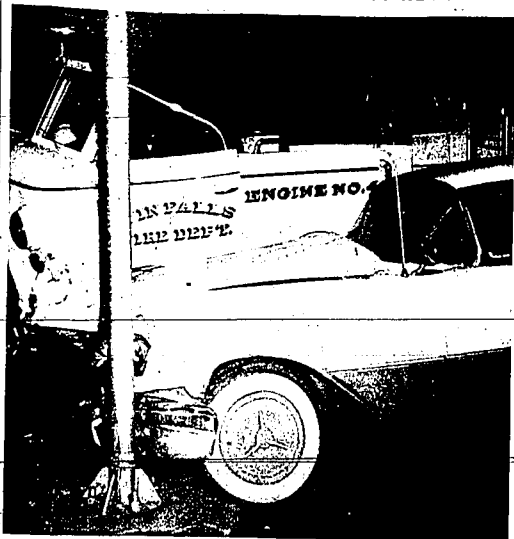

### Bandit Meets Firing Squad For 3 Deaths

TEHRAN, Iran, Feb. 12—Ahmed Shah, brother of the notorious bandit leader Dad Shah who was hanged last year by Persian police, was executed by a firing squad at dawn today for the murder of three Americans last March.

Rewin M. Carroll, international economic cooperation adviser for the Kerman area of Iran, his wife, Anita, and Brewster A. Wilson, an ITC official, were ambushed March 24 by Dad Shah's bandit gang while traveling by jeep through a desolate region of southeastern Iran.

Ahmed Shah and 18 members of the gang later were captured in Pakistan. After an intensive drive by Iranian police and troops drove them out of Iran, Ahmed told Pakistani authorities that Dad Shah had been killed in a skirmish with Iranian police.

Divot of American History: A formal invitation was sent to the President of the United States and an afterthought, he was asked to make as few appropriate remarks following the principal oratory.

When the day came, the President, as one witness wrote, "said his half dozen words of consecration, and the music wailed and we went home through crowded and cheering streets."

Those "half dozen" simple words of Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg address have rung down the decades with ever increasing meaning and inspiration.

Today America faces a challenge to the principles to which it was dedicated in 1776 and rededicated by Lincoln in 1863—a challenge no less grave than any it has ever faced before.

As if the challenge of Lincoln's day, the danger lies not so much in a foreign enemy, but within ourselves—that we not lose by default what the blood and sacrifice of previous generations have gained.

Gettysburg could give cause for over-optimism to the union, just as America's first satellite could now give us an excuse to return to the comfortable complacency which was only recently so rudely jarr'd.

**Parents Killed**  
The little girls were orphaned last month when their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Larsen, Pine Creek, were killed in a highway crash a few miles from their home.

When Leona—who married a 28-year-old Lewiston paper mill worker 11 months ago—heard of the tragedy, she hurried to Pine Creek and took charge.

Calm and courageous in the face of the great sadness, she made the funeral arrangements, immediately began caring for her sisters and said she wanted to become their legal guardian.

Probate Judge Peter DuFrene, saying he could see no reason why Leona should not be granted custody, appointed her and her husband, Edward, as legal guardians Monday. The girls have no children of their own.

**Community Aids**  
This community has been rallying to the family's support for several days. The Moores will live tentatively in the two-bedroom house for a month, or until a larger home is found. If one isn't available, lumber has been donated and the Chevroleters union has offered to add a bedroom to the present home.

Lewiston merchants also have donated cash and a number of kitchen appliances including an automatic washer, an electric range and a refrigerator. A mothers' club says it will provide new clothing as the girls grow up. Moore's employer, Pullman Portland, Inc., is donating the heat for the home.

Mrs. Moore—learning of the case through news reports—After several days of sporadic attendance, Moore went back to work. Now all that's left is for the seven orphaned Larsen children—15-year-old James—to come home. He is attending school atampa but he's expected to join the family soon.

