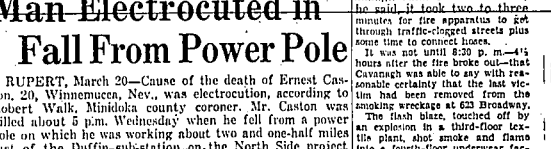
Charles Calvin Moore, former Idaho governor, is shown in a casket.

Special Levy Ballot Is Set In Minidoka

RUPERT, March 20—Election for a special two-mill plant facilities levy to furnish equipment for new classrooms at Park and Minidoka schools was set for 1 to 7 p.m. on April 11 by the Minidoka county school board.

The school budget was reviewed Monday night and the hearing set for 7 to 8 p.m. April 14 at the Minidoka school all-purpose room. The board will set the annual five-mill levy election date at that time.

A trustee election will be held with the five-mill election. The district No. 1, Heiburn area, and for trustee district No. 4, Rupert city area, according to school board member Leo H. Meyer. Leo H. Meyer is trustee from Heiburn and Henry Dockter from Rupert.

The bond facilities fund is estimated at \$21,000 per year for 10 years. Superintendent Meyer of the district seem to be uncertain as to how the district secured the \$25,000 for the 10-year addition at Park and the seven-room addition at Minidoka high school.

Money from the special two mill levy will be used to provide new furniture and equipment for the new Paul and high school additions. Meyer said the district has approved a federal building fund the board had to agree to provide equipment through local funds. At present equipment costs are estimated at \$1,000 per room with 15 classrooms to be added to the eight new rooms also will have to be furnished.

Funds also will be used to purchase school buses which have been bought through the general fund provided and to replace classrooms, ramp school playground areas and build a new athletic field at the high school.

Funds also are needed for creation of a reserve to assist in construction of badly needed school buildings in the near future, according to Superintendent Meyer.

Meyer said that any person may vote in the election who is a qualified elector of the district, a bona fide resident for more than 30 days and a taxpayer, or wife or husband of a taxpayer. A two-thirds majority is required. If the vote is approved the board will set up the levy for 10 years beginning on Sept. 1.

Writers, Composers Express Worry at Broadcast Controls

WASHINGTON, March 20—Mystery writer Rex Stout, creator of the secretary sleuth Nero Wolfe, told congress today the nation's broadcasters are getting away with murder.

The victim is music, for the present at least, Stout said. But he said other fields of creative activity may be marked for violence unless controls are enacted.

Stout said his arguments are not based on "hatred" and added: "If so much of BMI music were not so low, suggestive and anti-social, my deep concern about the misuse of the power of the broadcasting industry would be equally vigorous."

He said words, along with music, are racialist ingredients for broadcasting. What can prevent broadcast from buying up book publishing firms, magazines and the like? he asked.

"Who knows if this misuse of power will stop here?" he demanded. Eddie Dowling, whose varied career in show business has made him composer, author, actor, playwright and producer, said in a separate statement: "I don't think there is any question but that the networks, through their interlocking contracts are deciding what the public will hear."

Dowling, who wrote "Sidewalks of New York," "Do You Remember the Days" and other tunes and starred in a number of Broadway hits including "The Glass Menagerie" and "Autumn" was quoted as saying "an ominous parallel" between the "ominous" power of U. S. broadcasters and a dictator's control over what people hear.

Author Stout lined up with some writers, composers and others who have complained that broadcasters discriminate in favor of musical properties licensed by Broadcast Music, Inc. (BMI) which is owned by broadcasters.

"The broadcasting industry, Stout said, is abusing its public trust by 'exercising censorship and arbitrary control' over the American tradition of freedom of expression." He called it "a threat to creativity and authorship."

