U. S. Reacting To Complaint On Bomb Use

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2 (AP)—U. S. officials reacted Saturday to British outcries over American planes "assumed" to be carrying live H-bombs on guard missions over Europe.

It was learned both state department and military officials were consulting with the problem of issuing assurances that H-bombs in planes present no hazard to allied civilians—and at the same time not reveal military secrets.

But one of the secrets is what strategic air command bombers actually have a bomb load.

It is understood that they do carry H-bombs on training missions over allied nations, ready for instant use in case of an attack. But, although they have hinted very clearly that this is so, U. S. military officials have never come out and said it in so many words.

The outcry came in Britain after British Foreign Secretary Aneurin Bevan said Wednesday the "assumed" SAC planes were operating around English cities.

Military officials have stressed that to become a potential explosive the H-bomb must first be armed. This would be done in flight toward an objective in case of war, they said.

If it is not armed, the bomb could even go through a plane crash without exploding, experts claim.

Since Russia put two Sputniks in the air, exposing its missile threat, President Eisenhower said U. S. military officials have emphasized the instant retaliatory ability of SAC with devastating nuclear weapons.

SAC commander Gen. Thomas E. Power said in Paris Nov. 12 that one-third of SAC's estimated 2,000 bombers are on the runways loaded with bombs and ready to go. He said a certain number are always in the air and implied they carried H-bombs.

Book Deals With A-Power Aircraft

MOSCOW, Dec. 2 (AP)—The Soviet ministry of defense has published a book on atom-powered aircraft, but it makes no claim Russia is ahead in this field.

The book, "Application of Atomic Motors in Aviation," explains principles and problems connected with design and construction of atom-powered planes, both in the Soviet Union and abroad. The book says the majority of foreign scientists forecast the first flight of an atom-powered plane in 1950-1960. It makes no prediction of its own.

"Large One Gets Away" for Lucky Ocean Swordfish

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Dec. 2 (AP)—A fisherman who was speared overboard by a swordfish and then speared by the big sea creature was hospitalized here Saturday after a 100-mile flight up the coast from Baja California.

A doctor at the U. S. naval hospital said 47-year-old Miguel F. Pereira was in satisfactory condition.

Pereira was fishing from the lower racks of the tuna clipper Sun Glow Friday when the fish struck his bait. The coast guard said the fish broke loose after pulling Pereira into the water, then speared him clear through and swam away.

Pereira was brought here in a coast guard rescue plane piloted by Cmdr. John M. Walters.

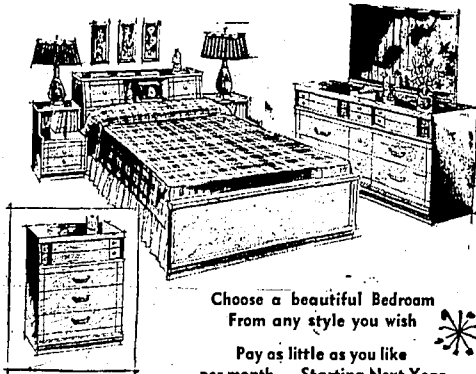

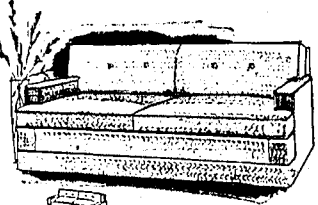

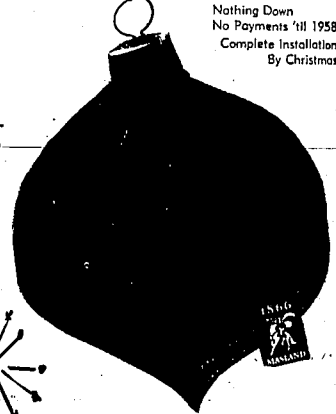

Missile Setups Are Prepared By Air Force

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2 (AP)—The air force is getting ready to build the first of a probable chain of missile antiaircraft missile launching sites which eventually may ring the country with a long-range defense against jet bomber and conventional guided missile attack.

At the same time, planners are working on another, even more perplexing aspect of defense: The approaching problem of refueling the distant and overseas radar warning systems to detect hypersonic ballistic missiles within minutes of their launching from Soviet bases thousands of miles away.

Such a long-range, instant-reaction detection system is prerequisite to the use of any anti-missile missile system.

The air force has just been authorized by the defense department that it was learned Saturday, to acquire land for the first Bomarc missile launching site. Official announcement of the approximate location may be made shortly.

Air defense experts of the air force are understood to believe that a complete chain could be created with construction of about 15 such sites. This would compare with more than 30 launching sites now in the army's Nike antiaircraft missile system for close-in defense of cities along the northern and southern Atlantic and Pacific coasts.

