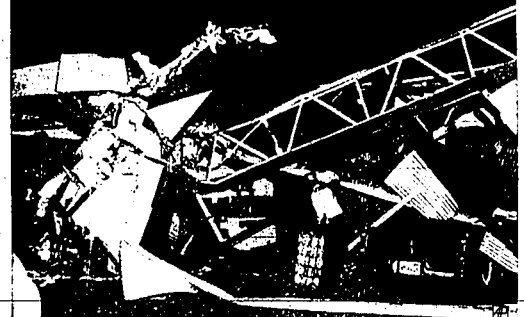

Truman Offer Of Presidency To Ike Denied

NEW YORK, Feb. 3 (AP)—Former President Harry S. Truman in a television interview denied yesterday that he ever offered the presidency to General Eisenhower.

Filmed Last Year Truman's remarks were made on the "See It Now" program with Edward R. Murrow as moderator. The interview was filmed in the Florida keys a year ago.

Murrow explained that the interview, which required several days to film, originally was intended for use in 1950 or later by historians. However, he said, a portion was released yesterday because he thinks history may already have begun to reach some tentative conclusions.

Truman's denial of boasting Eisenhower for the presidency was in direct contradiction to Eisenhower's recollection as presented in his book, "Crusade in Europe." There Eisenhower recalled that at the time of the Potsdam conference in 1945 President Truman told him: "General, there is nothing else you may want that I can't give you."

FREEDOM AND TYRANNY

FREEDOM AND TYRANNY

In all the hubbub over Soviet achievements in science and education relative to our own, one aspect of the matter hasn't had the attention it probably deserves.

Since the dawn of tyranny, men have been saying that arbitrary government is inefficient. Departures from the operations of free thought and hence of genuine progress in science and all other fields of education.

What the Russians have accomplished, and are continuing to accomplish, seems to contradict this long-held notion. For it is doubly evident that the Soviet Union was more rigid than the Soviet version which now imposes its grip upon millions of square miles of the earth's surface.

In this vast arena of human terror, the expression of ideas is controlled with ruthless efficiency. Departures from the Communist line of the moment are penalized as unforgivable heresy.

By achieving results in science and education which the free world has not matched, the Soviet Union has demonstrated that it is capable of doing things which we have said was impossible in a dictatorship.

For one thing, the Soviet Communists do not apply their controls to the realm of the physical sciences now so vital to the creation of new military weapons and materials. In this zone of thought, Russian scientists are free to explore with all the ability and energy at their command.

On top of this, any Russian exhibiting any talent at all for science is exhaustively schooled in its disciplines and kept on the science track no matter what.

We all know now that we don't have enough people in science and some that get into it are underpaid. In the Soviet Union, by the very fact of its dictatorship, there is no such deflection of talent.

It is clear from the events of recent months that among the many things we no longer can take comfort from is the idea that men in the Soviet Union can't think well. Not only can they, but when they demonstrate it their government won't let them do anything else.

Any form of compulsion is not for us. But we'd better find some approach which will make our way of freedom produce better results.

PERMANENT INFLATION?

None of the economic experts appears greatly optimistic that the United States will find the answers to inflation in the years immediately ahead. They are already talking of inflationary trends reaching into the early 1950's.

It has been noted that the current recession is peculiar in that it has been marked for the most part by "production deflation" but a continuance of price inflation. The normal expectation is that when output falls, prices decline, too.

We did manage to hold prices even in the most recent month reported by the bureau of labor statistics. But, despite the production gains, the cost of living rose 3.1 per cent during the year.

The trend has been inflationary through virtually the whole post-World War II period. We know from experience that important economic growth can go on in a framework of soaring prices. Indeed, some economists argue that inflation is a way of forcing economic growth. High prices are a lure to the expansion-minded in the business community.

It is widely asserted that the wage-price upswing is potentially a menace to us all. There is always the fear inflation will become runaway. Already, all kinds of people are picking out of the market for all kinds of goods.

If we can in this fast-moving age have solid economic development without the corrosive influence of inflation, we ought to begin to find it out. It is not too late. We may discover one day that inflation is taken for granted by management, labor and everybody else as an inescapable companion to our economic progress.

POT VS. KETTLE

At Chicago President Eisenhower declared that the nation's defense problems ought to be left to politicians in this congressional election year.

This is a sentiment that most Americans probably support warmly. Where their security is plainly involved, people want no hocus-focuss, or head change, or counter-attacks. They want both parties to cooperate in a quest for truth in legislative action.

But they must have read with some puzzlement on the very same morning reports of the President's talk appeared that White House aide Sherman Adams had blasted the Democrats in a Minneapolis speech for allegedly playing the defense card.

