Korean Reds One Of Sky; Miss One

OSAN AIR BASE, Korea, March 6 (AP)—Communist anti-aircraft guns today shot down a U.S. jet P-80 Sabrejet and barely missed knocking a second American jet fighter out of the sky, it was reported. The American planes were attacked near the demilitarized zone. The demilitarized zone between north and south Korea is 4,000 meters, or slightly less than 2 1/2 miles, wide. The pilot of the second P-80 reported that the aircraft was hit and he ejected himself and was last seen drifting down by parachute into communist territory.

Hospital Vote Dr. Gordon Oldham, 47, Dies of Leukemia

Chinese Reds Mix New Hate For Catholics

HONG KONG, March 4—The latest Communist campaign to terrorize the Roman Catholic Church in China is reaching a climax. In recent weeks the Communist press has been flooded with reports of meetings held in at least six provinces of the People's Republic of China to discuss the "harmful" influence of the Catholic Church. The theme of these meetings has been "over political and economic ties with the Vatican." More specifically, the so-called association has attacked the Catholic Church in China as a tool of imperialism and the tool of the Communist party as patriotic Chinese.

New Blows Planned
 There has been little of a strict religious element involved. There is talk which could be construed as demands for renunciation of the Catholic religion—that is, not in so many words.

It is apparent that new blows will be struck at bishops, priests and nuns who refuse to accept the Communist church which in some instances has appointed new bishops. These bishops and any Catholics who accept them as such, are "a matter for excommunication." However, according to Catholic sources here, the Vatican has been cautious in this respect because so much of the information against these clerics comes from official Communist channels.

Of the some 3,000,000 Catholics practicing their faith in China, some have been jailed or sent to labor camps. Only seven Chinese clergymen still are in China, and four of those are in jail.

Penson Sees Slight Aid to Small Farms

(From Page One)

...to competitive products. Penson on the 54 per cent of our farms (1940) cash income of less than \$1,000 get little benefit, if any, from various support programs.

To deal with these difficulties we are continuing to push forward along the lines of market expansion, increased freedom for farmers to sell their own decisions, and real aid to people in underdeveloped rural areas.

These are the aims of the farm and soil conservation program presented to the congress by President Eisenhower in January.

Here is what the program will do:

1. It will develop bigger markets by putting our abundance to better use. The agricultural trade development and assistance act has been a major factor in our widening export markets. We have asked that it be expanded for a year with an additional appropriation of \$1,000,000. Research on new uses of farm products and more effective marketing is vital to agricultural progress. Since 1933 appropriations for agricultural research have exceeded 50 per cent, and we are asking for a further increase.
2. The program will allow farmers more freedom to use their own resources. We are seeking authority to increase acreage allotments that now are so small as to hamper farm efficiency. We urge a revision and wider range of price supports to expand markets.
3. The program will push forward the necessary long range conservation effort. We propose to strengthen the conservation reserve program by putting the soil bank in the interests of overall production adjustment.
4. The program will help provide opportunity for economic betterment in underdeveloped rural areas. We have urged that the rural development program, now operating in about 100 counties in 30 states, be given increased emphasis.

Bigger markets, more freedom for farmers to produce, sound conservation and production adjustment, and special help to those on low income farms—these are vital steps that will lead to a sound solution of the farm problem and the development of a truly prosperous, expanding, and free agriculture.

Forest Access Roads Sought In 15 Forests

WASHINGTON, March 5 (Special)—An investment of 16 million dollars in timber access roads in Idaho and Utah national forests is urged today by Sen. Henry Dornbak, R., Id., and supported by Rep. Henry A. Dixon, R., Utah.

Dornbak said the money, spent over the next four years, would create 21 million dollars into the state treasury and provide hundreds of jobs in the area, as well as support local tax monies.

The senator said a report from the U.S. Forest Service Chief, Richard H. Anderson, indicated only 611 million feet of an allowable 910.6 million feet of harvest were permitted in the forests concerned last year.

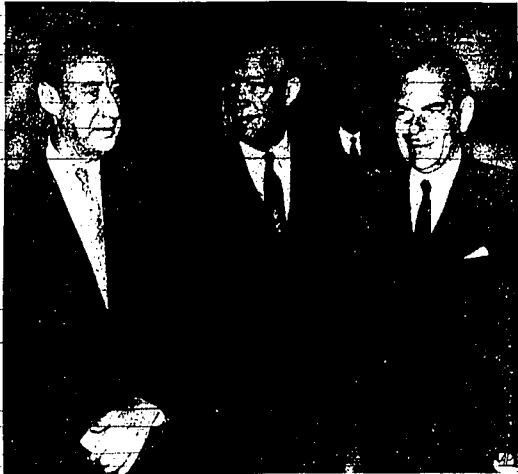
Over 1,500 miles of access roads needed in Idaho to harvest the timber, Dornbak said. The 16 million dollar cost would be more than recovered by the sale of the timber, in addition to which local areas would benefit from tax receipts on the private producers.

