U. S. Delay in Space Project Hit by Expert

LOS ANGELES, March 21 (AP)—Dr. Robert von Braun, a top U. S. rocket expert who got the start on the American space program, said today that the delay in launching the program is because of the slow development of the space vehicle and because of the slow development of the space system, he said.

"Donald Douglas," he said, "is the man who is going to make it up when the space and the ground systems are developed."

Dr. von Braun said the nation's rocket system concept—which he likens to a horse and arrow neither of which is worth much without the other—is the line for development and progress.

He said it made sense to develop the space system through an integrated program which includes instruments, engines and so on, and to apply some concepts applied to space work here for the simple reason that no one can determine the stage of the development of a rocket without determining specific characteristics of the engine and the rocket.

Many ideas and proposals have been advanced, but most of them are unworkable, and only time and experience will tell which ideas were good and which were bad.

Spud Acreage Boost Is Seen By Gem State

BOISE, March 21 (AP)—Idaho growers plan to devote more acres to potatoes this year.

The U. S. agriculture department reported today that a survey of grower intentions showed that potato plantings in the Gem state may approximate 186,500 acres. This compares with the 1957 estimate of 172,200 acres planted and the 1949-56 average of 158,100 acres.

The department said that percentage-wise, a greater increase in acreage is indicated for Idaho's late summer area than for the fall area. The late summer area, the department said, could be attributed chiefly to the recent strengthening of the price for market potatoes.

"The indicated increase in acreage for the state's fall producing area appears to be associated with current strengthening of price for fresh market potatoes," the report said.

SEOUL, Korea, March 21 (AP)—Diplomatic sources said yesterday the communists may be ready to permit the reunification of Korea as a means of depriving the United States of its military foothold on the Asian mainland.

These observers said red China's desire for membership in the United Nations is another potent motive for "willing" North Korea.

The U. S. state department is opposing a new drive for reunification, and most of the top-ranked diplomats here expressed agreement with a United Press report published several weeks ago that the U. S. is not willing at least to permit U. N.-supervised all-Korean elections.

The communists have consistently opposed such elections because of the strong probability that they would lose, now appear likely, however, that they may be willing to give up North Korea's military and political rights in exchange for the stationing of U. S. troops in Asia.

The island nation of Formosa, which broke away from China probably would be assigned, is potentially vulnerable to nuclear-missile attack from the mainland.

It has been evident for some time that North Korea, except for the purpose of providing a more of a liability to the communists than an asset, has no real value to the U. S. in China. Noncontributing to U. S. support, but millions of dollars worth of Soviet aid that has been made available to them are going direct to the Koreans.

Sentence Backed By Oregon Court

PORTLAND, Ore., March 21 (AP)—Conviction of District Attorney William Langley on a charge of bribery which arose from his alleged gambling has been upheld by the Oregon supreme court.

Outbreak of Polio Is Feared in U. S.

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—Burgess-General Leroy Burney said yesterday that a possible outbreak of polio could occur this summer unless there is a precipitous halt to the nationwide milk-dinner program.

Burney said in a statement that he believes the disease has had 400,000 persons in the nation aged 40 and over in the last 40 years—still have not any anti-polio shots.

Burney said it is more important, he said, is the fact that more than one in four—or 19 million young people under the age of 10—have not had a single dose of vaccine.

Interest Rate Cut OK'd for Britain

LONDON, March 21 (AP)—The Bank of England's record high interest rate yesterday in a move to step up building and employment.

The bank rate, which governs practically all building and operating rates, drops from seven per cent to six per cent after six months at the highest level since World War II.

The move is expected to have a direct link between the government's action here and similar action in the United States last week.

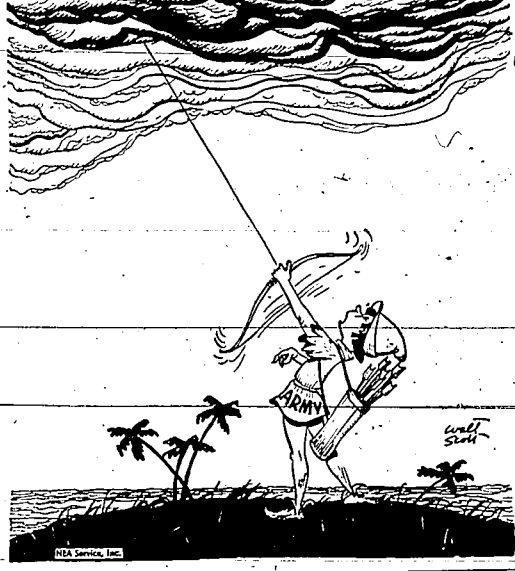

Expert Says too Many Classes Fail to Give Proper Basis for Life of Driving

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., March 21 — Too many high school driver education courses are failing to lay the proper groundwork for a lifetime of driving, a spokesman for the Association of Casualty and Surety Companies declared here.

