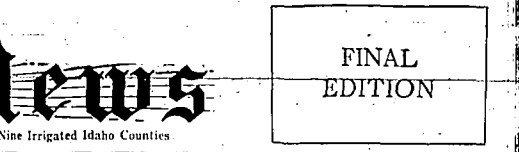

## Inflation Said Not Inevitable In Bank Talk

CHICAGO, Nov. 25 (AP)—A federal banking official warned today that inflation is not inevitable and that the economy is a permanent part of the economy.

James L. Robertson, member of the board of governors of the Federal Reserve system, said that inflation is neither desirable nor inevitable.

"If we should support inflationary developments at any planned rate—increasing, holding, or decreasing—the fact would soon become evident to everyone," he said. "At once this would affect all economic calculations."

Robertson told the 43rd annual convention of the United States Savings and Loan League that the expectation of a continued rise in prices would probably set off a boom that could result in another severe depression.

"The popular duty," he said, "is to be realistic in a 'boom' climate, to expect people to exercise self-restraint sufficiently to control the inflationary bias." That is why the central bank and its monetary policy must perform, in boom times, a most important—and most unpopular duty.

In another talk, Norman Strunk presided plans by Indiana university to study the expected "population revolution" in 1960.

Strunk, the executive vice president of the league, said the study will consider housing needs, personal incomes, home financing requirements and changes in government housing programs.

## U. S. Midwest Is Struck by Cold Weather

By United Press  
A cold Canadian air mass over- spread the nation's mid-section today, touching off rain and hail storms in the South and a heavy snowstorm in a seven-county area of New York.

Readers plunged well below freezing overnight in the cold air across the Great Lakes, the middle Mississippi valley and the Ohio valley.

To the south, rain, drizzle and fog, prevailed during the night from Arkansas and Louisiana east through the Carolinas and Florida. Hail and sleet pelted parts of Alabama, with hailstones the size of golf balls causing some damage at Cullman in northwestern Alabama.

A severe snowstorm dumped 4 to 13 inches in west Texas, stranding about 200 motorists yesterday on Highway 190 between the mountains before the blizzard. Authorities at San Angelo said the sudden storm was one of the worst they could remember.

Heavy furies were reported across northern Michigan during the night and in parts of the upper Michigan peninsula.

Temperatures from the plains toward ranged in the 30s and 40s, except for Florida where a few 70s were noted during the night.

Washington predicted occasional rain continuing today in the South-east, and partly cloudy skies with some flurries in sections of the Great Lakes and the New England states. A few showers also were expected over the Pacific Northwest.

Elsewhere, mostly fair weather is forecast with some warming in the upper Mississippi valley.

## Savants Told Work Is Vital By 'Ike' Note

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25 (AP)—President Eisenhower told 200 scientists today their work would serve as a model for "practical and productive cooperation" throughout the "whole NATO community."

Eisenhower sent a special message of greetings to the NATO advisory group for aeronautical research and development (AGARD) meeting here.

Work Important  
"Your organization is engaged in a work which becomes more important with each passing year, the safeguarding of peace and security," the President said in a message read to the group.

"Moreover, it serves as a model for cooperation for the benefit of the whole NATO community," he added.

Opening remarks by the President emphasized the need for the 15 NATO countries to speed up scientific research and development, more closely in the face of recently revealed Russian progress in missiles and satellites.

Data Exchange Key  
Deputy Defense Secretary Donald A. Quarles told the group that NATO now must "examine our security requirements" to see whether there can be greater exchange of information, while still safeguarding secrets.

## Firemen Told Guard in Area Of Coastal Fire

LAJOLLA, Calif., Nov. 25 (AP)—Nearly 1,000 firefighters showed up today to prevent any new outbreak in a five-day fire that blackened 25,000 acres of brush and timber about 20 miles northeast of downtown Los Angeles.

About 400 smoke-primed men were released from the 40-mile perimeter of the blaze last night, but authorities warned that there were "hot spots" to be watched.

Winds which had driven flames across thousands of acres of flammable brush—causing damage to about 25 million dollars—had died.

Firefighters were hopeful that the fire would soon be completely under control.

Four prisoners from the California Institution for men at Chino "French" leave from fire-fighting duties and escaped. One was captured last night near Covina, Calif., and others still were looking for three others.

The fire at one point came within five miles of the city of Monrovia. Aerial tankers, carrying 500-pound bombs of water and borax, dropped their fire-killing loads on hot spots yesterday and were standing by today in case the blaze should break away on a new whirling run.

The fire started Thursday when a power line used the interior slope of a prison camp and sent flames racing across the rugged badland country.

