Admiral Says U. S. Missiles Set for Action

TAIPEI, Jan. 20—(AP)—Vice Adm. Austin K. Doyle, U. S. Navy commander on Formosa, said today newly arrived Atlas guided missiles are ready to retaliate against any Communist Chinese attack.

Doyle told United Press in an exclusive interview the missiles capability of carrying atomic warheads is now set up and ready for action.

The nationalistic Chinese island of Formosa is the only place in China mainland is the only place in the United States has a national guided missile command, reported by whether America stockpile of atomic warheads actually on Formosa.

But most observers and probably the command has assumed that the United States has the nuclear warheads, tucked away either here or on the nearby Pacific island of Guam.

The missile is a surface to surface missile with a range of about 600 miles.

This means that it could be launched from Formosa against mainland China and Chinese targets from Canton to Shanghai and as far inland as Nanking.

The United States announced the launching of Atlas on Formosa as a deterrent to the Chinese mainland of the air force was not deployed here until late November.

Doyle said there appeared to be a general status quo in the Pacific, but he noted a slight increase in the number of Communist submarines in the far east as "a very serious threat."

Doyle has about 112 submarines in far eastern waters and has given to the Chinese, he estimated.

Some of these are long-range submarines that "could" strike anywhere along the Pacific.

"When you think of what Hitler did with about 50 submarines, you can see a very serious threat," Doyle said.

Mothers Plan Meet in Hope To Free Kin

HONG KONG, Jan. 20—Mrs. Ruth Redmond, Yorker, N. Y., said today she would try to Peiping yesterday to join two other American mothers for conferences with Chinese Communist officials in hopes of winning freedom for their imprisoned sons.

All three of the mothers have been visiting sons held in Chinese prisons on "spy" charges and sentenced to terms ranging from 20 years to life. They have appealed to Peiping to release their sons.

Mrs. Redmond has been in Shanghai visiting her son, Hugh 26, who was sentenced to life imprisonment.

She will join Mrs. Mary V. Downey, New Britain, Conn., her son, William, and Mrs. Philip G. Pecteau, Los Angeles, her son, John, and Richard Pecteau, 26, at Peiping today to appeal for long terms for all three prisoners.

Mrs. Redmond told the United Press by telephone the Chinese Red Cross notified her this morning that Mrs. Downey and Mrs. Pecteau had arranged the conference.

"I don't know what it will amount to but I'm going to Peiping and join the other two mothers at a conference," she said. She has appealed twice to Chinese Communist Premier Chou En-lai for release of her son.

Mrs. Redmond said she did not know which Chinese Communist officials were meeting and that she still has not heard from her two earlier letters to Chou.

She said she believed she would meet with her son for the last time Tuesday before going to Peiping. She and the others are to fly directly to Canton Saturday for their return to Hong Kong on Sunday.

Mrs. Redmond said a cold she caught recently had improved considerably.

"The much better now but the Chinese Red Cross this morning informed I go to a hospital, where they have me a checkup," she said.

Idaho State Professor Notes News of Sputnik Had Great Impact on America

FOCAL POINT, Jan. 20.—News of the launching of sputnik struck the American public with great surprise. Not since the attack on Pearl Harbor by a group of Americans from their drama of invulnerability has anything struck them with such force as this satellite, Oct. 4, 1957, might be called the day of awakening. The first lesson learned from this was that America is losing the technological battle of the world.

The second lesson was equally obvious: If America is to succeed in the technological contest, she must have a corps of capable, technically trained persons to carry on the contest and the college and colleges of the country must undertake their recruitment.

The third lesson, though somewhat obvious, is that effective democratic government demands an informed electorate. When the quality of our citizens is so low that we cannot deliver up their right of self-government to the hands of a few, it is our duty to take steps to improve them.

The sputnik affair exhibits a familiar pattern to be discovered in the history of many institutions. The institution is founded in good faith. It is later exposed in its purpose which points clearly to some inadequacy in its conception. The institution is then exposed and anxious to correct it, but the information for the correction is withheld or distorted in the name of preserving good public relations.
