Rescuers Battle Blizzard To Reach 8 Survivors of Air Tragedy Fatal to 34

BOLTON, England, Feb. 27.—A chartered British airliner with 42 persons aboard smashed against a snow-covered mountain today, only five minutes from its destination. A policeman at the scene said 34 persons perished. An injured stewardess, the only woman among the 42, struggled through knee-deep snow to a television relay station on top of the mountain and gasped out the first word of the disaster. Helicopters, snow teams and mountain rescue teams sped through a blizzard to the scene. The twin-engine Bristol Wayfarer operated by Silver City airways, was carrying automobile dealers from the Isle of Man in the Irish sea on a one-day junket to Manchester, only 15 miles from here, to inspect a plant of the Eagle Battery company.

Midwest Is Facing Blizzards as South Lists Tornado Toll

Blizzard warnings were issued today for parts of a vast storm system that brought killer tornadoes into Mississippi last night. The weather bureau's forecast center at Kansas City posted blizzard warnings for today and tonight in central Nebraska, east and central South Dakota, most of North Dakota and northwest Minnesota. The blizzard punched into Minot, N. D., and disrupted communications in several areas of the plains states. Schools in northeast Kansas were closed as a driving light snow made travel hazardous. Motorists were warned to stay out of roads in parts of North Dakota where there was an accumulation of six to eight inches of snow.

At least 13 persons were killed and about 100 persons seriously injured in the Mississippi twisters. In Louisiana, a train was derailed and another hit in Louisiana. Among the blizzard victims was a 10-year-old Negro woman.

Long Dream On Adoption Is Successful

EAST ST. LOUIS, Ill., Feb. 27.—Two Yugoslav children adopted by Francis J. Skye as far as they could, with his 5-year-old daughter have finally arrived—12 years later.

As a result of an act of congress plus the efforts of Rep. Melvin Price, D. Ill., and Bishop Albert R. Zurowette of the Methodist Catholic diocese, to bring the family together.

Meanwhile, Skye's daughter, Patricia, turned 18 and the Yugoslav youngsters reached their teens.

Undaunted by years of effort, the Skye family today began English lessons for Thomas Markovic, 16, and his sister, Michelle, 17.

"They'll enroll in school as soon as possible and go as far as they can," said proud father Skye. "I started English lessons for them this morning."

His first triumph of the plight of the Markovic children in 1924 from their grandmother and his neighbor, Mrs. Sophie Woodside. She said the father narrowly escaped execution under the communist regime and was willing to let the Thomas Markovic come to America to live.

Skye said it proved possible to get them out of Yugoslavia but nearly impossible to get them into the United States.

Time, he decided, wasn't going to defeat him. He began writing to the Markovic family, along with plenty of encouragement.

In the course of slow-moving events, Price, the congressman from East St. Louis, heard from Skye. The two met in Washington, Feb. 22, and dedicated to enlarging the Skye family if he took an act of congress.

It did. On July 16, 1937, a special bill was passed authorizing Thomas and Michelle the naturalized American children of Skye.

614 more names passed before the growth-up children could enter the United States. They arrived at St. Louis last Monday.

But Skye has gotten used to red tape and apparently can't get along without it. He has had to wait for his work as an orthopedist, but now is embarking on another project—to bring the Markovic parents to the country.

Figure Reported For Milk Subsidy

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27.—The department of agriculture is willing to pay \$121,000 into hot lunches and extra milk for Idaho school youngsters, Gen. Henry Dornack reported yesterday.

Dornack said \$7,000 Idaho school children in 47 schools will be the benefit of three programs. The senator said the schools will get a total of \$40,000 from the hot lunch program; \$473,000 worth of surplus agricultural commodities and \$101,000 worth extra milk.

The senator said this program, coupled with the milk program for the armed forces and school children, "certainly represents good use of our agricultural surplus."

4 Dead in Crash Of Bomber Plane

A court spokesman said the Shah and Queen Soraya planned to visit the United States after a two-week tour of Formosa and Japan in May.

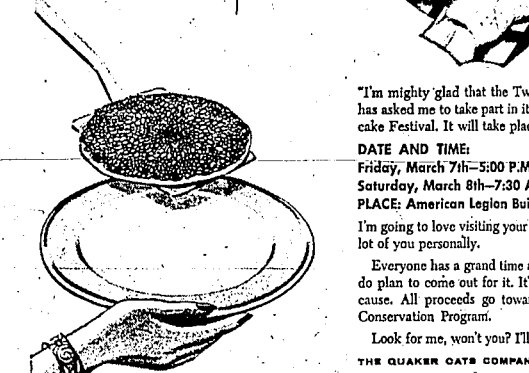

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27 (AP)—The house has voted 20 million dollars in new appropriations for the Trinity river project in California and the Olin canyon project in Utah and Colorado.

