BOISE, April 11 (AP)—Parents throughout Idaho have given a green light for schools to establish different types of programs for students of varying academic talents.

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U.S. Says Russia's Proposed Moscow Meet Unacceptable

WASHINGTON, April 11 (AP)—The United States quickly denounced an unacceptable today a Russian suggestion for opening preparatory talks for a summit conference in Moscow next Thursday. The U. S. reaction, one of the fastest on record, was announced from the White House while President Eisenhower and Secretary of State Dulles were still discussing a note just received from Moscow. The Soviet note was made public in full. It said in effect that an ambassadors' meeting in Moscow and after conference of East-West foreign ministers should precede the actual summit meeting. It said that the summit meeting should be held in Moscow in the last half of April. The White House said the Russian reply is manifestly not an acceptance to this Western proposal.

The official view here, the heart of the Western proposal was that there should be preparatory talks aimed at such a time and place for summit talks and at bringing out, by general discussion, the possibilities of agreement at the summit.

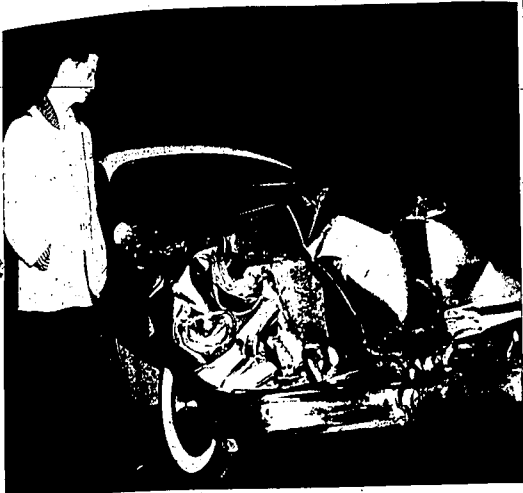

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—The makers of the durable goods which provide basic support for the nation's great economic apparatus—automobiles, building materials, electrical appliances, furniture, and other necessities—may be—perhaps themselves out of the market—more of less price-conscious than the American people's buying habits in the process.

The Federal Reserve Board's figures will show a 4.5 million dollar drop in the total buying of tin, the first in more than three years.

Light surveys reflect—On the other hand, they reflect a sharp increase in expenditures for what goods and services. For such articles as food, clothing, heat, and light, personal services and recreation, the jump will be about 5 percent.

Photo Shows Location, Work on Oxbow Dam of Snake River



Construction of Idaho Power company's Oxbow dam is now in high gear in this wilderness area where the Snake river sweeps around the "oxbow" bend between towering mountains on the Idaho-Oregon border. Oxbow's rock-fill embankment, 200 feet high and flanked by concrete spillways on Idaho and Oregon sides of river, will block snake (1). Water backed up by embankment will be funneled by intake at (2). Intake tunnel leading to powerhouse (3) on opposite side of river. The mountain that creates big bend in the river, flow of which is indicated by arrow. Big work force at Oxbow is rapidly excavating to build cofferdam that will help isolate embankment area from river. Work is also under way at both ends of diversion tunnel, with gate structure being built at upstream end and fish-handling facilities nearing completion at downstream end. Located at (4) is crushing plant that provides rock to make concrete for Oxbow and for Fremont dam. Idaho Power's other new hydro project located 12 miles upstream. (Staff engraving.)

Scientist Says Army Working On Potent Missile Destroyer

MILWAUKEE, Wis., April 11 (AP)—An army scientist says the army is working on an ultimate "missile" that can destroy anything an enemy could throw at the United States. He also said a counter weapon of the future will have "greatly increased" effectiveness, range and accuracy. He said it can destroy not only enemy aircraft, but also missiles that could be used in the future just ahead of the "missile" that is the millisecond. Schilling told the Milwaukee Journal that the army is working on these clubs' annual gridiron. A member of the Redstone arsenal team which helped launch America's explorers, Schilling said that

Good Growing Conditions May Set Record for Wheat Surplus

WASHINGTON, April 11 (AP)—Continued favorable growing conditions, this year's wheat crop could easily push surpluses of the grain to a new record high. A winter wheat crop of 904 million bushels was forecast by the agriculture department yesterday. A spring wheat crop of 250 million bushels appears possible. These combined winter and spring crops should be at least 160 million bushels more than markets are expected to take. This extra wheat would be added to a present reserve and surplus of 180 million bushels to give a new total of 1,084,000,000. The previous record surplus was 1,036,000,000 in 1955. Should the crop turn out as now

indicated, it would wipe out gains made by the government in reducing excess supplies under the soil bank land retirement program. Unusually favorable soil moisture conditions were said to prevail in most winter wheat areas, particularly in the Great Plains where drought had plagued producers in previous years. The department reported, however, that cold, wet weather has delayed the 1958 season for most other crops. It also has held down normal seasonal increases in the production of milk. Egg production in March was per cent below that of the like month last year. A major factor was a smaller laying flock. On the favorable side was a re-
