TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Rarely has there been greater disunity at Washington over solution of grave national and international problems—crisis, in fact—than at present.

The disagreements affect such contrasting and entirely opposite phases of the education system and re-orientation of the joint efforts of state and federal officials in public works and social programs, from holding a "summit conference" on the "Duties of Citizenship" to adhering to the "rigid" Dulles policy.

It would be absurd to suggest that partisan politics does not underlie and sharpen these conflicts and differences. With this point of view striving for political advantage in anticipation of the 1940-1960 election cycle, both Republicans and Democrats to be influenced by ballot-box considerations.

DISAGREEMENT OF STEPS TO MEET SPUNKI

TIKASAT—Nevertheless, and this is the most troublesome aspect of the parliamentary situation, there is a lack of agreement among the White House advisers and legislators over the steps necessary to meet the spunkie threat and to maintain stability.

Nor is there unity in the two parties themselves. Senator Byrd commands the support of many Republicans who favor a more radical economic and only a small increase in the public debt ceiling. The Humphrey-Douglass administration is in domestic projects—schools, highways, reclamation, etc.—and is not at all in favor of a "defuse party" electric power expansion.

TWO PARTIES READY FOR THE FRAY—IN THE MAIN

However, the battleline of conflict has already been drawn. It is to get the two parties into the 1960 presidential election. The Democrats will pose as the "defuse party" while the Republicans will pose as the "defuse party" who will argue that the administration has shown the strength of the military establishment, especially in the scientific and technological fields.

Two separate committees have already set the stage for this kind of an offensive. None of the President's proposals for larger appropriations for military work match the senate majority recommendations, which were endorsed by the Republican House.

At 10:30 a.m. the Russell and Jerry Bodenhamer place, two miles south and one mile east of the "Y" will illustrate one of the most modern swine feeding enterprises. Stop there is scheduled at 11:30 a.m.

The noon stop at the Henry Jones south feeding yards will demonstrate a push button feed mixing plant in operation.

The different stops will show calves being fed alfalfa hay only, alfalfa hay and grain and alfalfa hay and molasses. Two different lots of cattle will be on line, and short feeding programs.

The tour will feature a feeder cattle grading demonstration with prize to be given to the best cattle grazer.

Lunch will be served at 1 p.m. at the 1000' hall and a panel discussion will start at 2 p.m. Panel members are Henry Jones, buying feeder cattle; Joe Dahmen, extension animal husbandman, University of Idaho, growing-out calves; Dr. Donald Bell, department head from the university, antibiotics and protein, and Ralph Christad, Twin Falls, marketing cattle.

Sweden Ends 50-Year Silence, Tells of 'War That Never Was'

STOCKHOLM, Sweden, Feb. 5—The Swedish chiefs of staff, after more than 50 years, have released the official story of the "war that never was"—how Sweden planned to invade Norway in 1905.

The official history was published in Stockholm this week. It proved to be a real "spy thriller."

"There was a Swedish spy who disguised himself as a hunter selling game and brought news of Norway's defense plans. There was a Norwegian army officer who walked boldly into a Swedish army mess to secure information on Sweden's mobilization.

It began on June 7, 1905, after Norway announced her intention of ending the union with Sweden and putting an unknown Danish prince on the throne of Norway—the late King Haakon.

The Swedish high command reacted at once. Out of a dusty pigeonhole came a plan, drawn up in 1895, for the invasion of Norway. Senior Swedish officers worked around the clock for 10 days to bring the plan up to date. "Full mobilization of the Swedish armed forces were called three weeks later, on July 11."

The late King Gustaf, then crown prince of Sweden, was picked to lead a 130,000-man expeditionary force against Norway. The army and navy chiefs of staff were to be his chief aides.

Coast-and-dagger played its part. Sweden organized intelligence offices in London and Copenhagen. Agents were sent to Norway and Sweden already living there were paid to be spies.

The first news of the Norwegian mobilization—70,000 Norwegians were deployed—was brought to the defense ministry by Henr. Carl Sandberg, who visited the Fredrikian for disguised as a hunter selling game.

At the gate of another fort, Akerhus, Lieut. Karl Stalhane stood disguised as a workman, counting the Norwegians as they reported for service.