The Bomarc, produced for the air force by Boeing Airplane Company, is an "area" defense missile, with a present range of about 100 miles and a speed of about 4,000 miles per hour.

Its guidance system includes a "home" device enabling it to alter itself in final destructive contact range of an enemy object after it has been guided into the general proximity. Its warhead can be either nuclear or conventional explosive.

President Eisenhower, in his first national security address earlier this month, said a Bomarc, used in a test against a plane far off to sea, actually met its head-on—however, nuclear explosion does not even require this physical contact for destruction of targets.

Compared with the Bomarc's 100-mile range is the newer Nike. Those who created the Bomarc say it is not intended as the ultimate weapon for use against ballistic and guided missiles and manned bombers. Like the Nike, it is to provide defense during the time when long range jet bombers and missiles something like the 5,000-mile, cruising missile Shrike come within the primary missile of nuclear weapon delivery.

No Bomarc or Nike could work against a ballistic missile which flies at a speed of up to 15,000 miles per hour and in a trajectory as high as 600 or 700 miles.

Philippine, Japan Parley Scheduled
MANILA, Dec. 3 (AP)—President Carlos P. Garcia said today he and Japanese Prime Minister Nobusuke Kishi will discuss points of conflict between their countries during a two-day visit by Kishi Dec. 6-7.

Garcia said he also will take up "with an open mind" the subject of Japan's Asian development fund. The fund is planned to be financed by the United States, Japan and other countries to provide loans and other forms of assistance to underdeveloped countries in Asia.

What This Near-Sighted Dog Needed Was Seeing-Eye Man

CHICAGO, Dec. 2 (AP)—Apache, a black and white pointer, was a near-sighted dog, that is, he was "somewhat of a chump." And for a dog, that's a pretty good trick.

Until he was fitted with spectacles, Apache, a black and white pointer, was something of a problem to Ralph Davis and his wife, Sue, of suburban Glenview.

"He was having trouble seeing things," Davis said. "He bumped into furniture and he didn't read well to command."

Matter of fact, he couldn't even chase cats.

The instructors at New Trier high school noticed Apache's trouble. (Apache is enrolled in New Trier's high school for dogs.)

The dog instructors told Davis that Apache must be myopic. So Davis took the pooch to a regular eye doctor. Of course, Apache couldn't read the chart. At 11 months, he hasn't learned to read.

But this didn't stump the doctor. He checked Apache's vision by "refractive refraction," which means looking into the patient's eye to judge the response to different lenses.

This is the method used on people, and dogs' eyes are quite similar. It just so happens that Davis works for the House of Vinton, an optical firm. So he took the doctor's prescription to the shop and had the lenses ground.

New Zealand Labor Group Takes Ballot

WELLINGTON, New Zealand, Dec. 2 (AP)—Laborers edged the Conservatives in parliamentary elections Saturday on the basis of unofficial returns. The Socialists this will return to power after an absence of eight years.

Prime Minister-elect Walter Nash, 74, head of the labor party, presided in a nationwide broadcast to work for peace in the world. Nash was deputy prime minister in the old Labor government.

Laborites Get 41 Seats
Unofficial returns gave the Labor party 41 seats in the 55-member National party. One seat will be decided by a special election in January.

Labor will have only a slim working majority. The January election in a National party stronghold, and thus the Labor majority may be cut to ten.

While the vote swung two Conservative ministers from parliament. Prime Minister Keith Holyoake, head of the National party, retained his seat by a majority of 3,224 votes.

Hill Tax Issue
The Laborites struck hard at the tax issue and rolled up votes in the cities and the larger towns.

They promised a rebate of 100 (\$200) to each taxpayer on income tax due in February. The government had provided for a rebate of 25 per cent of taxes up to a maximum of 75 pounds (\$1200).

The National party, as usual, stressed in the rural areas. The final unofficial count gave Labor 508,081 votes, the National party 438,601, the Social Credit party 75,125 and the communists 5,000. Labor votes remain to be counted but they were not expected to affect the results.

Two "Casualties"
The two major national party casualties were Eric Hobbard, minister of industries and commerce, and John Har, minister of housing. Hobbard has been prime minister since Sept. 26. He took over when Prime Minister Sidney Holland resigned the health post. Hobbard is 53, Holland 64.

Nash indicated to reporters he did not intend to replace Sir Leslie Munn, minister to Washington who also is president of the U. N. general assembly.

Crucial Meeting of AFL-CIO Slated To Open Thursday at Atlantic City

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Dec. 2 (AP)—The AFL-CIO merged two years ago in a solution of a normal union of delegates to the 1957 annual convention at Atlantic City. The CIO the organizational convention also was held here this week, a crucial meeting for the two unions.

Some building leaders also will be present. The AFL-CIO executive committee will meet Thursday.