If politics in defense is to be barred, one would guess that you have to make a start by avoiding accusations at the outset that the other fellow is a broke. By the rules of evidence, Eisenhower's right-hand man didn't know what his left was doing.

Britain Notes Military Uses Of Singapore

LONDON, Feb. 3 (AP)—The vital importance of Singapore as a military base will be underlined in a new white paper due to be published in the next few days.

The white paper also will outline the adjustments that will be made in the Far East. It will also outline the changes which will be made in the structure of Singapore command and structure of the Far East command.

At the same time, it will stress that Britain needs Singapore as a base more than ever, because of the gradual reduction of other bases along the coast of the Mediterranean and the Atlantic.

The paper also will discuss the question whether the base can be used for the port after the colony achieves its independence in the next few years.

Already some doubts have been expressed in the British press and among members of parliament who regard it as a British loss to some extent because of the political importance of the political base in remaining a British base. It is apparently to be retained by a government which is expected to be formed by the end of the year.

The London Times, for example, has commented on the influence of the leftist Peoples Action party. The extremist leaders are now under detention but there must be a day, perhaps late this year, when they will be freed. What happens then is something the party has to worry over now, the Times writes.

Defense authorities here, who insist that there is no substitute for Singapore as a base, are also looking at the political scene.

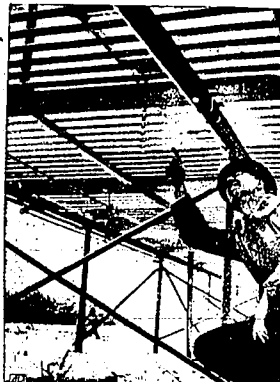

U. S. Satellite 'Lost' Briefly In Launching

WASHINGTON, Feb. 3 (AP)—For seven minutes early last Saturday our satellite was missing. Werner Von Braun and his friends feared the satellite was lost. The rocket, known as the "happy Dutchman," was a worried man 100 minutes after his Jupiter-C rocket blasted away from the Florida coast at 10:48 p.m. EST Friday.

He and other scientists pacing the Pentagon floor with army officials had carefully figured that at 12:34 a.m. the satellite carried aloft by the rocket—if it was going into an orbit—would be whizzing over San Diego, Calif.

But the minutes rolled past 12:34 and no word from California trackers.

It is history now that the man-made moon finally hovered over California, successfully orbiting around the earth.

But only today did the army disclose details of the operation—sawed-out "that Von Braun and others went through until the word came: 'It's in! San Diego.'"

(Von Braun said later the satellite apparently had gone a little higher and into a somewhat lower orbit than expected. For that reason it was several minutes late getting to San Diego.)

The current price level is about 3 1/2 per cent above that of a year ago but 21 per cent below the record high set in February, 1953.

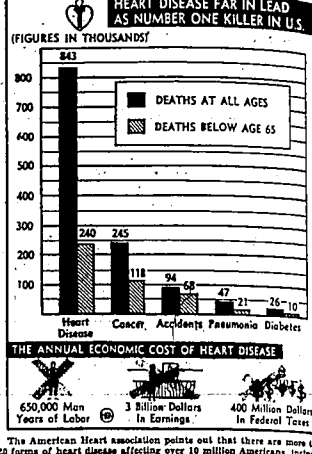

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9 (AP)—The story of the first American satellite which the military has been trying to launch since December 1947, was told Friday night—only to be told again.

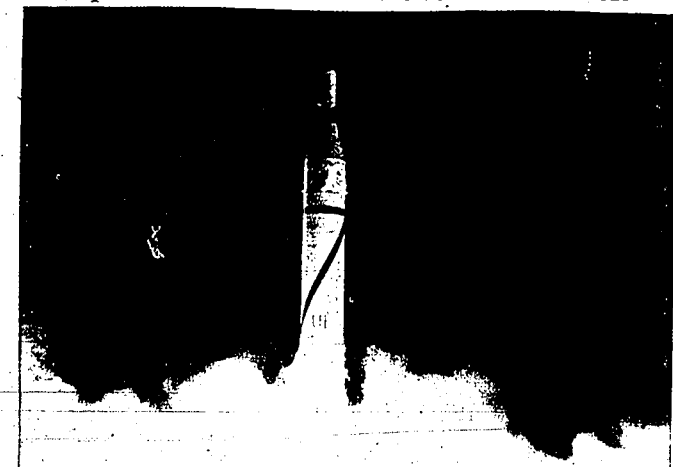
"Now, let's see to what we can get back to," said the speaker, "and we'll see what we can do."

