Officers Hunt Young Driver Of Death Car

COLVILLE, Wash., April 1 (AP)—A warrant charging failure to stop at the scene of an accident has been issued against a 20-year-old Spokane youth involved in a three-car accident here Saturday which claimed one life and seriously hurt three other persons.

Colville Police Chief John Habberstad said yesterday the warrant was issued against William Butcher, believed to be driver of the car which contained the dead and the injured.

Butcher vanished from the accident scene soon after the crash and a two-day search failed to turn up any clue as to his whereabouts, officers said. It was thought at first Butcher may have wandered away from the accident after being dazed in the crash.

Jessie Lee Antanson, 14, Colville, was killed in the crash. Her brother, Raymond, Beverly Clark, 14, Colville, and Morris Richards, Spokane, were seriously hurt. Drivers of the other two cars involved were uninjured, and Chief Habberstad said no charges are expected to be filed against them.

Batista Given Great Power

On Rebellion

HAVANA, April 1.—Congress has proclaimed a national emergency, giving President Fulbright extraordinary powers for the next 45 days to meet a rebel threat of "total annihilation."

At a special session last night, the senate-ignoring opposition charges that it was setting up a "coercive dictatorship"—granted the government's request for emergency powers by a vote of 85 to 1.

During the period of the emergency, Batista may rule by decree, subject to the advice of a special 14-member joint congressional committee and eventual ratification by the entire legislature.

Congress will be dissolved for the duration of the emergency. It will meet again at 6 p. m. on the day the grant of special powers expires.

Specifically, Batista's emergency powers enable him to meet rebel leaders of a general strike by "insulating" labor—ordering access to remain on the job on pain of imprisonment, and perhaps even drifting public service employees into the armed forces.

He also is empowered to "increase the armed forces as much as seems necessary."

Take over all transportation and communication including highways, air, inland waterways and "maritime areas."
