It was first speculated the attacks stemmed from Greek separatists of the U. S. "hands off" policy during the United Nations debate on Cyprus.
But Athens afternoon newspapers implied the communists were responsible, stating that a "strong demonstration against establishment of NATO missile bases on Greek territory" was planned for Saturday.
Premier Constantine Karamanlis, in Paris for the NATO summit conference this week, said a number of officers here demanding an immediate and full-scale investigation.
He said he was not informed by any of the American-occupied buildings were subjected to extensive searches for possible explosives.

Soviet Black Market Reaches Wide From Cradle to Grave

VIENNA, Dec. 13 (AP)—From cradles to graves, black markets are spreading in the Soviet Union. It is no secret. The Soviet press outlets themselves report examples of bribery and corruption. Take an issue this week of Izvestia, the official government newspaper. It exposed a black market in "dead souls."

According to Izvestia, cemetery managers and grave-diggers during the past two years have extorted special payments from relatives of the dead. In Russia, burial is still a costly job—but it is not too hard to get a cemetery plot.

This is but one of many revelations of the way black market pervades Soviet life. Newspapers have exposed many examples, travelers

The black markets exist in everything from shoes and ties to pig iron and machinery. They have been an integral part of Soviet life since the end of Lenin's "new economic policy" (NEP) in the late 1920s. It was in the NEP which temporarily allowed free enterprise to function alongside communism.

Wherever a Russian wants to build a house, cook a stew, get married or fulfill the state quota for his factory, he must deal with operators who know where to get the things he can't find on the legal market.

Soviet papers have admitted that such a lively trade exists in furs, apples, pepper and herbs from Georgia that black marketers from Tiflis

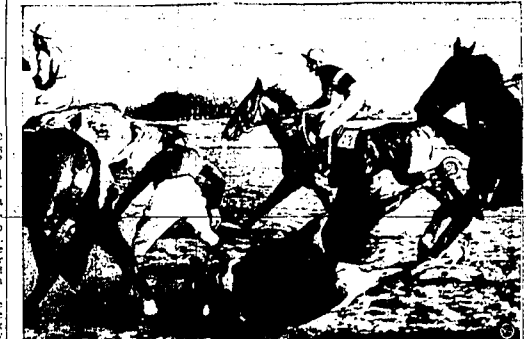