It added the money in approving a \$2,877,887,907 supplemental appropriation bill.

Several Republicans from southern California, including Reps. Craig Hooper, Bob Wilson and James D. Utt, voted against the supplemental appropriation.

But Rep. Patrick J. Hillings, R., Calif., who is running for attorney general in California, voted for it.

The house action climaxed a long dispute over supplemental funds for the two projects.

Rep. Clarence Cannon, D. Mo., chairman of the appropriations committee, recently criticized the interior department for its scheduling of water on the two projects.

The committee said that congress should not appropriate new money for them. It said the department should keep them going with funds it is not using on other projects.

The appropriations committee then approved a million-dollar continued work on the Trinity river project and 10 million dollars for the Olin canyon project.

However, the committee specified the money was to be taken from other interior department funds, it was not counted as a new appropriation.

But this provision was eliminated from the bill, Rep. William A. Dawson, R., Utah, then introduced an amendment providing for an outright appropriation of 20 million dollars for the two projects.

Then the house voted 200 to 184 in favor of the new appropriation.

Record Set in Farmers' Per Capita Funds

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27 (AP)—The agriculture department yesterday announced per capita income of farmers in 1957 was a record \$993, up 10 per cent from the \$902 calculated for 1956.

This sharp per capita increase was accounted for almost wholly by a decrease in population.

The department said the decline in population was due to the fact that after production expenses are paid, "more than had been anticipated previously."

The per capita income included about one billion dollars in direct payments to the farm community.

The department also released the number of farms by size during 1957, showing a downward trend in number of farms continued.

The department said that the estimated 4,858,800 farms in operation in 1957 represented a 23 per cent decrease from 1956.

Farms in operation in 1958 included: Mountain area—187,200 (Montana, 24,800; Idaho, 39,200; Wyoming, 11,600; Colorado, 42,600; New Mexico, 12,000; Arizona, 10,000; Utah, 21,000; and Nevada, 3,100).

Solon Pledges To Fight Cuts In U. S. Guard

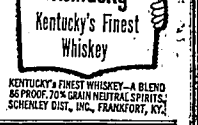

Trouble Piles Up in French African Crisis

By United Press
France is facing a critical situation in North Africa. It is embroiled in a serious dispute with Tunisia, its former protectorate, over the bombing of Tunisian cities near the Algerian frontier. It has come under severe criticism by the United States because some of the planes used in the bombing were the planes used in the bombing of the Algerian area in Europe. The state department says the planes were supplied solely to the North Atlantic treaty for use in the Algerian area. The rebels have opened a new offensive and have engaged French forces in four sectors.

Evreux La Cause
The Algerian revolt, of course, lies behind the entire situation and behind most of France's present grave trouble. France and Tunisia accepted the optimistic "good offices" of the United States and Great Britain in the Tunisian dispute.

Robert Murphy, deputy undersecretary of state, is now in Tunisian contact with President Habib Bourguiba.

Murphy is a diplomatic "trouble-shooter" of note. But he seems to be faced with an almost impossible task in attempting to bring France and Tunisia together.

Offshoot of Rebellion
The bombing of the Tunisian village of Sakel Gidi Yousef was an offshoot of the Algerian rebellion. French commandos ordered the bombing after rebel machine guns had fired on French troops repeatedly over a period of months from the rooftop of the Tunisian government administrative building in the village.

President Bourguiba now insists that Murphy must go to the entire Algerian issue in his attempt to negotiate.

Gen. Felix Gaillard of France is desperately to keep Algeria out of international politics, rejects that demand.

Algeria is not, as were Tunisia and Morocco, a French protectorate. It is politically a part of France, but has representation in the French parliament. Hence Gaillard holds that Algeria is purely of internal French concern.

But every attempt to end the revolt has broken on Nov. 1, 1954, has failed.

Fall to Crush Rebels
Upwards of 50,000 French troops have failed to crush the rebels. Legislation providing for a large number of home rule for Algeria has failed to provide a way out.

For one thing, the rebels demand outright independence. For another, Algerians friendly to France are afraid to cooperate in any attempt to operate home rule machinery because it would subject them and their families to the danger of murder by the rebels.

Finally, there is serious division among French leaders in Paris over the extent of home rule to be granted.

Trouble-shooter Murphy is quoted as expressing optimism over his chance of arranging an agreement between Tunisia and France. If he succeeds, he will be a diplomatic miracle man.