During the height of the inferno, the fire threatened the Mt. Wilson observatory and television transmitting station on the peak. It marched within a few miles of several foothill communities, forcing evacuation of some homes.

## Cheyenne Not Excited Over Missiles Setup

CHEYENNE, Wyo., Nov. 23 (AP)—This about 100 up cavalry base of cowboy and Indian days becomes an international ballistic missile center next year.

But the latest chapter in the history of the military post, which caused no more excitement than when it became Francis E. Warren air force base a few years ago.

The historic cavalry post, established in 1887, began its colorful life guarding a construction camp for the Union Pacific railroad.

Warren had a fabulous career himself. He won the congressional medal of honor in the Civil war at the age of 17. He came west as a young man to enter the ranching business.

Most military outposts set up to fight Indians were abandoned after the West was won. But Ft. Warren managed to survive, and once was the largest military reservation in the country.

Gen. John J. Pershing was once stationed there, and eventually married Warren's daughter.

During World War I, Warren still was one of the largest bases in the country, and in World War II it served as a quartermaster replacement center and a prisoner of war camp.

Since the second world war, the base has been an air force training center. There currently are about 8,000 men stationed there.

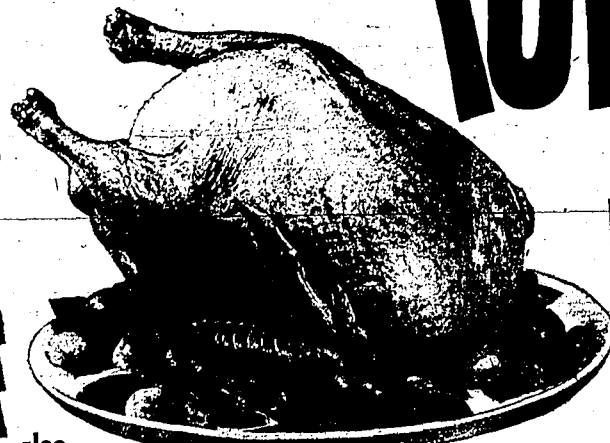

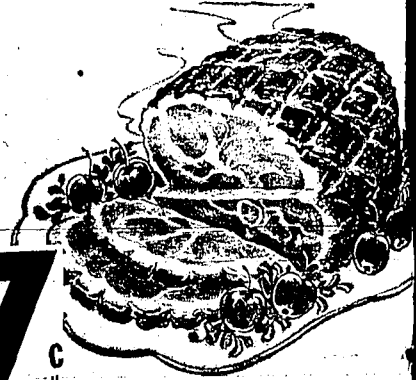

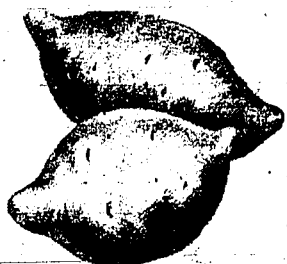

Weather men, being, give you the U. S. weather bureau's long-range forecast from now until mid-December. It is not a specific forecast in the usual sense, but a estimate of average temperatures and precipitation for the period.

**Vending Industry Maps Plans To Make Lunchbox Obsolete**

NEW YORK, Nov. 25 (AP)—The fast-growing vending industry has even bigger plans on the drawing boards today.

A machine that brews coffee inside its vacuum can and dispenses a cup made by what the manufacturer calls home methods has just been shown the trade.

Engineers are working on a single machine which will serve a full meal, bringing the food from freezing storage temperature to eating temperature in less than a minute. They say this one-to serve hot food on a plastic tray along with cold salads and desserts—may be in use in three years away. Cooking speed is the chief unmet problem.

Batteries of food vending machines alongside gasoline pumps at the service station, as well as machines selling groceries in parking lots, are in the pilot stage.

So is a machine that can take a \$1 bill and make change—rejecting counterfeit. The Vendo company of Kansas City is trying to develop one that can distinguish between \$1, \$2 and \$5 denominations.

Industry spokesmen say vending sales have risen to about two billion dollars this year from 10 million dollars in 1925. Today there are an estimated three million machines in use, tended by 4,500 operators.

Vending machines in factories, the enthusiasts say, will make the lunch box and plant cafeteria obsolete. The National Automatic Merchandising association says one out of every five manufacturing plants are using them today.

The association names as examples of plants changing over to machines for in-plant feeding: The Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph, Denver; The Kansas City Power and Light, and the RCA Victor TV division plant in Bloomington, Ind.

An automatic cafeteria of the North Electric company in Gallow, O., uses 10 vending machines to serve 33 selections of food and beverages.

