More Outlays On Anti-Subs Plans Sought

WASHINGTON, March 18 (AP)—Secretary of Defense Charles E. Wilson called yesterday for a \$1.1 billion in additional funds for research and development work on anti-submarine warfare.

The Washington Democrat said that the House subcommittee testimony before his house-armed forces subcommittee should emphasize critical research development programs now going on slowly or not being carried on because of lack of funds.

Wilson made the statement after all-day, closed-door hearings of the subcommittee with Navy research reports, including Rear Adm. Hyman G. Rickover, father of the atomic submarine, and Rear Adm. Hanson Bennett, chief of naval research.

Wilson said in a statement that the Navy has more than 500 submarines, while the United States has only 100.

"We know that the Soviets now have the capability of launching missiles with nuclear warheads at least 500-mile range against our cities," Jackson said. "We must presume that the Soviets will soon have 'secret-powered' submarines."

Isolationism Pressure Growth Seen as Result of New Missile

WASHINGTON, March 18 (AP)—This country became fully intent on effort to keep the non-communist isolationist after being banished out of part of the world away from communism by World War II. But, the same for the military what happens when it develops the alliances which are the ICBM—the intercontinental ballistic missile.

This is something not being talked about much now, but it seems inevitable that the time this country has a financial produce will increase when the ICBM makes this country less dependent on its allies.

This country, with hydrocarbon load, ICBM's could stand behind the developing hostility to the United States of the Atlantic and Pacific and hit an enemy anywhere overseas.

It was only eight years ago that former President Hoover said America's defense lines should be the Atlantic and Pacific and be urged caution.

Whether any real isolationism could prevail again in this country is questionable because it might mean the loss of the non-communist world to the Soviets. That in turn might make it impossible for this country to survive alone.

Since World War II, neither Democratic and Republican administrations—the United States not only has formed military alliances around the world, neither the aid nor the alliance program is unbreakable.

Civilian Gets Court's Okay In Race Case

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., March 18.—The Arkansas supreme court Monday afternoon yesterday granted a man who refused to budge when ordered to keep moving by federal troops national guard during last fall's integration crisis at Central high school.

The court ruled that a civilian cannot be convicted for defying an order from an army officer, thus disarming charges against Vernon M. Duncan.

Duncan had refused to move when federal troops led a crowd in front of Central high during the mob action which followed the integration of this Negro student into the school.

A majority opinion by Justice Sam Robinson said there was no state law making it a criminal offense for persons to refuse to obey orders of a United States army officer. However, the court by-passed ruling on whether President Eisenhower had the authority to send troops to Little Rock.

Duncan was acquitted in Little Rock after a trial in which he was charged with disturbing the peace, but convicted on another charge of refusing to obey the order to move from the area adjacent to the school.

Kenneth Coffey, Duncan's attorney, said he was disappointed the court failed to pass on validity of the President's order. "They could have decided it," he charged.

Tranquilizers for Animal Effective
LOS ANGELES, March 18 (AP)—Now comes tranquilizing drugs for animals.

Two veterinarians, W. E. Snyder and S. C. Wazman, say the soothing pills result in better cattle, more eggs and fatter hogs.

Cattle who normally fret away valuable pounds while being shipped to market are calm and happy with the drug, the veterinarians said Friday at a symposium. Nervous chickens raise better eggs with cheerful regularity.

Wazman, of Miami Beach, Fla., and Snyder of Huddell, Idaho, also reported that deer, tranquilized by being shot with darts, can be herded to market without getting caulked. Any aggressive dogs can be made to keep their teeth out of the door.

Shorter 'Life' Predicted for Rocket Stage

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla., March 18 (AP)—The new Vanguard satellite circling the Earth is expected to last only by several years a "bonna" satellite that is trailing it, scientists report today.

When America's 64-inch aluminum baby moon was blasted into orbit yesterday morning, the third stage of the Vanguard rocket that launched it went into orbit a short distance behind the sphere.

