## Two Break Out of Jail in Shoshone, Get Away in Auto

SHOSHONE, March 26—Two men—one who pleaded innocent to cover to district court, and one who voluntarily confessed on a Louisiana parole—broke out of the Lincoln county jail between 2:30 and 3:30 a. m. 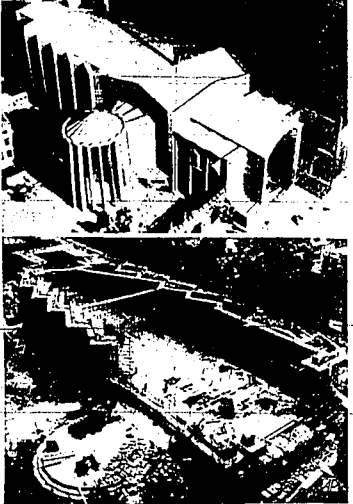

As soon as final action is taken, the county extension office will get the county committee to complete the signup.

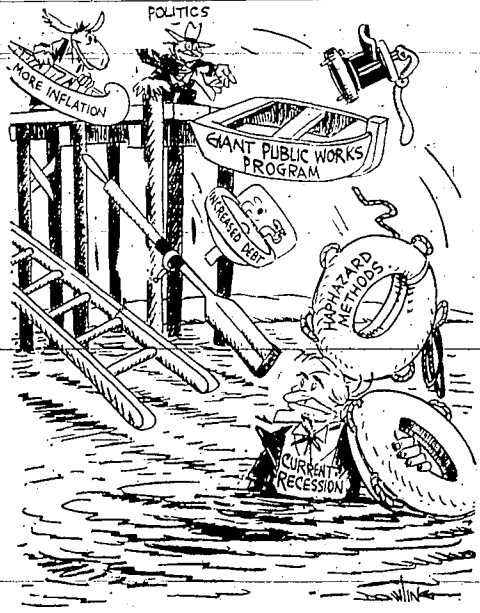

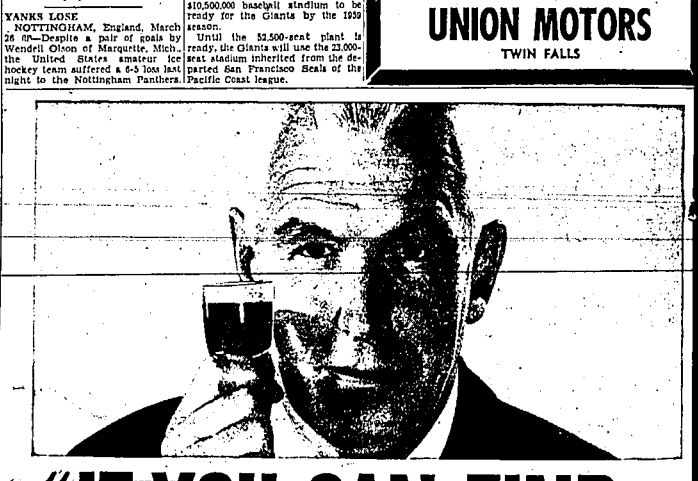

NEW YORK, March 26 (NEA)—Bill Russell needed only one full season in the pros to convince the National Basketball association that he's the premier player in the game today. In a three-way vote race with the old pro Dolph Schayes of Syracuse and high-scoring George Yardley of Detroit, the snake-armed center of the Boston Celtics was named winner of the 1958 President's cup, awarded by NEA Service to the outstanding player of the NBA. The verdict was handed down by an expanding jury, the 80 players of the eight teams in the league who were restrained from voting for their own teammates. With a tally based on five points for first, three for second place and one for third, Russell rolled up a total of 228 points—30 more than runner-up Schayes. Yardley was third with 120. ### Annual School Levy Election Is Scheduled Here on April 8

After no protests were registered at the annual budget hearing of class A school district No. 411 Tuesday night, the school board decided to hold the annual levy election on April 8.

Teachers will be asked to approve a five-mill levy for maintenance and operation of schools. Without holding the election, the school board can levy 25 mills, but voters must approve any mill levy over that amount. The total mill levy for maintenance and operation, with the five-mill levy, will be the same as at present.

Total revenue based on the 20-mill levy, would be \$1,364,688.82. The figure includes an estimated \$75,000 expected to be apportioned to the school district under special county aid as specified in house bill 244 passed by the last session of the legislature.

Although the \$75,000 is carried in the budget, it is not specifically committed in expenditures because of the tentative nature of the revenue.

Teachers' salaries are budgeted at a total of \$122,000 for next year, as compared to \$121,000 for the present year, an increase of \$1,000. Of that amount, \$2,000 is budgeted for increments on the present salary scale and \$25,000 is earmarked for eight additional teachers indicated for next year.

The proposed budget lists \$49,500 for capital outlay as compared to \$28,000 at present.

Other changes in the new budget show only nominal differences from the present budget.

In tables presented along with the budget, Supr. Ernest H. Tagland allowed a 40 per cent increase

### Vets Urged to Keep Policies

OF insurance policyholders who plan to re-enter military service should not drop their policies in the belief they will be covered by the so-called "free \$10,000 insurance" or indemnity, reports Arnold Helweg, local veterans administration representative.

Helweg says the indemnity coverage ended more than a year ago, on Oct. 1, 1935.

An increasing number of veterans are returning to service are making this mistake, he says. They apparently do not know that the indemnity or so-called "free insurance" no longer is available, he notes.

"Most of these veterans were discharged while the indemnity still was in effect," Helweg says, "it was abolished Jan. 1, 1937, by the survivors' benefit act, which authorized increased compensation for

rates for service-connected deaths," he adds. Helweg advises veterans, "If you go back into service, don't drop your GI insurance. In the belief you'll get free coverage, you won't, and you may lose your insurance in the bargain if it is near the end of a five-year term period."