### Lincoln Letter Tells of Work In Campaign, Ignores Speech

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12 (AP)—The library of congress has been given a letter in which he complained of the hard work in a campaign—and lightly passed over one of the greatest speeches he ever made.

The gift was announced yesterday as a part of the ceremonies honoring Lincoln, born 149 years ago today.

It was presented by Lincoln's great-grandson, Lincoln E. Johnson, 20, of St. Louis, Mo. At the same time Johnson gave the library:

(A) A confidential letter in which Lincoln defended a politician accused of being too fond of the bottle.

(B) A small card asking General Burnside and Butler to see the unnamed bearer.

And (C) a Bible presented to Abraham Lincoln & Co. by Robert Turner, who probably owned a Baltimore feed store.

Then, as now, presidential gifts showed up from unexpected places. It's the letter on campaigning—which Lincoln scholars thought had been lost—that attracts the most interest.

It was written from Exeter, N. H., while Lincoln was on an eastern swing designed to show that the last gasoline country lawyer was a fit man for the presidency.

The date: March 4, 1850, exactly a year before he was sworn into office.

Lincoln had staved over the speech he was to make in New York city, rewriting, repolishing, going almost

daily to the state library in Springfield to recheck facts.

And then, on Feb. 27, he delivered it at Cooper's Institute. It was a triumph, but that would have been hard to guess from the way he put it to his wife.

After discussing family matters Lincoln turned to the problems of campaigning and said:

"I have been unable to escape this toil, if I had foreseen it I think I would not have come east at all. The speech at New York, being within my calculation before I started, went off passably well, and gave me no trouble whatever; but I had already seen all my ideas in print . . .

"Kiss the dear boys for father, and say well on his way to his date with destiny.

As for the other letter, Lincoln was backing Richard Yates who hoped to get re-elected to congress from Illinois. On Sept. 8, 1854, Lincoln wrote Richard James Oglesby saying rumors were being spread that Yates drank secretly.

"Other things being equal," Lincoln wrote, "I would much prefer a temperate man, to an intemperate one. Still I do not make my vote depend absolutely upon the ques-

tion of whether a candidate does or does not take liquor.

"Thousands and thousands of us, in point of fact, have known Yates for more than 20 years; and I have never seen him drink liquor, not act, or speak, as if he had been drinking. nor have I ever heard any man say he ever heard . . ."

It's not clear whether the voters were convinced Yates was a rumpo. Anyway, he lost, but the story has a happy ending.

First Yates, and then Oglesby, were elected governor of Illinois. Both loyally supported the Lincoln administration.

### "Space" Test Reveals Need Of 2 in Ship

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Feb. 12 (AP)—The first space traveler should have along above the earth, a doctor suggested after observing the first three days of a man's simulated trip to outer space.

A cabin which would support a crew of two or more—a medical attendant—would be more desirable for future orbital flight, Dr. George F. Stienkamp said yesterday.

Stienkamp, chief of the air force's department of space medicine, has been watching airman Donald G. Slayton's reactions as the "pilot" of a five-foot steel chamber simulating the conditions of a flight to space.

Stienkamp made the statement in answer to a question as to whether the cabin in which Farrell is confined was actually adequate for human needs during space travel.

Stienkamp indicated he had drawn his conclusion from observing Farrell during his stay in the chamber since Sunday, but would not say to whom.

Stienkamp pronounced Farrell "mentally keen" and doing "excellent" at the end of the third day of the flight. He said there was no sign of wear on the 22-year-old airman's body or nerves.

The Bronx, N. Y., airman pleaded doctors controlling the experiment in his first problem by making a substitute for a forgotten oxygen canister.

Farrell has until 9:30 a.m. Sunday to solve the problem. He is under observation by scientists from the Air Force's space medicine department to determine whether his nerves can stand the strain of space travel.

Stienkamp said Farrell could not see out of the chamber any time he desires he's had enough.

"The point is, we expect any such reaction," he said. "He volunteered to go through with the experiment."

