Like Sent "Space Age" Funds Act After House OK

WASHINGTON, Feb. 6 (U.P.)—The House today passed and sent to the White House an emergency bill appropriating about \$1,410,000,000 for space weapons and defense.

At almost the same time the Senate approved a resolution authorizing an special committee to recommend a resolution on space programs should be under civilian or military control. The bill on which the house completed military appropriations today carries all of the \$1,260,000,000 President Eisenhower had asked.

By an addition it gives the defense department authority to transfer 150 million dollars from other programs to urgent missile and space projects. It also provides more in transfer authority than the president had sought.

The action was by a resolution by Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson and his predecessor, Charles McNamara, "there is an urgent need to lodge specific responsibility for space programs somewhere—and that decision should not be postponed."

The bill authorized introduction yesterday—only 24 hours after President Eisenhower was disclosed to have advised the defense department to study and recommend whether to transfer space programs from military to civilian or vice versa.

"In the 'flipper house' scheme, the promoter calls on one or more of the owners, and explains to him his company plans to commence remodeling operations in the neighborhood," Hunt says.

"Before they begin activities, the unscrupulous dealer claims, a good construction job is being done in the neighborhood to show prospects. An offer to supply a new roof or new floor for the house 'is less than what is made,'" Hunt says.

Hunt adds, "This entire sales pitch is a falsehood. The promoter has no intention of using the house for display purposes and the remodeling work never starts. The promoter has paid an exorbitant price for the 'racket' job."

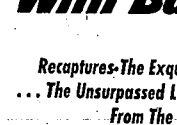

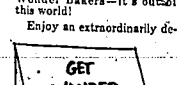

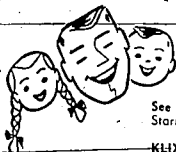

Drop Noted in Price of Beef, Poultry, Pork

By The Associated Press
Beef and chicken prices were reported somewhat lower in many areas—this week. The drop in prices is the most widely featured by supermarket chains and corner grocery stores this week-end.
Beef offerings range from the economy cuts such as chuck and brisket through ribs, roasts to steaks and porterhouse steaks. Beef prices are down 4 to 10 cents a pound in many areas.
Pork is off in the same general range, with loins and picnic hams being the most mentioned as bargain bait for housewives. Pricers were mostly 10 to 4 cents a pound lower, although showing some increases, too.
Lamb prices are a bit lower, with the reductions more widely scattered. The department of agriculture says that the recent record lamb slaughter last fall makes an increase supply of lambs probable for early 1936, of course, eventually will lead lower prices.
Mead means wholesale prices were lower this week, too, which should mean generally cheaper meats at the retail level in the coming days.

Beef prices among vegetable products are also lower. Carrots, collards and spinach. Good buys also may be found among chickens, turkeys, broilers and ducks.
Old cabbage from the fall crop is a good buy, particularly if you plan to use it for something like coleslaw, while supplies of new cabbage are a little lighter this week. Sweet potatoes from eastern and southern fields are slightly more expensive, too, putting them in the fair to moderate class. Zucchini and pascal celery are in the same category.

Higher prices generally prevail for eggplant, cucumbers, peppers, beans, cauliflower, peas, yellow sweet corn and yellow and blue squash.
Carrots also are more costly than usual this week, due to heavy rains which flooded the lower Rio Grande valley last month. The price is in the moderate class.
Ample supplies of apple continue to be on the market. Fruit bins, thanks to last year's 177 million bushel crop, which was the heaviest since 1925, are still full. On Jan. 1 were up 25 per cent over a year ago. As always is the case for apples, the best buys are the ripe ones priced for a quick sale.
Empress grapes from California, the Florida variety, are in season from Florida and the normal citrus staples, oranges and grapefruit, are in season. Good buys are the ripe ones. Citrus fruits may be higher again next week in the wake of the latest Florida cold wave.
