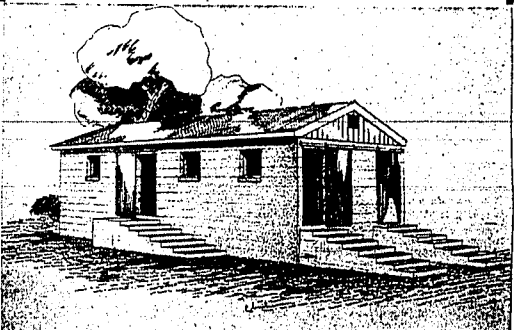

### Deadline Near In U.S. Wheat Support Plans

**WASHINGTON, Jan. 24**—Growers have only six more days in which to take advantage of the 12-3/4-cent national average price support loan program for wheat.

Under agriculture department regulations, no loans will be made after Jan. 31 until the loan program is reopened in the spring for 1958-crop wheat.

The 1958 rate will drop to about \$1.76 a bushel on the national average under an announcement made last summer by Secretary of Agriculture Brown.

"This reduction in the rate would cut the value of the wheat-crop about 200 million dollars, assuming, of course, market prices decline as much as the support rate. Inasmuch as there is a big surplus of the grain, market prices are expected to do just that. Prices of wheat on futures markets for delivery next spring and summer are already reflecting the lower support level.

Latest department reports show that farmers had stored 163 million bushels of wheat from 1957 crop of 947 million bushels under price support through Dec. 15.

The closing date for support loans on sorghum grain is Feb. 28 and for corn, May 31.
