## Solon Asserts U. S. Calls for Missile Speed

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11 (AP)—Senator Richard M. Russell, R.-Ga., said Tuesday the American people are "demanding" that this country force ahead in the missile field, no matter what it may cost.

And, he added, in his judgment Congress is ready to vote defense money "on any reasonable consideration and justified basis."

The senator spoke in an interview as a member of the staff of the Senate prepared for the reopening of hearings Friday into the nation's missile-satellite programs.

Questioned on Vanguard defense officials will be questioned on the failure last Friday of the Vanguard rocket, a 72-foot device with which the navy attempted to put the first U. S. earth-orbiting satellite into orbit. The rocket rose a few feet off the ground, then fell back and exploded.

Late yesterday, the office of naval research—which has jurisdiction over Vanguard—reported it had determined the exact cause of the rocket's failure at the Cape Canaveral Fla. test area.

**Mechanical Failure**  
The failure "was caused by a mechanical failure in the propulsion system, details of which are classified," the navy said.

The failure of the Vanguard rocket stirred a broadside of comments in various quarters, including new congressional demands for acceleration of the satellite and missile programs. Pressure for a speedup has been building since Oct. 4 when Russia launched its first satellite.

The chief assistant to President Eisenhower, Sherman Adams, said yesterday, however, that the Vanguard failure was not as serious as some people think.

**"Need Better Luck"**  
"I can't throw much light on the subject," he said in a news conference in St. Louis. "But we'll have it straightened out before long. What we want is action and better luck next time."

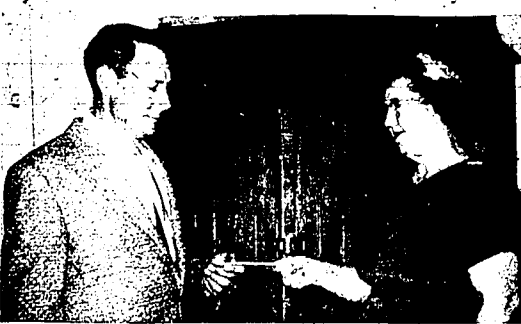

## U. S. Agency Said Backing School Plans

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11 (AP)—An education aid secretary of the U. S. Agency for International Development said today that the federal government is supporting a proposal that 25 million dollars a year be used to aid education.

Heavy emphasis would be placed on science and high schools. The plan would provide for some 20,000 scholarships a year, financed by the federal government but administered by the states.

G. Kerry Smith, executive secretary of the Association of Higher Education, is one of several education leaders who are in the office of education officials to work out the plan, which would run for four or five years.

The AHE is a department of the National Education Association.

In an article for the Dec. 10 issue of AHE's college and university bulletin, Smith wrote that the program "designed to help meet the challenge of Soviet scientific advances, is being prepared by the U. S. office of education and supported by Secretary Folson."

From other sources it was learned that current official thinking is that the new program would take priority over Eisenhower's school construction bill, which has been referred by congress.

The 25 million dollar figure attached to the new program compares with all million dollars requested by the administration for the first year of the proposed school construction program.

Subject to change, Smith said the new program is subject to change but, as it stands now, it calls for:

1. Allocating 150 million dollars a year to raise the salaries of elementary and secondary school science and mathematics teachers and to provide laboratory equipment.

2. A total of 20 million dollars to uncover high school students with special talents in science and math and to seek to guide them into these critical fields, providing some 20,000 scholarships a year for such students.

3. One hundred million dollars a year to expand and improve building and equipment at two-year technical institutes and at colleges and universities.

4. Twelve million dollars to expand the program of university graduate study already supported by some government agencies, such as the atomic energy commission and the national science foundation.

5. Five million dollars to support foreign language instruction centers at universities and to provide language fellowships.

