VIENNA, Nov. 5—The Czechoslovak military has received its first Soviet TU-104 A-1 jet passenger plane for its international service, it was reported today.

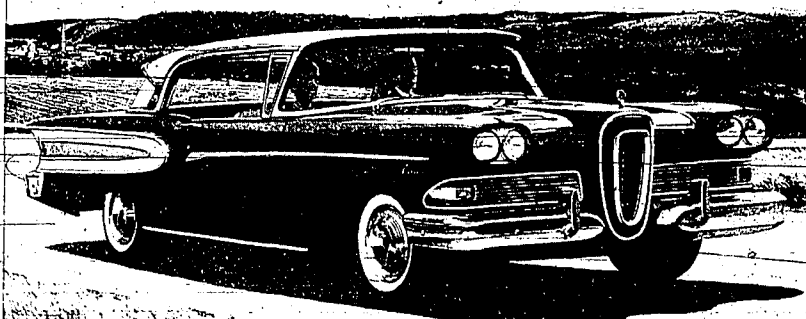

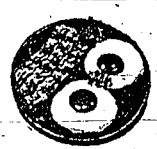

tain tolerate boredom and perform tasks better. Another approach is to put space crews into a virtual animation on long journeys and special drugs while automatic controls or signals from earth control the flight to Mars.

It seems certain that the first astronauts will be carefully hand-picked—maybe one in thousands on considerations of health, psychology, training and IQ.

Before they do, there are tremendously difficult practical problems to be solved. Can we design a hardware—the rocket, the engine, the control power, with sufficient and safe controls?

It could cost eight millions or ten millions of dollars—and the dollars are coming from taxpayers. Some experts are saying that it will require the concentration of scientific talent and materials toward space stations and space rockets can hurt defense and economy. Some urge it as the next big step toward a different frontier, worth the effort.

To all of them, space beckons to know, human curiosity wants to know.
