Sick Russians Wait Long for Hospital Care

MOSCOW, April 14 (AP)—It can take a long time for a patient to get into a hospital in the Soviet Union, according to a writer in the newspaper Literary Gazette, says hospital overcrowding is the greatest increase in facilities in the last 40 years. He reports cases sometimes are allowed to die on the spot while lengthy hospitalization is required.

Waits 6 Years
Dr. Kulshov, who visited this country, a Moscow welder first started applying for treatment because of tenosynovitis and stomach pain in September, 1952. Hospital treatment was indicated but not given.

After seven successive visits to doctors over a year he finally had an X-ray taken in May, 1954. The pictures showed he had developed an ulcer since his first request for treatment.

It was still 18 months later that hospitalization was prescribed. Two years later he got it in early 1958.

Could He Be Treated?
"Is it any wonder," wrote Dr. Kulshov, "that now he will be hospitalized for a long time? And the whole thing could have been prevented if the doctor had prescribed treatment when the patient first called."

One of the troubles, according to Dr. Kulshov, is the work load prescribed by the ministry of health for Soviet doctors. General practitioners are expected to receive six patients an hour or one every 10 minutes.

The Soviet Union has specialized medicine. Treatment in state clinics and hospitals is free—paid for out of government tax revenues.

House Will Investigate Rules On Export of Scientific Data

WASHINGTON, April 14 (AP)—House secretary fees said today they plan public hearings on "controlling" commerce department rules on the export of scientific information.

Some scientists have complained that the regulations give their foreign colleagues the impression this country is "playing safe and robbing" about the exchange of non-secret, technical data.

The house government information subcommittee said it would hold hearings on the matter soon. Commerce Secretary Sinclair Weeks will be asked to testify.

Rep. John E. Moss, D. Calif., subcommittee chairman, has called for a "complete overhaul" of the department's rules on the export of non-secret, scientific information.

Moss said he also wants assurances that the department would not use a two-year extension of the export controls act, now pending before congress, as authority "for imposing censorship."

Subcommittee staff members said the panel is interested particularly in an explanation of a recent revision of the rules on letters or publications scientists send abroad.

Three rules originally provided that the envelope bearing such non-secret data bear a stamp "export license not required." The subcommittee has heard testimony that the rules were "containing" to scientists, both here and abroad.

The subcommittee also is interested in determining whether the functions of the office of strategic information, now defunct, are being handled elsewhere in the commerce department.

The OSI was supposed to coordinate the flow of information overseas but the subcommittee complained it operated as a check. The house abolished it last year by deleting its funds from an appropriation bill.

In correspondence with the subcommittee, the commerce department has stated that its object was to "maximize the free flow" of information, but prevent "a material contribution" to the strength of "potentially hostile nations."
