellite as large as 500 pounds could be equipped with an atomic or hydrogen warhead and called down at will, the informant replied, "If we can get the power to break it out of its orbit."

"When we jump," the informant said, "we want to make it a quantum leap jump." He added that the so-called "moon" did not exist, but was on the way.

**Name Chosen**

It is reported that the army is working on a project called "Big Brother" at the Redstone Arsenal at Huntsville, Ala.

"Big Brother" was the wartime codename for Lockheed's "Big Brother" surveillance system which all saw and dictated to all.

Aviation Week magazine reported Sunday that Lockheed Aircraft Corporation is working on a reconnaissance type satellite called the Pled Piper.

The magazine said the first, unnamed version would carry television equipment, infra-red "spotlights" or a radar scanner system.

Eight days ago one of France's top aviation experts, Gen. Pierre Gallois, reported that the United States was building a reconnaissance satellite—and he called the project "Big Brother."

In California, where Lockheed is headquartered, a company spokesman denied the reports. "There was no comment from the Pentagon."

# Non-Red Bloc Given Control For Republic

SAN MARINO, Oct. 15 (AP)—Thirty republic yesterday emerged from intense weeks and gave a welcome to the first non-communist government in 12 years.

Thousands cheered, church bells rang and banners flew in a merry confusion.

It was a "bright and glorious" day, said one anti-communist leader—as the victorious "white" provisional government moved from its headquarters in an abandoned steel mill into 15th century, castle-like surroundings.

The four-member regime drove the eight miles to San Marino village in a motorcade of some 50 automobiles and 500 motor scooters.

The communists had ruled San Marino since World War II. They had given western Europe its only red regime. They had armed volunteers in a vain bid to block the new government's attempt to take power after defections had reduced the red parliamentary majority to a minority.

# Radioactive Zone Still Is Restricted

LONDON, Oct. 15 (AP)—A 200-square-mile area between England's Lake district and the Irish sea was danger zone today from which milk could not be shipped because of radioactivity.

The atomic energy authority said the escape of radioactive iodine had "not fallen off" as rapidly as was anticipated after uranium exploded at the Windscale atomic station overhauled on Friday.

Radioactive iodine spilled out of the plant chimney and fell on grazing land.

The authority increased an original 14-square-mile danger area to include a total of 150 farms. Officials insist the situation is not serious, however.

SAO PAULO, Brazil, Oct. 15 (AP)—A strike by five unions, claiming a membership of 400,000, began at midnight today.

The strikers, demanding higher wages, include textile workers, steelworkers, printers, paper makers and tanners.

# Tito Is Ready To Recognize Red Germany

BONN, Germany, Oct. 15 (U-P)—Yugoslavia called the West's hand on the German unity issue yesterday. The foreign office announced President Tito's red regime plans to recognize communist East Germany today.

It was a slap in the face for the Bonn republic and a challenge to the solid front the western powers have built up outside the Soviet bloc against diplomatic ties with Premier Otto Grotewohl's Moscow-aided government.

Break Threshed

A formal break threatened in relations between Bonn and Bonn Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's West German government has declared it will cut diplomatic links with any nation exchanging envoys with the red rulers of the 18 million east German.

Adenauer's government, which recently granted a 300-million-dollar, 80-year loan to Yugoslavia, and agreed to pay 60 million dollars in war reparations, recognizes only the Soviet Union among nations having diplomatic ties with East Germany.

May Get Tough

No official comment was forthcoming, but West German political circles said Adenauer might adopt a tough policy. These sources did not exclude the possibility that Bonn might at least slow down financial aid to the east.

A British view came quickly from the foreign office. "We would very much regret Yugoslavia's recognition of the East German Democratic Republic administration, since it in no way represents the East German people."

# Possibility That Sputnik Is Spy Gets More Consideration

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15 (U-P)—Is sputnik a spy?

American scientists didn't think so at first. Now, some of them are not sure.

A pile of tape-recordings of the Russian satellite's coded messages are piling up in the U.S. naval research laboratory and other radio-monitoring stations.

So far they are "just a meaningless collection of squiggles on tape," said one official of Project Vanguard, the U.S. satellite program.

Speculation has ranged over the possibility that sputnik may be an eye-in-the-sky, recording coastlines and even islands and lakes below by means of photographic or infrared devices and radiating the information back to Moscow.

If so it could be a military tool of vast importance. If such methods produced a clear definition even of continental coastlines sputnik would give Russia a far more accurate map of the world than anyone now has. This could mean the difference between hitting and missing a U.S. target with a Russian intercontinental ballistic missile.

A spokesman for Project Vanguard said his scientists doubt sputnik contains instruments which could have any practical value in revealing maps of the world.

"This is only an anticipation, however. We don't know," he added.

"We do know that it is sending coded signals of some kind. We don't know what it is sending."