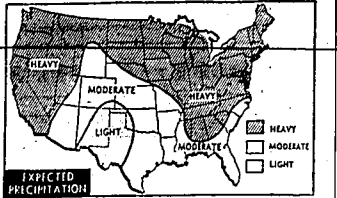

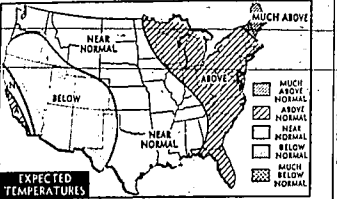

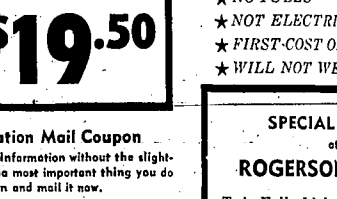

Transition Period Completed For Historic Coal-Steel Pool

LUXEMBOURG, Feb. 12—Europe's first great step toward economic and political integration—the six-nation coal and steel pool—has come of age.

A brief informal check, a blast on a whistle, and the train continued on its way across three continents. For that train, and the others which followed, there were no frontiers, no customs and no variation in prices inside and outside its country or origin.

Not only was it a mighty economic step but it was a move pregnant with possibilities for long-dreamed-of political federation. When France's three foreign ministers, Robert Schuman, first presented his blueprint May 9, 1950, he said the pooling of French and German heavy industry would make another war between the two countries "not only unthinkable, but impossible."

The set of getting together the heavy industry resources of a six-nation community of 160 million Europeans was as radical as anything Europe has known since the industrial revolution changed the face of the world.

Cosmic Rays Are Counted By Explorer

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12—Dr. James Van Allen says the Explorer satellite's cosmic ray counters are "measuring beautiful things."

"We're waiting around in data up to our ankles," he said. Van Allen, the physicist who equipped the Explorer, told the congressional atomic energy committee yesterday the Explorer keeps recording an average of 100 cosmic particles which strike it in a code known world-wide.

But he added that it will be a couple of months before a chart showing the incidence of cosmic rays in the satellite's "belt" between latitudes 34 north and south can be completed.

He said scientists hope that "a great outburst of solar activity" like an extreme outpouring of sun-spots will come along before the end of the Explorer's two batteries expire and end radio messages probably April.

Asked whether any of the data from the two Russian Sputniks has been made available to him, Van Allen said he has been given 1 get such data from official channels and by writing letters but there has been "no genuine information from them as yet."

"It's fair to say," he said, the Russians may be taking a couple of months to organize the data that they have received.

W. A. Loughmiller, board chairman, says the contest is being held in all schools in the district. The posters must depict some phase of soil and water conservation, Loughmiller adds.

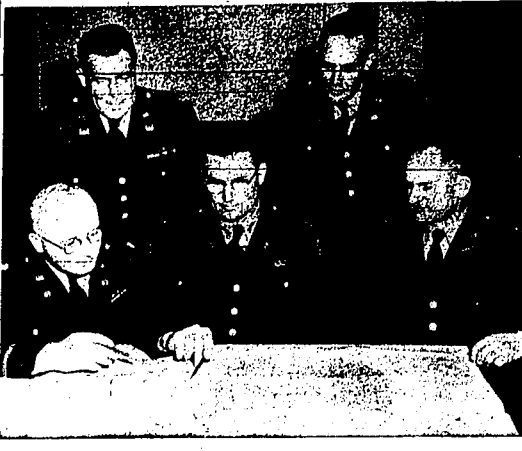

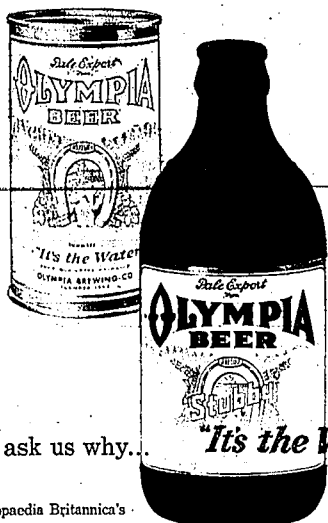
