Wind Storms Cause Losses Across Texas

Wind, rain and hail storms ripped wide sections of the Southwest yesterday and last night, causing heavy damage in northern Texas. Thunderstorms whipped by winds up to 80 miles an hour struck Fort Worth, Tex., uprooting trees, falling power lines and shattering windows. High winds also raked Dallas, Amarillo and Wichita Falls, Tex., and demolished 30 private boats at Pecos Kingdom lake.

High up to half an inch in diameter pounded Binger, Tex., last night, and at least two tornadoes touched ground near Dumas, Tex., but caused no damage.

Other funnel clouds were reported yesterday in east-central Illinois near Benton and east central Arkansas near Little Rock.

The spall line marked the path of a cold air front which pushed eastward out of Texas and by nightfall extended to the Carolinas and north to New York state.

Pre-emption also occurred along the lower Great Lakes, the Ohio and Grand rivers and into Michigan and northern Alabama. Hinton, Miss., was doused with 31 inches of rain during the night and marbled hail and high winds accompanied the storm.

The storm front sent readings dipping into the 40s and 50s in the Great Lakes and Mississippi valley streams, and Grand Rapids, Mich., reported an early morning low of 27.

By contrast, 100-plus temperatures hit the southern California yesterday and weathermen predicted more falling readings today. The mercury dipped to 92 in Los Angeles, and 23 baseball fans suffered heat exhaustion at the coliseum.

Burbank, Calif., recorded an all-time April record high of 100 degrees, and the desert record of Palm Springs and the town of Thermal baked in 106-degree temperatures.

Readings continued in the mid 80s in most of the Atlantic coast region.

Weathermen predicted more showers today in the northern plains; the upper Mississippi valley and the Great Lakes. Thunderstorms and showers and thunderstorms were expected from the southern plains east to the Atlantic coast.

Scattered showers also were expected in the Rockies with some heavy flurries in parts of the central Rockies.

Bidault Sets Out to Form New Cabinet

PARIS, April 21 (AP)—Georges Bidault, twice a postwar premier, set out today to form a new French cabinet but his underlying "hard" policy on Algeria was believed to have doomed his efforts in advance. Bidault, a member of the Catholic Popular Republicans (MPP), is considered pro-Western. But he would hold on to Algeria even at the cost of a rift with France's NATO partners.

Bidault, 59, was chosen yesterday by President Rene Coty to make the first try at solving what appears to be the greatest political crisis in the postwar history of France.

Must Clear Hurdles
If he gets past the initial hurdles of his political consultations today he is expected to go before the national assembly later this week and to get approval. If he cannot bring him down, Coty would have to name another candidate.

Bidault led the fight which ousted Premier Felix Gaillard six days ago in a burst of anti-Americanism by the right-wing coalition. However, Bidault himself did not take part in the onslaught against American policy in Indochina.

The slightly-bull wartime resistance hero has these stumbling blocks to clear before he can become premier:
He is at odds with his own party, Bidault, in ultra-nationalist. His party backed Gaillard last Tuesday and it is not certain the MRP would back Bidault's attempt.

Opposed by Reds
The left-wing groups, the Communists, with 140 votes in the 500-member assembly, are violently anti-Bidault. This stems from the close of the war in Indochina when Bidault, then foreign minister, called for armed American intervention. About 10 other left-wing groups, violently anti-Bidault.

The socialists, with 100 key votes, have warned they would not support a "policy of adventure" in north Africa. Followers of Bidault have hinted they would like to mount military operations against Tunisia to prevent its alleged interference in Algeria.

Aide Says Russia May Help Israel
JERUSALEM, Israel, April 21 (AP)—The newspaper Yediot Aharonot quoted Soviet embassy commercial attache Vladimir Balchenko yesterday as saying Russia was willing to match American capital investment in Israel.

The newspaper said Balchenko told a group of industrialists in Tel Aviv Thursday that Russia "is giving favorable consideration to the broadening of her commercial and industrial ties with Israel."

"It is untrue that only American capital is able to develop Israel—Russian capital is just as able and willing," the newspaper quoted the attache as saying.

Chinese Develop New Blood Veins
LONDON, April 21 (AP)—Chinese surgeons have used nylon blood vessels in successful attempt to treat high blood pressure, radio Peiping said yesterday.

It said the specially-prepared nylon vessels were developed by the Shanghai branch of the textile research institute. The scientists now plan to produce "w-shaped artificial vessels to replace different sections of the human arterial system," it said.

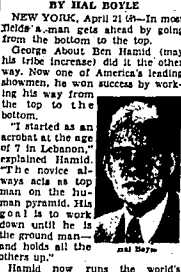
