# Dulles Warns of Russian Designs for Middle East; U.S. Missile Plan Denied

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22 (UP)—Secretary of State John Foster Dulles today warned the Middle East that Russia is trying to bring that area to the communist bloc. Dulles, warning of "unacceptable" Russian designs for the area, said the United States is going to force the Soviet States to accept American missile bases.

The official statement accused Russia of "unacceptable" designs for the area, saying that the "imperialist aggressive designs" in the Middle East are "unacceptable."

Dulles said the President has authorized me to express the deep concern of the United States for the security and economic development of the part of the free world and our constant and unswerving support for the principles of collective security symbolized by the United Nations.

"The United States is fully conscious of the threat to the area from the Soviet Union," Dulles said. "Formerly it was the threat of Soviet imperialism, but now it is the threat of Soviet communism."

# Midwestern Storm Leaves Death Toll Of 49, Heads East

The worst storm of the winter continued its march eastward today, bringing freezing rain and gale-force winds to New England and New York state after dumping up to 18 inches of snow in the Midwest. The death toll from the three-day midwestern storm rose to 49, Kansas City, Mo., caught a 15-inch snowfall. Seven deaths in the Kansas City area were attributed to the storm, the worst in nearly 60 years.

The snow, plunged 18 inches deep at Ottawa, Mo., struck fair and ground fell a foot in many midwestern cities. Some schools and businesses closed.

With the abate of the storm center in the Ohio valley, the weather bureau warned interior New England and upper New York state of rains that would come some areas with a danger of ice.

**WASHINGTON, Jan. 22**—President Roosevelt's own Republican administration is destined to be mixed in political rows over the defense program.

In view of what he knew his right-hand man, Sherman Adams, was saying at almost the same moment it is hard to see how Eisenhower could have the plea at all.

Adams played politics with defense as large as he could.

Only if they were living in the dream world could the politicians of the Democratic and Republican parties be expected to refrain from making political capital out of the defense issue at each other's expense.

The reason is simple: The nation's whole interest is centered on defense—not only in talking and wondering about how it can be made better but why it isn't better. There's ammunition for both political parties in this one.

Neither the Truman nor Eisenhower administrations made the all-out drive on military development that the nation now realizes should have been made.

Eisenhower said in a speech at a Republican rally in Chicago Monday night: "Our first objective—security and a just peace—is not a partisan or political matter. Americans must never... let the issue of security and peace become a pawn in anyone's political chess game."

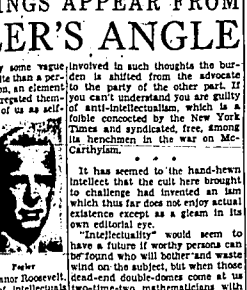

### Scientist Avers Life in City Has Its Virtues, Also

NEW YORK, Jan. 22 (AP)—A big city political scientist who came from a small town says sociologists who praise rural life and criticize city dwelling need to take a closer look.

Wallace S. Babbie, professor of public administration at Columbia university, said yesterday at a conference on "The Industrial and the Metropolitan" that sociologists are merely "honest for the time being."

Dr. Babbie, a native of Point Pleasant, W. Va., (pop. 4,566), said the literature of the urban society would have been better balanced with a closer look at small-town society.

Such inspection, he said, would show that small-town society is "parochial, dull, introverted, rigid, complacent and somewhat unimaginative in its decision making."