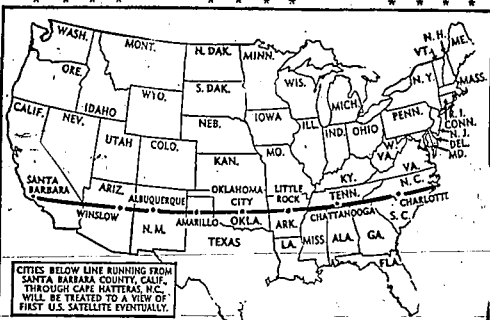

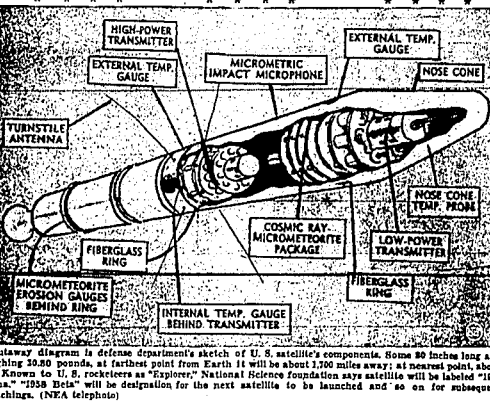
Jupiter-C Boosts First United States Satellite Aloft

Tranquilizers Use Has Okay After Testing

NEW YORK, Feb. 9 (AP)—Tranquilizing drugs have been reported of a new use in some people they cause untoward depression. The situation has been growing in medical circles. The evaluation comes from Dr. Frank A. Ayd, Jr., who investigated it in 70 persons who were suffering from what some doctors now call "drug-induced depression."

Of the 70, he found that 23 were not victims of true depression but of "pseudo-depression" that was "languid and discouraged," but had lost neither appetite nor weight. Nor were they self-deprecating, remorseful or troubled by morbid thoughts," Dr. Ayd said.

The reason they were discouraged was because they felt a lassitude which "interfered with the functioning of the brain-moved standards." This "lassitude," he said, was due to the tranquilizers they had taken. They were "over-tranquilized"—the doses were too big.

The remainder of the 70 persons who had been referred to him, said he is a psychiatrist, by other physicians, were suffering from true depression in the psychiatric sense—that is, depression which is based entirely or almost entirely on hidden workings of the mind.

They had the psychiatric symptoms the others did not have, such as "insomnia, early morning waking, depressed mood, crying spells, hopelessness, anxiety attacks, obsessive fears, impaired concentration and memory, indecisiveness, loss of interest in usual activities, and suicidal tendencies."

But, continued Ayd in reporting to the Medical Society of the State of New York, they had all been subject to attacks of depression before their doctors prescribed tranquilizing drugs for them, and many had attacks after the tranquilizers had been withdrawn.

Of the 23 persons with what Ayd diagnosed as "pseudo-depression," only eight per cent had psychiatric care, but of the 47 with genuine (psychiatric) depression, 83 per cent had had it. The drugs prescribed were, in the main, members of the rauwolfia family of tranquilizers. In 43 of the 70 they were prescribed to relieve high blood pressure. In the others they were prescribed to lessen mental tension.

Russia Won't Release Data For Sputniks

BRUSSELS, Belgium, Feb. 3 (AP)—Russia failed again today to reveal what information its satellites have extracted from outer space.

A long-awaited Soviet report to world headquarters of the international geographical year, purporting to contain scientific information about Russia's artificial satellites, actually contained entirely of communications published weeks ago in the Moscow press.

The report comes as an anti-climax, said IOY Secretary General Marcel Nicolet.

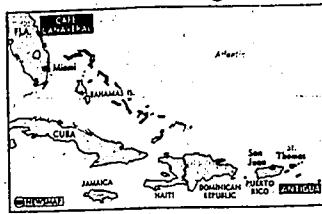
IOY officials had hoped that the report would include details of the temperature and cosmic ray intensities the satellites had encountered in space, along with information on meteoric impacts and other technical data.

In fact, the report did not even reveal such minor matters as where the satellite was launched—information that the United States made available immediately after its Explorer went into orbit.

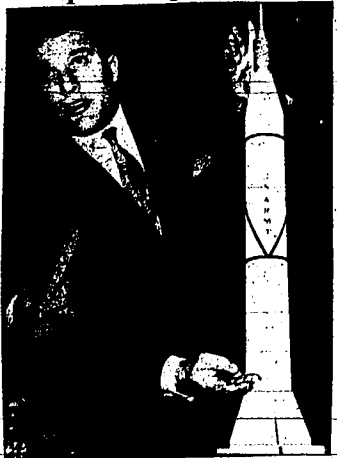
