





### Gore Predicts Federal Boost In Road Plans

WASHINGTON, March 10 (AP)—Senator Gore, D., Tenn., predicted Saturday the federal government will pass a highway bill in the next few months sharply boosting public funds for roadbuilding projects over the nation.

Gore, chairman of the senate public works subcommittee, plans to get the bill out of the senate committee this week. He said the bill will be passed by an affirmative vote of 70-20, he said before a reporter. The bill is to start April 1.

Eyes March 11 Date

Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon Johnson of Texas said Friday he hoped the highway legislation would reach the floor during the week of March 11.

Gore has introduced his own bill to accelerate highway construction. The bill would contain the main features of his measure although he has "talked" with the secretary of commerce.

Secretary of Commerce Wm. C. Clegg has been invited to give the senate his views on the bill at a public hearing Tuesday.

The Tennessee senator said he had been some indication the administration might offer a proposal of its own to speed up road work.

**Bipartisan Program**

The highway program always has been bipartisan and Gore said he is keen to "take care" of it. He warmly welcomes suggestions from any quarter.

Gore's bill would provide the extra billion dollars of federal-aid financing needed to complete on its original 1954 schedule the 41,000-mile program. As the law now stands, this program will be stretched out to 25 years.

Gore's measure also would make available \$500 million dollars in federal money at once for other Washington-aided road systems—the primary, farm-to-market and urban routes. Half of this would be in loans to the states.

Another provision is that Gore said he believed would win Republican support on the public works committee.

This would put the extra 1,000 miles added to the interstate system of superhighways in the highway act on an equal footing with the other 40,000 miles and make it possible to observe in 1958 the 1954 law did not provide financing for the 1,000 miles so that construction was left to the tail end of the program.

### Fish Concern Solon in Dam Bill Proposal

WASHINGTON, March 10 (U.P.)—The lowly fish may get an indirect voice in congress in the future when a bill for construction of Pacific Northwest dam building, Senator Magnuson's bill, is introduced. It is proposed to amend the act to provide for a bill. The amendment would provide for the construction of a particular dam would be built on fish habitat. A bill offered by Senator DeBenedictis, D. Ore., would require that the federal government acquire interior department and fish and wildlife service approval for any river dam.

The senator said such a dam would block salmon spawning runs.

**Proposes Year's Study**  
A power commission attorney suggested congress be given a year in which to act on a dam project. If no action were taken in that year, the PFC would be allowed to make a home across the river. Power industry witnesses have told the senate commerce subcommittee they oppose the bill. The Oregon water resources board and other agencies have suggested that fish and game studies and findings should be specifically considered in licensing dams.

### Slump Spells Labor Rows, Says Official

WASHINGTON, March 10 (U.P.)—The government's chief labor mediator has told congress the economic recession "spells trouble" on the labor front. The official, Joseph P. Hinegan, said industry-wide strikes caused "severe dislocation of our industrial economy" may result from "unimpaired demand on automobile, aircraft and other big industries." See Deenybrook.

"There is practically unanimous agreement on the part of labor and management people that we are in for a bit of a 'donnybrook' on the labor front. It has all the makings of more industrial conflict than we have had for the last five to seven years."

Hinegan is director of the federal mediation and conciliation service. He testified at a closed budget hearing before a house appropriations subcommittee Feb. 6. The subcommittee made the testimony public today.

Hinegan said labor found it "easy enough to get increases of five cents, 10 cents, 15 cents (an hour) in an expanding, booming economy." But he said the business slump has created "quite a different story" and "stiff management opposition to pay boosts."

**"A Nest Trick"**  
"Trying to extract a dime when times are good may not be any great trick," he said. "But trying to extract a dime plus from a fellow who is looking at his income statement and sees his sales and profits falling off, and with things in general not too hot, that is going to be a 'nest trick.'"

On the other hand, he said, labor unions whose contracts are up for renewal are going to be taking an adamant stand because four million workers this year are scheduled to receive pay boosts averaging about nine cents an hour that were negotiated last year.

Hinegan said labor unions which have wide open contracts up for negotiation this year "are going to have to at least match what the other union leaders have already made."
