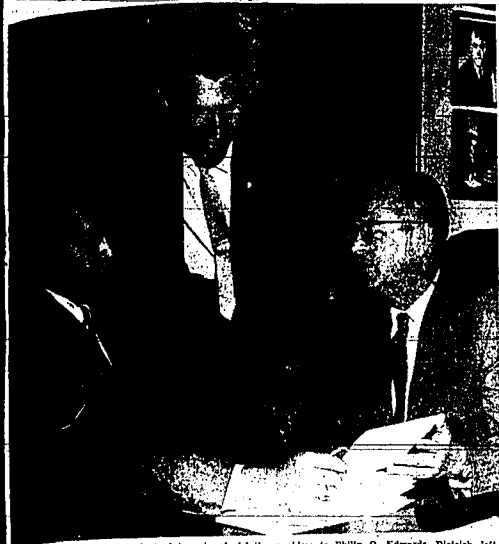

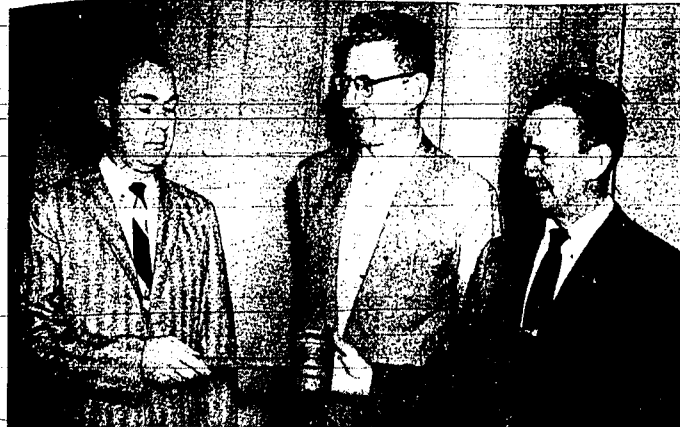

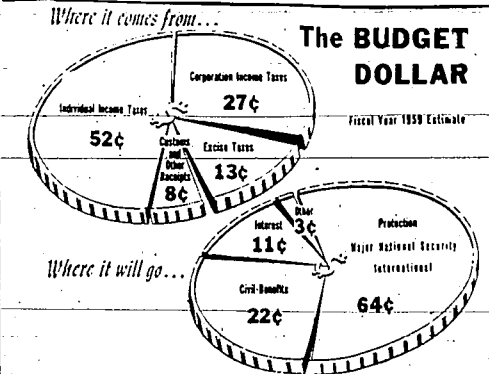

Three westerners are on the powerful Senate appropriations committee. They include Dworkin, Representative Budget, R., Idaho, on the house appropriations committee.

These two committees have a powerful influence on much legislation. Napoleon sold Louisiana to the United States in 1803 for 15 million dollars.

And Senator Mansfield of Montana is assistant Democratic leader in the Senate. He has called for the calling up of legislation in the Senate.

The committee chairman are senators Murray, D., Mont., Interior and Insular Affairs; Hayden, D., Ariz., Appropriations; and Chavez, D., N.M., public works.

Murray's Interior committee handles legislation of special interest to the West, covering such subjects as mining, public lands, dam construction, irrigation and Indian affairs.

Several members of the Interior committee have indicated they intend to press for legislation to help the domestic metal mining industry. This probably would be enthusiastically reported out by the committee since so many of its members represent mining states.

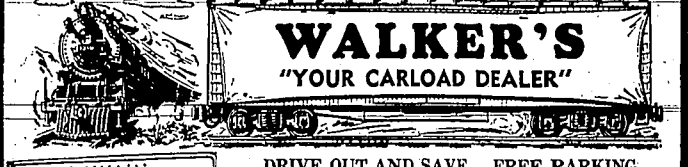

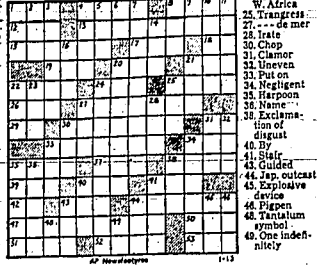

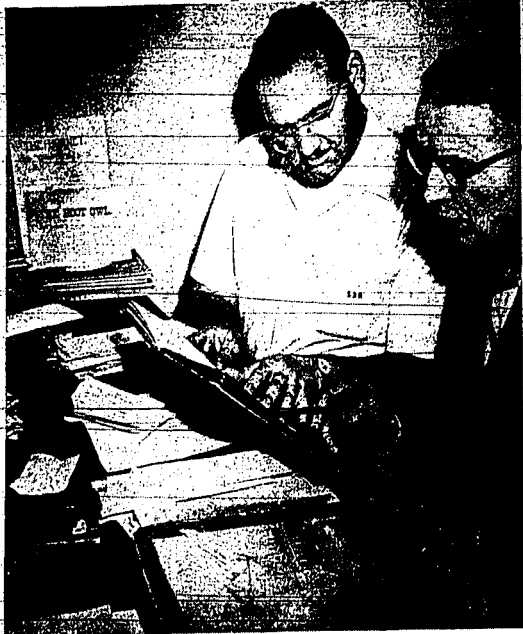