Corruption in a few unions and disputes among many were the issues which were tackled by the AFL-CIO leaders. Many are ready to quit if the delegates refuse his demand to end the 1960-61 merger.

The AFL-CIO Vice President James H. Carey predicted in a television interview yesterday that the convention will vote "almost unanimously" to expel the Teamsters. But he said the convention also must make provision for Teamsters' local and rank-and-file members who wish to shake off corrupt leaders and remain in the AFL-CIO. He said he "very definitely" expects to move within the Teamsters to end the present leadership charged with corruption.

The disputes, which also could result in further depletion of the organization's membership, include jurisdictional squabbles between craft unions affiliated with the old AFL, and industrial unions which had been under the CIO, and the failure to state CIO and AFL organizations in 17 states and numerous important city groups to merge voluntarily during the two-year period of grace.

The state and local organizations which have failed to reach agreement on merger will not be represented at the convention which will formally unite them. It was reported as possible that some state and local leaders might try to secede rather than submit to the national group's merger decrees.

The jurisdictional dispute between the craft and industrial wings is expected to provide an early test of Meany's leadership at the convention of the building trades department opening today and running through Wednesday.

Several powerful union leaders in the building trades were reported ready to threaten a walk-out of the convention.

Airplane Safe After Flaming Polar Landing

LITTLE AMERICA, Antarctica, Dec. 2 (AP)—A navy Super Ditch transport plane carrying three men, George J. Dufek, scientist, and two others, crashed-landed on fire late Friday night after a flight here from McMurdo sound.

All aboard escaped injury as the plane alighted on a cushion of snow. The trouble began when a sail on the starboard side slipped forward as the transport approached for a landing.

As the two-engine plane bounced roughly in the air, Cmdr. Vernon Colley, Oakland, Calif., the pilot, and Cmdr. Edward Frankfurter, Oakland, Va., co-pilot, threw the plane on the starboard motor in an effort to restore the balance.

The motor blew three cylinders and caught fire from leaking gasoline.

The plane struck soft snow about two feet deep, skidded at a slant across the runway and stopped with the tip of the starboard wing buried in snow and the port wing high in the air.

The crew leaped from the plane immediately with extinguishers and began to put out the blaze. A station crash wagon arrived in time to complete the job.

Meteor Reported Seen in Montana Sunday Morning

HELENA, Mont., Dec. 2 (AP)—An eerie object described by one observer as "like a soccer on fire" lit the night sky over northeast Montana early yesterday.

Although the air force and weather bureau had no official comment on the reported sighting, indications were that it was a meteor.

The greenish-white object was tracked by many residents at about 12:48 a.m. Most described it as shaped like a teardrop and moving rapidly in a northerly direction. It was visible for about three seconds.

Location of Atom Device Undecided

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2 (AP)—Senator Wiley, R., Wis., said today the atomic energy commission has not made a final decision on location of a proposed Lillio-volta equivalent super atom smasher.

Wiley said he checked with the AEC on reports that it has decided that the huge accelerator, if built, should be near the Argonne national laboratory at Chicago instead of at Stoughton, Wis., and a spokesman said this was not correct.

The site at Stoughton, near Madison, is favored by members of the Middlewestern University Research association, which has been working with the University of Wisconsin scientists on operation of a new model atom smasher.

Rights Stayed By Fraternity Unit at Meets

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., Dec. 2—The National Interfraternity conference Friday gave unanimous approval to a report which declares college fraternities have "fundamental American right" to choose members according to their own standards.

The report was made by a special autonomy committee. It defines selective membership practice of fraternities.

The report said that "choosing of one's own friends and associates is a social right which cannot be confused with civil rights."

Sixty-one national and international fraternities, acting through delegates to the annual conference, have authorized the executive committee to carry out the report's recommendations.

The interfraternity unit of the executive committee to:

1. Circulate the report to fraternity chapters and local associations.
2. Encourage fraternities representative to contact college officials and urge them to support the report.
3. Urge that "each college fraternity is a social organization, with its own standards, and should be free to choose its own members."

It was charged in the report that the effort to force college fraternities to remove restrictive racial and religious clauses is "an attempt to reduce college fraternities to a position of impotence, if not to eliminate them entirely."

The report added there is presently agitation in more than 50 colleges against the clause.

J. Edward Murphy, conference treasurer, described the restrictive clauses as examples of "the good old American right to select our friends."

At Houston, T. Karpis, professor of mathematics at Louisiana State university, was elected chairman.

He succeeded Francis B. Van Derburg of Denver, father of the 1938 "I Am a Communist" Motion Picture.

Gov. Milward L. Simpson of Wyoming told the delegates he was "not a federal aid to anyone who says 'nobody wants Uncle Sam sitting on the local school board.'"
