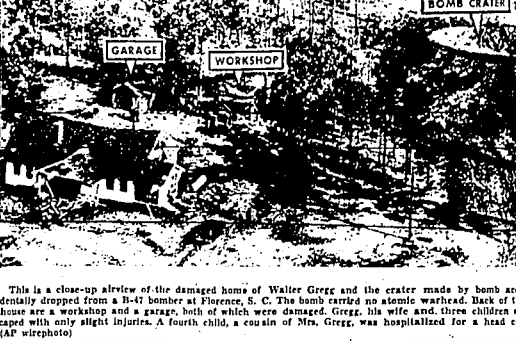

 this base was found by the commission to be \$25 per cent.
 "Out of every dollar of increased rates the public utility commission will receive less than 40 cents as additional net earnings," said the commission. It also recommended that the company should carry a somewhat higher debt ratio than the 21.1 per cent. reported by the company witness as the percentage of capital obligations in debt or borrowed money as of last July.
 Rulon Larsen, PUC utilities director, said at the hearing the commission could improve the rate without raising rates quite as much if the company's debt ratio were increased to 40 or 45 per cent.
 "The utilities commission also voted Mountain States to notify us when the number of stations in any telephone exchange increases or decreases enough to move the exchange into a different rate group. If the exchange stays in the new group for four months the approval of the rate is final. If it is in effect on 30 days notice to the commission."
 The rates authorized Thursday go into effect in 30 days on service through some 15 central offices which serve more than 16,000 telephone numbers in southern Idaho.
 A number of protests to higher rates were presented at hearings in Boise on Nov. 13 and Jan. 14 and in Pocatello Dec. 3.
 The commission noted that General Manager Heckman had described the company's improvement program as designed to eliminate objections on quality of service.
 Respected objections from farmers and agriculturists groups that the Idaho exchange would not support the rate increase, the commission said.
 "While farm income is not at the level desired, rates for telephone service should be placed in the level that income."
 The commission noted the company to submit a revised schedule of rates based on the lower total annual increase.

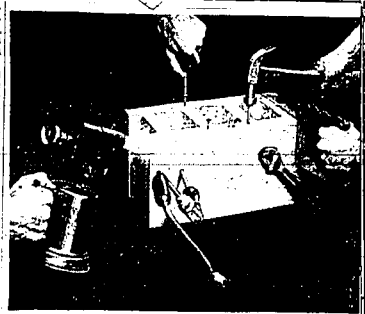