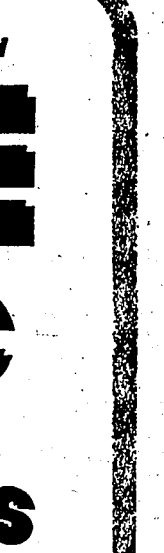

Canadian Fishing Is at Its Best, Report 3 Local Salmon Anglers

Salmon fishing in Canada is at its best now, reports Kenneth Webb, local sportsman, who with his father, George Webb, and Nick Moss returned Tuesday with nine of British Columbia's fightingest, and far-fetched as fishing on the coast seems at first glance, Webb reports it is well within the budget of the average Magic Valley fisherman who can take a five day furlough from his work.

In Canada on Vancouver Island for about \$10 per day. "A man can get by on \$10 per day not counting traveling expenses," Webb reports. "It takes about two days to get there as you have to shuttle to the island by ferry. The boat from Seattle makes the trip only once per day."

The three men took all the fish species offered in the short-trip streams on the island. These included spring, ranging from 15 to 20 pounds and five salmon, which are called chinook in this country. The two types are the same, weighing being reserved for salmon weighing over 20 pounds. The other three are coho, blue black and jack.

Rain and killer whales were the two big foes encountered on the trip. In the short-run rivers, rain raises the water, driving the salmon back into the ocean and the trio hit the island during the "monsoons," a small passing over every day.

The killer whales had spotted ocean fishing but Webb reports they look a few blue blacks by fishing deep. An oiltimer on the islands told the trio it had missed one of the big sights by only a few days. That was during the visitation of the killer whales.

The whales form a semi-circle around a bay, centering around a leader and "chase" the salmon toward fresh water. The run begins when the whale on the left, always the left one, raises out of the water. Then as the circle is completed, the right whale raises and the two "wings" strike the water with their tails. On that signal, the entire pack races and then submerges for the kill.

But between the rain and killer whales, the three fishermen got in some good fishing. The first day, Moss hooked a steelhead on his first cast but before long rain had washed out the entire day, which was spent sightseeing.

The next three days provided good fishing although interrupted by the squalls. On the third day, Webb found again that he can't lose his fishing pole. Two years ago his favorite rod and reel was stolen without a trace. But Webb recovered it shortly after on a trip to Danger falls on the Salmon river. After packing into the primitive area, he discovered his pole and line baited and ready for action leaning against a rock.

In Canada, Webb walking along a little-used logging road, hid his pole and equipment while he went down to the car and his companions. After returning with the car, Webb discovered his cache had been found and the equipment was missing.

On returning to Paradise, he called the Mounties to report the loss, only to find out the local constabulary had recovered the equipment 20 minutes earlier. "Finding a stream to fish is a simple matter as ever the amateur cranks have a salmon run of sorts. But through the information provided by two friends who live in the area, the Twin Falls contingent hit all the "hot spots."

Chuck Roasts, Fowl Listed as Buyer Choice

By The Associated Press
Housewives heard by record high prices will find two old bargain favorites, chuck roast and chicken, at special prices in many supermarkets and neighborhood groceries this week.

Chuck was selling at 49 cents a pound and chicken at 45 cents a pound in some stores in the New York area. This was a far cry from the 80's or 90's and veal chops at \$1.19 a pound.

Veal prices were up 4 to 8 cents a pound this week and rib roasts and piglet also were higher in scattered areas.

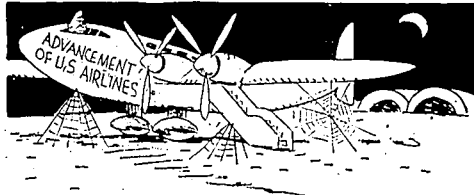
Prices were higher by 2 to 8 cents a pound in most areas, but prices are expected to turn around shortly as cold weather abates and herds begin to increase their output.

Fruit and vegetable prices remained higher than normal again but are expected to start planting bigger crops earlier than usual to cash in on current high prices and some growers of winter vegetables are trying to get seeds to late in the season. Prices are likely to go down again when these crops start reaching market.

For the present, however, heretics are hard to find among fresh produce. Potatoes and onions, although higher in price than a week ago, are reported to be the best available among vegetables. This is partly an example of items undamaged by weather and partly because shoppers still they buying from the frozen-out vegetable.

Celery, carrots, lettuce and broccoli are fairly good buys, produce men say. Cabbage also is trending lower again as the storage crop is augmented by new offerings from California, Texas, Florida and Arizona, plus some imported white cabbage, turnips, parsley, asparagus, mushrooms and cucumbers are moderately priced. So are imported peas from Mexico.

Apples remain the best buy in the fruit department. Grapenfruit is down a bit but oranges slightly lower, but still higher than their normal February figures. A one-third drop in the California crop plus heavier purchases by wineries, have pushed raisin prices up, too.