After a decade of evaluating driver education programs in the nation, the association announced that its evaluation procedure is being sharply revised to place more emphasis on the quality of instruction given than on the number of schools and students participating in the program.

Thomas N. Boate, manager of the association's accident prevention department, said that the annual national high school driver education award program, established by the association 10 years ago, has been expanded in stimulating the expansion of driver education courses throughout the nation.

However, the movement has not gone as fast as adequate instruction, he said. He said that a great number of courses are being conducted so rapidly that they do not give the necessary to enable beginning drivers to pass a state driver's license examination. It is more important, he said, that proper driving attitudes be implanted in young drivers.

"You are being short-changed," he said, "if your son or daughter is simply being prepared to pass a driver's license examination. Driving is a lifetime business and the length of that lifetime is often determined by the attitude of automobile drivers."

Boate's comments were made at the northeastern regional conference of the President's committee for traffic safety which met here recently. The award program sponsored by the association grew out of recommendations made by its first White House traffic safety conference held in 1946.

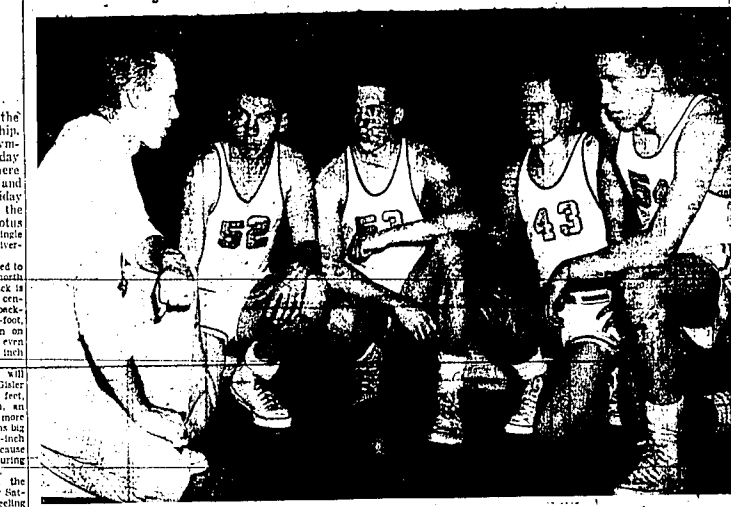

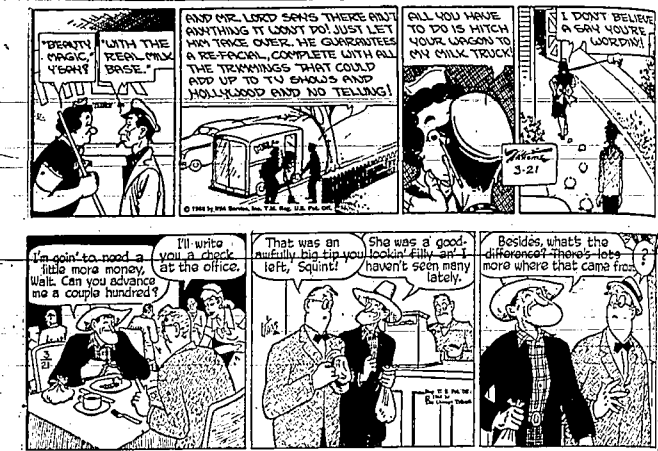

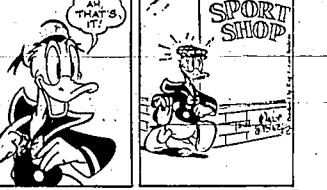

U. S. Prosperity Is Artificial, Say Both Republicans, Reds

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—The Russians have repeatedly charged that prosperity under capitalism is artificial and based on government's anxious to shoot the economy upwards, and keep it there, and big defense spending means jobs and profits.

"It's an unpleasant but realistic opinion which hovers over the prospects for a disarmament agreement with the Russians. Almost 40 billion dollars of this record peacetime budget of almost 74 billion dollars for defense.

"It's not hard to imagine what a big slash in defense spending, could mean for the economy in this recession period when the government is trying to strengthen the economy to stimulate employment and production.

The appearance of economic health is created by war expenditures, waste and extravagance, planned emergencies and war crises.

"They took another crack at the Democrats along the same line in 1948. The fact is, the American economy has not stood on its own feet since the depression days of the early '30s.

First, there were the big new deal spending programs to get out of the depression. They didn't quite make it. There were still almost 10 million unemployed when defense spending began in 1939.

At the peak of the war effort in 1944—unemployment had dropped to an annual average of 470,000 when almost 12 million men and women were in uniform.

The war created a gigantic, pent-up demand for goods and services. And the economy boomed after the war but then started to slide in 1949. Came the Korean war of 1950

and the economy soared up again. It slid again in 1954 but the country, while maintaining peace although putting huge sums into defense, righted itself and went up to new peaks of prosperity.

Now it's to another slide even though the government is planning record peacetime spending for defense next year.