An official of the U.S. national committee for the International Geophysical year (IGY) said the possibility that sputnik is spying cannot be ruled out, but he said:

## Nobel Award Choice Comes As No Shock

UNITED NATIONS, Oct. 15 (AP)—It was pretty well known that the 1958 Nobel peace prize would go to someone who helped stop the fighting in Egypt last fall.

The only question was whether it would go to Lester P. Pearson, former foreign secretary of Canada, or to U. N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld. Both were key figures in the outstanding peace achievement of the past year.

Just why Pearson got the nod over Hammarskjöld for the \$40,725 award is known only to the Nobel committee in Oslo. But no one at the U. N. disputes the importance of the role "Mike" Pearson played during the critical days of early November.

Pearson, long an energetic and resourceful negotiator, was the father of the U. N. emergency force. And, what is not generally known, he worked tirelessly behind the scenes to get Britain, France and Israel to withdraw their forces from Egypt.

Perhaps the initiative of the Canadian diplomat in proposing the creation of UNEF, more than any other factor, pointed the way to the cease-fire and subsequent withdrawal. He forced it out during a night meeting of the general assembly last Nov. 3 and it was quickly endorsed by the Secretary of State Dulles and others.

Pearson worked closely with Hammarskjöld in drafting the UNEF plan. He was the first to offer to contribute troops for it and to look a leading part in working out the formula for deploying the forces in such a way as to win over Israel to pull out the last invading force.

In giving the award to Pearson, the committee may also have had in mind his many years as peace-maker. For example, he served on a U. N. cease-fire group which tried unsuccessfully to halt the Korean fighting in 1950.

It is interesting that Pearson gets the award at a time he is neither foreign secretary of his country nor a delegate to the U. N. assembly. He lost both jobs following last June's election upset.

The award may help him politically when Canadians hold their next election, perhaps next year. There is a good chance that he will become leader of his party before then. He would become prime minister if the Liberals win.

## Two Convicted Reds Released

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15 (AP)—The supreme court yesterday, with justice department content, reversed the convictions of two communist leaders, Claude M. Lightfoot of Chicago and Junius Irving Soles of Greenboro, N. C.

The court said it acted today "upon consideration of the entire record and the confession of error by the solicitor general."

The court's brief order reversing the convictions was based on its Jencks decision of last June requiring production of FBI reports under certain circumstances at criminal trials. The court ruled that if a government informer testifies, pertinent reports be made previously to the FBI must be produced on demand as a check on his veracity.

Such reports were withheld from the defense in the Soles and Lightfoot trials.

Congress enacted a new law following the court's ruling which provided that the trial judge may decide which parts of the FBI reports would benefit the defense.

## Planned U. N. Debate Given British Okay

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 15 (AP)—Britain announced yesterday it is ready to join the United States and other countries in immediate talks aimed at harnessing space missiles for peacetime uses.

British Minister of State Allan Noble told the U. N. 13-nation political committee there still is time to bring these devices under control despite "recent events."

Purpose Hinted  
Noble did not mention specifically the Soviet satellite, but he said these recent events "have still further underlined the importance of this matter."

He suggested that a technical group might be set up by the U. N. "to start work on this problem of controlling space objects." Technical studies, he said, would be needed before it can be determined what action is necessary.

Agree With Lodge  
The British delegate agreed with a proposal by U. S. Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge that multi-national discussions on missile control might be separated from the general disarmament negotiations and carried on independently.

The British government, he said, is "willing to take part in such a study on these terms."

China Raided  
TAIPEI, Oct. 15 (AP)—The defense ministry reported today that Chinese nationalist commandos carried out an intelligence patrol on the China mainland the night of Oct. 3 and killed a communist soldier and a police dog in a brief clash.

## Russians Asking Talks' Reopening

BERLIN, Germany, Oct. 15 (AP)—Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Vladimir Semenov has invited West Germany to reopen trade talks, government sources said today.

The invitation was addressed to Rolf Lahr, leader of the German delegation to Moscow which returned to Germany at the end of September. Talks between the two countries were broken off when Semenov rejected Lahr's demands for the return of Germans allegedly held prisoner in the Soviet Union.

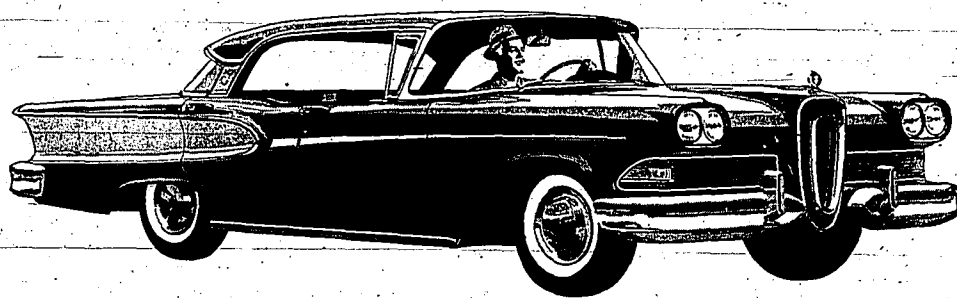