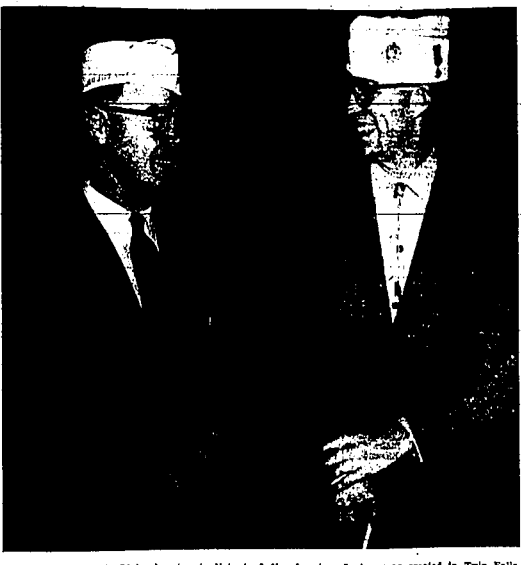

### Legion Aide Says 'Same Group' Still Opposing Vets' Benefits

The same group which has been fighting veterans' benefits since 1933 again is trying to destroy this country's veteran assistance program under the guise of balancing the budget and more for defense, Lou Babb, Babb, state department adjutant of the American Legion said Tuesday night in Twin Falls.

Speaking before a joint meeting of members of the American Legion post No. 7 and auxiliary, Babb said the "same group" which in 1933 "lopped off" money being paid veterans never has given up the fight and is working more seriously than ever to tear down the present-day veteran program.

He said the group in 1933 got an act passed to preserve the credit of the United States. With the enactment of this act, he said, all money paid to veterans was "lopped off" because of public demand the benefits be restored within the next year and one-half, he said, but not without a fight.

Babb said it was the Legion, along with other organizations, which pushed for the so-called GI bill of rights during World War I. Veterans would not have to come home and sell pencils and wear their uniforms.

Legion, he said, finally got the bill passed.

Those opposing the bill, he stated, contended it would bankrupt the country. "This hasn't been true" he added. In fact, he continued, Secretary of Treasury Humphreys, "who is not a promoter of veterans' welfare," has admitted that the bill has given this country a large and diversified people. This in turn has given them better jobs and has increased the amount of income tax being paid the government.

Additional money received by the government will offset the cost of the bill in about 15 years, Babb quoted Humphreys as saying.

Babb termed the bill as the "most beneficial act this country has ever known."

He contended that everything was rolling along fine until 1934 when President Roosevelt, everything a bill to give a slight increase to disabled veterans.

At that time, Babb stated, the president said he was signing the bill reluctantly and wanted a commission to study the veterans' program along with other public assistance programs.

As a result, the president appointed General Omar Bradley to head a commission, which later returned a 70-page report which Babb said was designed to "write the veteran off completely."

He said the Bradley commission would have been a commission of non-service hospitalization for veterans. He said the commission would have sent veterans hospital to public health.

Babb said some members of the commission argued that having arms for the country was part of being a citizen and those who did were earning their rights to citizenship. The Legion official said the Legion has argued in return that because only a small portion of the population bore arms that group is special and if bearing arms earns the right to citizenship then there are only a few who have a right to citizenship.

He said the same people now are trying to balance the budget and prepare for another war at the expense of the veteran. He said that American Legion always has been for the national defense, but veterans' aid and hospitalization is the lot of other wars and should not be charged to future wars.

Babb said the Legion contends that there can be enough paid off the government tax to balance the budget and keep this country strong without disturbing benefits of veterans.

He said that recently, the British government announced an increase in its veterans' benefits because it has been able to balance the budget through foreign aid received from this country. Nationalist Chalmers address are receiving benefits because of the aid this country has sent the Chinese on Formosa, he said.

"Why should this country lop off its own veterans' assistance programs while it still is sending money overseas to help other countries increase the benefits of their veterans?" he asked.

Babb said the fight in congress to preserve what has been obtained for veterans will not be "a pink tea." He said the Legion during one of its highest peaks spent \$50,000 on its legislative program which, he says, is about one-tenth the amount being spent by those trying to tear down the veterans' program.

He said the veterans will have to fight their battle alone. "If you don't believe that," he continued, "next time there is a veterans' program before congress, go around to various organizations and associations in your city and ask for a letter of support. You will see how many friends we have," he concluded.