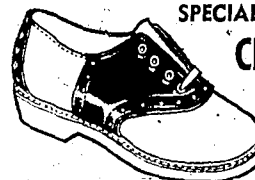

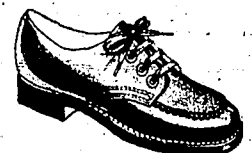

## 2 Solons Flay Benson's Plan For Cropland

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11 (AP)—A Democrat and a Republican today lambasted Agriculture Secretary Ezra Tamm Benson's plan to put entire farms into areas and leave them "fallow" as a "lazy man's program" and "out."

Rep. Thomas G. Abernethy, D., Minn., said he thought not many "genuine farmers" would go for the scheme. "It would end their days of farming."

However, Abernethy said removing entire farms from production probably would contribute more to the solution of all agriculture problems than individual crop acreage controls.

Rep. Walter L. Burdick, R., N. D., said it was the "cruelest thing" Benson had done since he took office. "I can't think of anything more nuts than that. It's no answer to the farm problem at all."

Benson announced the trial plan at a news conference yesterday. He said farmers in four states—Illinois, Maine, Nebraska, and Tennessee—will have an opportunity to set the dollars-per-acre rate they are willing to accept through competitive bidding—for putting all their eligible cropland into the soil banks' conservation reserve for a period of five to 10 years.

This is a complete switch in procedure as to who makes the offer of farm aid. The regular procedure is for the county agricultural stabilization and conservation committees to make offers to farmers for taking part or all of their cropland out of production and putting it into the conservation reserve.

The trial plan offers farmers an opportunity to say to the county AEC committee: "I am willing to take all my cropland out of production for X dollars an acre for five to 10 years. Will you accept my bid?"

## Autos' Fumes Are Unsolved Smog Worry

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 11 (AP)—Zoning of automobile exhaust fumes as a contributor to air pollution is the only big unsolved problem remaining in Los Angeles' battle against smog.

This conclusion was drawn today by S. Smith Griswold, chief of the county air pollution control district. "The battle has been a process of identifying the sources of air pollution and of abating them," Griswold declared. "One by one we have run down the places where the contamination originates, and one by one we have lopped them off."

Griswold said the campaign had succeeded in abating dust and fumes from the metals industry, sulphur dioxide and hydrocarbon emissions from petroleum refineries and smoke and ash from backyard incinerators.

As a result there has been only one "smog alert" this year compared with 10 last year and 15 in 1955. A first-stage "smog alert" is declared when the ozone density reaches 30 particles per million parts of air. The level for this year's alert was 25 as compared with the all-time high of 30 set Sept. 15, 1956.

Griswold conceded that the area covered by smog has become more widespread. He noted that eye irritation from smog had been reported from rural parts of the San Fernando valley where only a few years ago smog was unknown. He blamed it on the steadily rising number of cars.

# Dutch-Indonesian Fight May Bring Trouble at NATO Meet

The angry dispute between The Netherlands and Indonesia may cause trouble at the North Atlantic Treaty Organization "summit" meeting.

The Netherlands has asked the support of its 14 fellow-members of the NATO alliance against Indonesia's attempt to force it to give up western New Guinea.

At the request of The Netherlands government an emergency meeting of the NATO permanent council in Paris was held last Saturday.

The Netherlands called for diplomatic support against Indonesia's seizure of its territory.

The council decided to refer the issue to the NATO governments.

But when the leaders of the NATO countries met in Paris next Monday, The Netherlands demand is pretty sure to play a part in discussion.

Especially, the United States will be asked to take an unequivocal stand on The Netherlands side.

If the United States agrees, it will mean a shift in American policy. African and Asian countries introduced a resolution in the United Nations last month calling for negotiations between The Netherlands and Indonesia on Indonesia's demand that it be given Dutch New Guinea. The Netherlands opposed the resolution on the ground that a favorable vote would constitute support for Indonesia's claim.

The U. S. vote was 41 in favor of the resolution and 29 against, with 11 countries abstaining.

The resolution failed because a two-thirds vote in its favor was required.

In this vote, the United States was one of those countries which abstained. It did so because it did not want to "offend" Indonesia and possibly incline its "neutralist" government toward Soviet Russia.
