## U.S. Asks Proof Russian-West Talks Would Aid World Peace

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4 (AP)—Russia was asked in a White House statement last night to come forward with better proof that a summit meeting, urged by Soviet leaders, "is good for advancing the cause of peace and justice."

The statement described the latest message from Premier Bulganin, consisting of a "repetition of Soviet proposals previously made and a negative attitude toward President Eisenhower's eight proposals put forward in his letter of Jan. 12."

## Ike, Aides Ponder U.S. Space Setups Guided by Civilian

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4 (AP)—President Eisenhower discussed with legislative and scientific advisers today whether to set up a new civilian space agency or keep all missile-satellite development in the military.

The President discussed the question for two hours and an hour later the military leaders and his chief scientific adviser, Dr. James R. Killian. The issue has become one of growing importance on Capitol Hill where Congress has yet to make up its mind whether to make space developments a defense department or a civilian responsibility.

QUITO, Ecuador, Feb. 4.—An 8.5 magnitude earthquake in Ecuador demolished several buildings weakened in the huge tremor and tidal wave of Jan. 19.

The quake, recorded at 3:15 p.m. sent injured rushing into the streets in panic. There were no deaths. Fourteen persons were killed in the quake.

Woodbury said new findings in storage methods are an example of research that means much to the industry. Potatoes stored in temperatures below 40 degrees convert their starch to sugar more rapidly than at higher temperatures. When the sugar content becomes high the potatoes do not produce the highest quality chips or other processed items. Scientists say the potato sugar turns brown with heat necessary for processing. More attractive products come from potatoes with higher starch content and less sugar.

Woodbury said he is still looking for better storage methods.

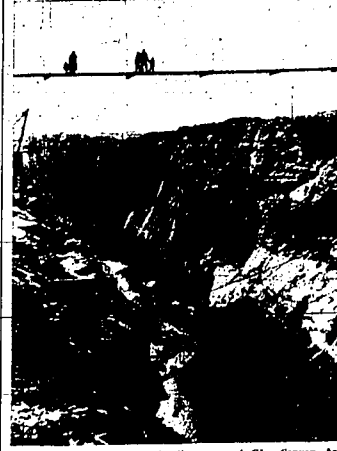