Representative Dixon backed the road extension plan for the Utah forests, and indicated that forest access roads were behind the development of them elsewhere in the West.

Figures show "up to 200,000" board feet of allowable lumber was not harvested in 1957. Estimated value of the unharvested timber was set at \$2,000,000 for the year.

"As second growth timber country grows, the roads would be an additional cost," Dornbak said. "The forest service has established about 600 miles of construction or reconstruction a year, which is not enough to harvest the allowable."

Lamb and pork steal the spotlight from beef in many of the national supermarkets and neighborhood grocery stores this week.

Both meats showed lower prices in scattered sections. In reductions of 2 to 4 cents a pound. This is in line with government forecasts that meat prices will be lower this spring. Leg of lamb seems to be the most popular cut for that meat, and smoked hams are the most numerous pork item.

Fish Getting Flap
With the Lenten season in full swing, fish items such as salmon, orange stew, shrimp and scallops also are getting a flap. Cold storage holdings Jan. 1 totalled 183,500,000 pounds, of 1,200,000 pounds from a week earlier, the bureau of fisheries reported.

Flourider, sardines, shrimp, spring chickens, tuna, and whiting were more plentiful than in 1935, while lower holdings were reported for cod, haddock and ocean perch fillets, salmon and fish sticks.

KEEP UP SHARPLY
The Lenten season also affects egg prices, which are up sharply again this week. Demand always picks up at this time of year and recent extremely cold weather and snow cut down supplies in two ways. Transportation of eggs was delayed and hens laid fewer eggs. This week's advances of 4 to 6 cents a dozen may be repeated next week, trade circles say, but after that prices should drop.

Readily available weather arrivals. Outstanding buys are hard to find in vegetable departments, but good buys are available in carrots, spinach and broccoli. Carrots in bunches and bags are down markedly this week, poultry men say.

Lettuce, celery fairly good. Lettuce and celery are fairly good buys, but somewhat irregular in quality and condition so that careful selection is necessary. Collards, mustard greens, kale and turnip tops are in about the same category—so is cauliflower, which came down in price a bit.

California asparagus is still on the high side, although supplies are increasing. The recent rise in cabbage prices abated this week. Apples still head the best buy list in fruits.

Prices on Florida oranges and grapefruit receded still further this week, although temple oranges are reported irregular in quality. California navel oranges and lemons are plentiful and fairly reasonably priced.

NEW YORK, March 6—The boss is the boss again.

The downturn in jobs has made the forgotten business of business a person of importance once more. It always happens that way.

When there are more jobs than people, nobody pays much attention to the boss. He lipices around the place talking to the piece falling to the floor.

But when there are more people than jobs — the boss again becomes industry's "father-in-law". The problem of the wise worker then becomes one of how to please his paycheck pappy.

So it is time to revive again a forgotten American art — the art of apple polishing.

Louise Shaddock Picked to Speak

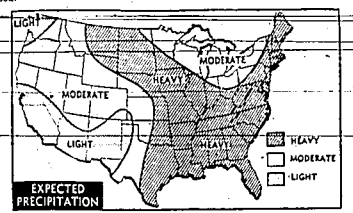

More than 300 high school students from around the state are expected for the two-day conference March 21 and 22 in the Student Union building.

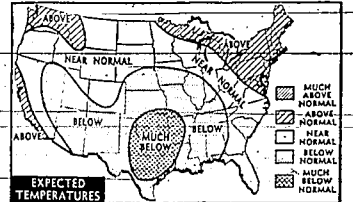
At an evening banquet March 21, Mrs. Shaddock will outline the contemporary subject possibilities for Idaho writers and the aid they may obtain from the state office.

STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKE

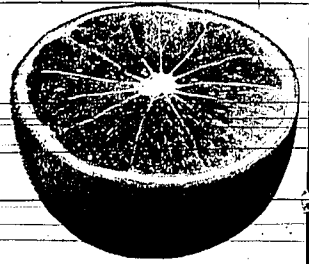