The little satellite sending radio signals back to Earth as it whirls across the skies, is expected to remain in orbit 10 years.

But the burned-out rocket stage can be expected to fall back into the dense atmosphere and disintegrate long before the satellite proper comes down, technicians said.

How long the far bigger and heavier rocket third stage will remain up cannot be estimated accurately on the basis of information available so far, technicians here said, but they guessed it will maintain its orbit for at least several months.

An informed source said that because of its great mass the third stage would sink closer and closer to the ground, and finally dip into the thick air close to the Earth and burn up.

The third stage weighs about 50 pounds and is about seven feet long and 18 inches in diameter. The satellite itself—about the size of a grapefruit—is 64 inches in diameter and weighs 21 pounds.

In order to put the satellite into orbit the final stage of the three-stage Vanguard had to push the shiny little sphere to a speed of 18,000 miles an hour some 400 miles above the Earth. When orbital speed was reached, the satellite was sprung free from the third stage, but the burned-out solid fuel rocket also had achieved an orbit and trailed along just behind the satellite.

The deaths brought the avalanche toll this year to 11.

Moon Travel Certain, Says Firm Leader

REDLANDS, Calif., March 18 (AP)—This nation could mark the moon with a cluster of rockets like the third stage which pushed the Vanguard into space a rocket expert said yesterday.

"The practically of reaching the moon now is a certainty," Charles E. Bartley, president of the Grand Central Rocket company, said yesterday.

Bartley's company supplied the third-stage, solid-propellant rockets which allowed the nation's second satellite into orbit around Earth.

"A compact cluster of these third-stage Vanguard rockets, in a very simple assembly, could land a marker on the moon at a cost of about what one television set pays to broadcast the annual Rose Bowl football classic," he said.

"And we must remember that this particular rocket was designed and developed with propellant and hardware that existed in the fall of 1955."

Describing a flight to the moon as a scientific must, Bartley, former Caltech jet propulsion laboratory physicist, said the problem of hitting had been solved in the light of hitting the moon for months.

"The scientific knowledge by a hundred years," he said.

"There never has been any cause to doubt the ultimate effectiveness of the Vanguard, Bartley said.

Dvorak declared that the manipulations of broker in eastern markets had depressed prices paid to Idaho onion growers.

"They buy and sell the same car of onions so many times it looks like there are more onions available than really are shipped, and this serves to cut the price to our onion people," he declared.

Study Subversives

NEW YORK, March 18 (AP)—A five-year investigation of subversive influences in New York city's five municipal colleges has resulted in the departure of 39 staff members whose cases were under active study.

The inquiry, which formally ends March 31, was handled by a committee of the board of high education. Of 6,500 college staff members, names of 122 were presented to the board. Thirty-nine were dismissed, reprimanded, or resigned; 83 were cited; 18 left their jobs before they could be questioned, and two cases still are pending.

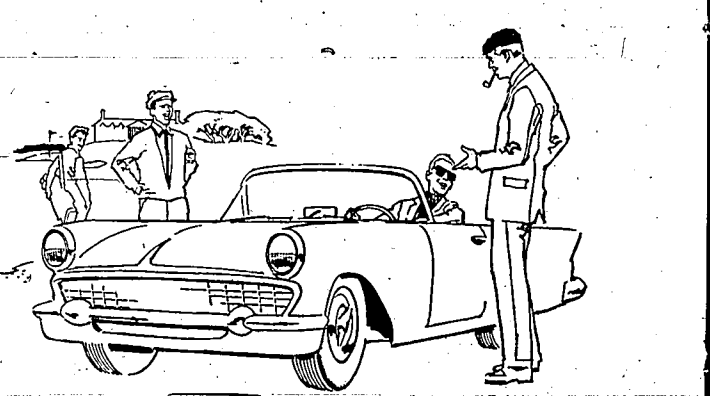
