

Many Vets to Pay More for GI Insurance

Nearly 3,000,000 World War I veterans who still have not converted their GI insurance to permanent policies will pay higher premiums and receive generally lower dividends every five years they receive their policies in the future, according to Arnold Helwege, local veterans administration representative.

Helwege points out this widening spread between premium cost and dividend return will result in a sharply higher net cost to the term policyholders with every five-year renewal.

"For that reason, World War I veterans who still have term policies should seriously consider converting to permanent plans of GI insurance with level, non-changing premiums and with only slight variations in dividend rates," Helwege says.

In addition to the virtually stationary net cost of permanent GI insurance plans, Helwege says term policies have certain values which term policies do not have, such as cash surrender value, loan value and extended insurance value. He says a term policy by contrast merely insures against death only as long as premiums are paid.

Term policies renewed at age 37 require a premium of \$7.00 a month for a \$10,000 policy, Helwege says. The current dividend return for this policy is \$3.50 a month, resulting in a net cost of \$2.40 per month to the policyholder.

When the veteran is 47 and his term policy is renewable for the second time in the 10-year period, the premium will rise to \$10.00 a month and the dividend return at the current rate will drop to \$3.00 a month, resulting in a net cost per month to the policyholder of \$4.00.

Helwege says, "This upward premium and downward dividend return will continue every five years until, at age 67, the premium cost will be \$17.00 a month and the dividend return, \$3 a month."

"The current dividend rates for term policies do change after age 67, but the premium rates continue to rise thereafter.

Helwege urged all World War I veterans who desire further information concerning conversion to write to the VA office to which they are paying premiums, or the VA central office at 219 Main avenue east.

NEW YORK, Feb. 13 (AP)—A new immunization vaccine which union newly put to America's physicians against diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough, and in some cases also against measles, mumps, and polio, is being urged by a physician who fears that many children are not immunized against these diseases.

The question was put by Dr. Robert A. Gerrick through the American Academy of General Practice, which he recalled two features of epidemic measles, mumps and polio which he said were the result of a survey of the children of 100 families in the city of New York.

More than half had had no vaccinations, less than one third were immunized against diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough, and the remainder were immunized against measles, mumps and polio.

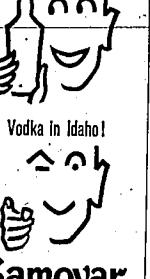

Expulsion for Pupil Sought In Little Rock

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Feb. 13 (AP)—The superintendent of Little Rock schools today sought permanent expulsion for two students—Miss Jean Brown from integrated Central high.

Super. Virgil T. Blossom at the same time said he had suspended the 16-year-old girl for two weeks for her part in two separate racist incidents last week at the forcibly-integrated school.

Blossom appealed to the school board late yesterday to expel the girl because of the incidents in which she has been involved.

Miss Jean was suspended from school once before, just before the Christmas holidays, for pouring chili on two white students. Altogether, she has been involved in five racial incidents at Central high.

Blossom, in a letter to the girl's parents, said Miss Jean had violated an agreement under which she was re-integrated in school after the chili-throwing incident.

She agreed not to "retaliate either verbally or physically to any harassment by other students, but to leave such things entirely up to the school authorities to handle," Blossom said.

Last week Miss Jean was hit with a purse after calling a white girl "poochie" while trash, and a white boy poured a bowl of soup over her head in the school cafeteria.

The Negro girl's mother said she would protest Blossom's request for permanent suspension of her daughter, if she does not, his request will automatically be followed through.

Miss Lucy Baker, president of the Arkansas NAACP chapter, and Clarence A. Latta, Dallas, Southwest region NAACP representative, issued a joint statement praising Blossom's decision.

"After all," they said, "school officials were totally aware of the intensity of the harassment against Miss Jean—... the school board even admitted she was provoked to the verbal retaliation for which expulsion is now recommended."

Budget's Cost For American Family Listed

NEW YORK, Feb. 12—What will the record 74 billion dollar budget for fiscal 1939 actually cost you and your family?

The Tax foundation figures that it will cost the average family with an income of \$5,000 about \$600—or 16 per cent of the family's annual earnings.

National defense is by far the biggest single item in the budget, accounting for 40% of the total. The next biggest single item—\$85—will go for interest on the federal debt.

Approximately 24 of the average family's federal tax burden will be spent for veterans services and benefits, while \$50 is earmarked for agriculture and agricultural resources.

The foundation also listed the following spending categories and what they will cost your family:

- Labor and welfare, \$39
- Commerce and housing, \$18
- General government, \$15
- Natural resources, \$10
- International affairs and finances, \$14
- Allowance for contingencies, \$10

This adds up to a total of \$300 for the average family, excluding social security taxes. State and local taxes will make the tax load even heavier.

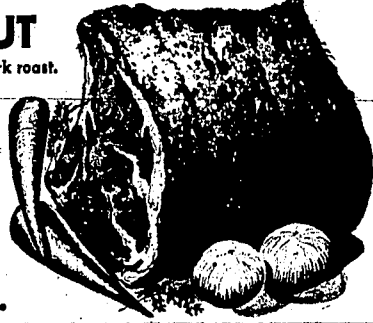

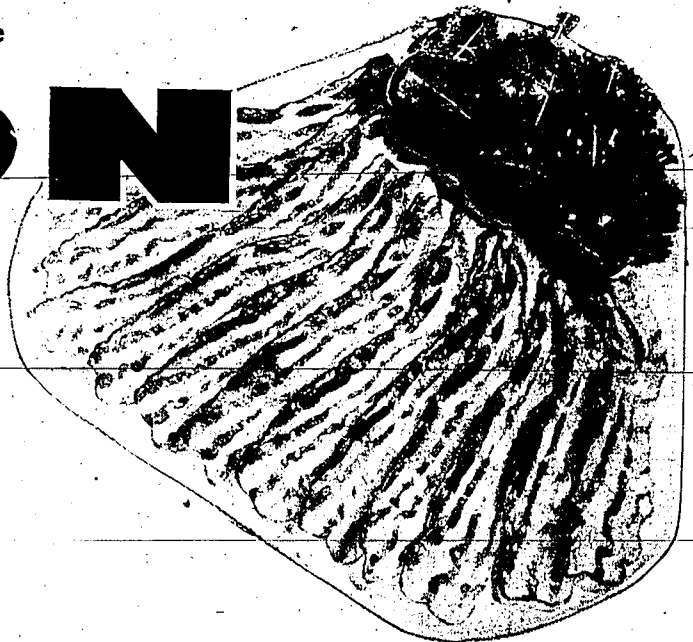

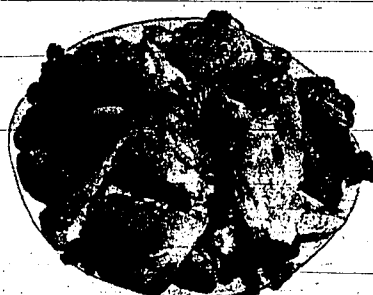