Two pairs of metal tongs pick up a tin of coffee, perforating either side. Through one set of tongs, hot water is injected into the can. The brewed coffee is drained off through the other tongs and into a heated reservoir. The can with the used grounds is disposed of automatically.

When the brew supply gets low, the process is repeated. The company says any uncollected coffee after three hours is automatically drained off.

Tackling the bill changing problem, engineers first used a device involving photographing the preferred bill to determine its denomination. The government said nothing doing. Now the Vendo people are working on a machine that fluoresces bills for their authentic content, which its says varies from denomination to denomination.

## German, U. S. OK's Given in Politics Talks

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—Overman Foreign Minister Heinrich Von Brentano and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles have agreed on the urgent need for regular political consultations inside the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) meeting in Paris next month. The U. S. German discussions centered on finding ways and means for achieving closer political cooperation among NATO allies.

Although it was not spelled out specifically, Von Brentano's concerns stemmed from the Turkish armistice crisis that erupted last week when the United States and Britain sent arms to Tunisia over violent French demonstrations.

Von Brentano believes the United States shares the German view that NATO's principal problems are political rather than military, informed sources reported. He is said to have pointed out that NATO's military situation has remained unchanged since the 1948 communist coup in Czechoslovakia.

The German foreign minister told reporters the controversial U. S. decision to station missile units in the European continent was not discussed. But some sources said the legal questions involved in such a step were touched on.

Von Brentano and Dulles said they were well satisfied with the outcome of the talks. "The German foreign minister said the discussions had helped strengthen the bonds of confidence and understanding between the two nations. He added he was 'deeply satisfied'."

Dulles told reporters at the airport where he had gone to see Von Brentano off that "We found ourselves in second on major policy questions."

The Germans reportedly are more concerned with establishing a common political basis in the alliance that could serve for the eventual emergence of a common NATO foreign policy than in creating a new organization inside NATO to deal with the problem. Chancellor Konrad Adenauer long has plagued such a policy.

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 25.—George L. Escobar, 27-year-old Sun Valley ski instructor, was recovering in a Salt Lake City hospital today after his auto plunged off an icy road in Little Cottonwood canyon southeast of here yesterday.

A companion riding with Escobar, Maria Morris, 21, Salt Lake City, was located for hours and released to her home. Escobar was in "fair" condition.

"Escobar told sheriff's deputies he shifted into second gear on a curve but was unable to halt the car before it jumped over a 25-foot embankment and rolled 75 feet. The auto landed upside down among snow-covered rocks and underbrush."

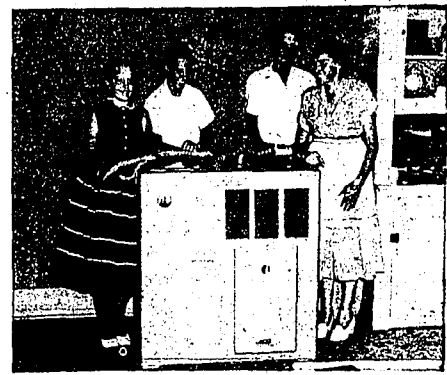

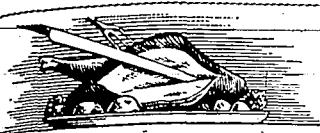

(Enough for a 12- to 15-pound turkey) 1

- 1 large box for 3 small boxes Minute Rice
- 5 cups water, boiling
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper

# Benson Move Seen Possible By December

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—Farm leaders here believe there is a possibility of a move in the secretaryship of agriculture, it will be made possible by Dec. 1.

There have been reports that the administration is considering transferring Ezra T. Benson, Salt Lake City, in the post because of sharp criticism of him by agricultural leaders in and out of Congress, including many Republicans.

CHICAGO, Nov. 22.—The toll of deaths from the epidemic of influenza and its complications continued to reach the 1,300 mark today in the case of an epidemic in Colorado.

A United Press account showed at least 1,250 deaths had been reported in the state since the epidemic broke out in the latter part of the summer.

The largest losses were in Colorado, where health department officials reported that their estimates of 10 deaths in 200 other states with 188 deaths in Pennsylvania and 188 deaths in Ohio, 183 in California and 183 in Louisiana and Minnesota 47 each.

# 'Diamonds King' Passes at Age 77

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, Nov. 22.—Ernest Oppenheimer, king of diamonds and one of the world's wealthiest mining figures, died today at his home in Johannesburg, it was announced today.

He was 77.

Ernest was chairman of the Anglo-American Corporation of South Africa and the De Beers. He also was president or founder of some 80 mining enterprises in South Africa, comprising the world's biggest mining group.
