Ike's Plan on Succession Is Said to Come Short of Goal

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9 (AP)—President Eisenhower's plan for deciding how a vice president would take over if the president is disabled would solve nothing if Eisenhower is disabled before his term ends.

Eisenhower's plan—offered earlier this year—after two of his illnesses but before his third—in the form of a constitutional amendment. It would take years to complete approval by congress and ratification by at least 36 states. Eisenhower's plan would end in a little more than three years.

But Eisenhower's plan is only one of a number of proposed solutions on presidential disability facing congress when it returns in January.

On this subject, everyone seems to have his own idea, with no two ideas alike.

Here are some of them: Let the vice president decide. Let the cabinet do it. Let it be done by congress or a mixed commission, including supreme court justices, or a commission of private citizens or medical experts.

Some proposals call for constitutional amendments, some for a simple act approved by both houses of congress.

Any answer for handling a complete Eisenhower disability before 1961 would have to be in the form of an act.

In the past congress has considered many proposals and done nothing with them. It may do nothing again this year although the scars from Eisenhower's third illness in 28 months is plain evidence congress has been ducking the issue.

The Constitution has been fuzzy on this point from the beginning. It simply says that if a president retires or can't carry out his duties, the vice president shall take over.

It would be no problem if a disabled president resigned. Nor would there appear to be any if a president, unwilling to resign, recognized his disability and told the vice president to take over until he recovered. But these are the unanswered questions.

Who decides if a president is unable to do his job but won't let the vice president step in? And what

happens if the chosen president to function?

Representative Keating of New York, senior Republican member of the house judiciary committee, wants action on his own proposal that Eisenhower be named as president. But Eisenhower's plan would solve nothing if Eisenhower is disabled before his term ends.

Keating suggests a simple constitutional act creating a 10-member presidential disability committee. The committee would be composed of members of congress, the judiciary and the cabinet—with the vice president as its chairman.

The vice president would make the decision—provided a majority of the cabinet approves—and act as president until the president recovered.

Former President Hoover thinks the cabinet should make the decision. His reasoning is that if the executive branch was in the hands of one party and a majority of the opposition party controlled congress—and congress could decide on disability—the opposition would be in a position to utilize the previous election results by ruling out the

U.S. Approves Food Cargoes To Yugoslavia

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9 (AP)—The United States expects to continue shipping substantial quantities of food and other commodities to Yugoslavia, government officials said today.

They made the forecast in the wake of reports from Yugoslavia that Marshal Tito may turn to Russia and other countries including the United States for military aid to replace the U. S. arms shipments.

The U. S. has decided to do without American funds because of the "resistance" of its policy on arms to communist nations. The sources said.

Tito has informed U. S. Ambassador James R. Duggan of his decision to cancel future U. S. military aid.

The United States hasn't agreed on a final dollar figure for the current Yugoslav program for the current fiscal year and no shipments have been ordered yet.

Officials said, however, the total aid is certain to fall significantly below the \$11 million dollars in all forms of economic aid supplied to Yugoslavia during the fiscal year ended last June 30.

A good Yugoslav crop harvest was said to have reduced need for food which has been accounted for almost all of the aid.

'57 Cotton Crop Estimates Given

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9 (AP)—The agriculture department estimated today that the '57 cotton crop today at 11,010,000 bales.

It is down 778,000 bales, or about 45 percent, from the November estimate.

The final report this year compares the 1955 production of 13,210,000 bales and 10-year average production of 13,660,000 bales.

Enrollments Set College Record

CINCINNATI, O., Dec. 9 (AP)—College enrollment hit an all-time peak of more than two million students this past fall, the School and Society Educational Journal reported today.

The Journal said there were 1,732,000 full-time students and a grand total of 2,312,214, or more than 1,000 campuses. Enrollment was up 21 percent in full-time students and 4 percent in part-time students.

The number of women attending college full-time showed the biggest jump, 55 percent compared to a rise of 15 percent for males. There were 1,081,694 men and 640,711 women attending full-time.

The Journal pointed out that the United States turned out 28,833 engineers from 131 accredited colleges last year while Russia graduated 11,000 from 120 institutions.

Pastor Named

KEARNS, Utah, Dec. 9 (AP)—Clergymen from Salt Lake City and Ogden commissioned an Idaho Falls minister yesterday as pastor of the Salt Lake county community's 81st Presbyterian church.

The Rev. Carl E. Samuelson was the man they picked to preside in the church which is not yet built here. He has been a pastor in Idaho Falls since 1951 and is a former minister to students at Oregon State College.

Second Asia Flu Wave Reported

MONTREAL, Dec. 9 (AP)—A second wave of Asian flu, which seems to have started already in Japan, may hit North America by the end of the year, a U. S. scientist warned.

Victor J. Colombo, of the research division of the American Cyanamid company, told a gathering of doctors here Saturday that those persons who have already had the Asian flu would probably be immune to the second wave absolutely, but more deadly than the first.

He noted that about 600,000 cases and 900 deaths had been unofficially reported in Japan during recent weeks. This compares with 1,500,000 cases resulting in 500 deaths in the United States since the virus first became active.

23 Die as Flood Hits Bus in East

ANNAM, Dec. 9 (AP)—Floods caught a loaded bus near Nhatrang yesterday and swept it 300 yards down a valley, it was reported here today.

A least 22 persons were reported drowned and another 11 were missing. Eleven of the passengers were police. The police reported that the bus was traveling from Nhatrang to Kien Giang near the Israeli-Jordanian demarcation line.

Several of the bodies may have been washed into Israeli territory, the police report said. Maj. Rashid Arafat, senior Jordanian member of the mixed armistice commission, requested Israeli authorities to search for the 11 missing passengers.

Doctor Claims Russia Eying Birth Control

NEW YORK, Dec. 9 (AP)—An American eugenics expert on a recent trip to the Soviet Union found health officials interested in birth control.

The specialist, Dr. Abraham Stone, vice president of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America, points out this represents a change in attitude.

For 20 years, 1935-1955, the Soviet government encouraged rapid population growth and frowned on birth control.

Dr. Stone explains the new interest to results of a 1955 law legalizing abortion after ten decades during which such operations were outlawed.

"The Russians are now increasingly interested in contraception as a means of controlling or fixing abortion—not just the point of view of population control," he said.

Dr. Stone spent three weeks in October in the USSR. He talked to high-ranking medical officials in Moscow and Kiev. He was invited by the Soviet health ministry to lecture at a conference of gynecologists and deliver a report on recent developments in contraceptive methods.

Injuries Fatal to Victim of Wreck

SALT LAKE CITY, Dec. 9 (AP)—Harold Greer, 43, Salt Lake City, died yesterday of injuries received when a car hit him last Friday night.

No citations were issued against the driver, identified by police as Gary J. Bauer, 22, St. Anthony.

The accident occurred on busy South State street, about a block from Greer's home.

His death raised Utah's 1957 traffic toll to 195—six below the figure for the date last year.

Parachutist Given "Blackout" Blame

TACOMA, Wash., Dec. 9 (AP)—A 19-year-old parachutist made a practice jump late yesterday and landed on a 110,000-volt transmission line. At the moment he hit the wire this city of more than 143,000 was cut off.

Officials at Tacoma City Light decline to say officially that the blackout which lasted for nearly two hours was due to parachutist Ronald Heron, Tacoma, but they were unable to give any other cause for the blackout.

Heron was rescued unharmed by firemen.