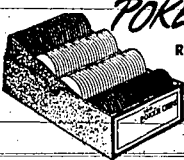

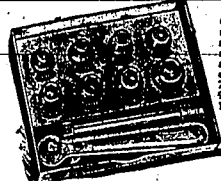

### Special Buys In Fish, Fowl Are Reported

By The Associated Press

Fish and fowl will take the place of meat on many dinner tables this week-end, judging by the specials to be featured in the nation's supermarkets and neighborhood grocery stores.

Variety is the key word in both cases. Fish offerings range from the less expensive snails and cod or haddock fillets to items such as scallops and shad or halibut steaks.

The persevering shopper can find just about any kind of fowl, too. Most stores these days sell chickens in parts, so the housewife can buy purchases to the family's preference. Some stores now offer a single price for broilers, stewing chickens, or fryers.

Beef prices were about unchanged this week, although the wholesale price went up again. Pork chops were higher in some areas, but eggs were down 2 to 3 cents a dozen in most places. A decline was about due, egg experts said, and from now on consumers should be progressively cheaper until hot weather hits and the hens lay fewer eggs. Then output will seem always down in extremely cold or hot weather.

Round steak or roast is most prominent among specials on beef, while picnic hams are the most prominent among pork cuts and leg of lamb is the most popular in that category.

Housewives can find good buys in potatoes, onions, spinach, carrots and broccoli to round out their meals. Potatoes are a bit higher as fall crop supplies gradually diminish and new potatoes begin to appear in most places. Onions also are mostly from storage crops, plus a few white bulbs from Mexico. Sweet potatoes are a fairly good buy.

In the same category are cabbage, another vegetable when the new crop is slow to replace last fall's, and asparagus. Fresh peas and green beans are rated fairly good buys by produce men.

Lettuce is sharply higher. Market men say it is because supplies from California "imperial valley" are tapering off and lettuce from Arizona and other sections of California is just getting started. Beans are still high with supplies increasing in a late Florida crop planned after the freeze there.

Wine and Delicious apples from western orchards are a good buy in fruit bins. Most of this eastern apples are tending to ripeness and irregular condition by now, except those from "controlled atmosphere" storage. Lemons are plentiful and attractively priced.

A few boxes of strawberries are available at fairly high prices, with a drop expected when the Louisiana crop starts coming in around April.

### Eat on 50 Cents Daily? BYU Coeds Show It Can Be Done

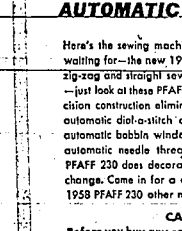

### Hardy Insects Earth's Heirs In A-Disaster

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., March 20 (AP)—If an atomic radiation disaster struck the world, what would survive? Insects, says Lt. Col. Samuel O. Hill.

They can survive 100 times the amount of radiation that humans and animals can take, he said yesterday in a statement from Fourth Army medical laboratory.

Tarsus ticks

He arrived at his opinion through tagging wood ticks for identification by a radioactive method.

He discovered they can absorb as much as 60,000 roentgens without death. He normally takes from 450 to 600 roentgens to kill an animal or human. A roentgen is a unit of measure of radiation.

Said the colonel, "Should" man destroy himself with awe-inspiring weapons and inventions, both man and animal could perish, leaving nothing but hardy insects to repopulate the world," he said he did not have information on how well fish could survive.

"BEEP" on immunity

His research also points out something that has been known for some time—that many insects have stepped up their ability to break down poison molecules and render them harmless.

Successive generations of some insects have increased their resistance to insecticides by 2,000 times, he said.

# Problem of Reunification Discussions At Meet Poses Problem for Adenauer

The German reunification conference in Bonn today was a major talking point for the record—that the reunification problem must be solved. The problem for Adenauer, as he made clear in his opening remarks, is how to make certain that the reunification problem is not neglected. There is, of course, no chance that Soviet Russia will agree to reunification on any terms acceptable to Adenauer and his allies in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. But the allies still insist—if only—

that there had been a drastic shift in Adenauer's policy. But Eckhardt's statement would create a favorable atmosphere for reunification negotiations.
