High Food Prices Send Cost of Living Index to Record High for Nation

WASHINGTON, April 23.—Soaring food prices sent the government living cost index up seven-tenths of one percent in March to a new record high. It was the largest monthly advance since July, 1936, and was attributable principally to higher food cost which also reached a new peak level. The bureau of labor statistics said its index rose to 92.3 per cent of the 1947-49 average. This is 3.7 per cent higher than the figure in March of last year. The new living cost index means a pay raise of two to four cents an hour for two to four cents a million workers more. These rates move up and down with index changes. The bureau said the railroad industry will receive a four-cent hourly raise.

Congress Gets Plans on Help For Railroads

WASHINGTON, April 23.—The campaign against the recession yesterday passed a major milestone as the House of Representatives passed a bill to help the railroads, plus new legislation for aid against cutting back.

Secretary of Commerce Curtis presented the railroad plan to Congress with the approval of President Roosevelt. Under the bill, the government would authorize appropriations of up to 300 million dollars for loans which would be used to improve and modernize their facilities and equipment. The plan also authorized the federal government to advance by the railroads, for most of the 3 per cent federal tax on freight and 1 per cent on passenger fares.

Spring Snow General In Magic Valley Area

Snowfall was general throughout Magic Valley Wednesday morning with more snow in the mountains and in the valleys. Storms were raging over Galena summit with 10 inches of new snow reported there Tuesday night. The morning snow melted rapidly in most sections of the valley and roads were reported clear. Snow was still falling at Hailey at noon and temperatures were below normal.

Recession Is Boy, 4, Trapped in Flattening, 'Flaming Auto,' Dies Before Declares Of Extensive Burns

A 4-year-old Twin Falls boy died at 10:05 p.m. Tuesday in Magic Valley Memorial hospital six hours after incurring burns to 60 per cent of his body as he lay helpless in a body cast on the rear seat of an automobile. The boy, Gerald Lynn Ash, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Ash, 359 Diamond street, was burned about 4 p.m. as the family 1918 Plymouth smoldered unobserved for several minutes on the parking lot behind city hall. City employees discovered the burning car about 10:30 p.m. and the boy's mother, failed to hear the child's screams. When the smoldering car was discovered the boy was lying in a body cast under a blanket in the car. Mrs. Ash was in the district health department with the car. Burned. Attracted by noise outside she ran out to see her smoldering car. Her screams "My baby is there!" brought action from city employees and arriving firemen. City Fireman Jack Winslow incurred burns to his hands after he forced open the locked rear door and lifted the flaming little bundle from the car. A city employee and Windsor smothered the flames with blankets.

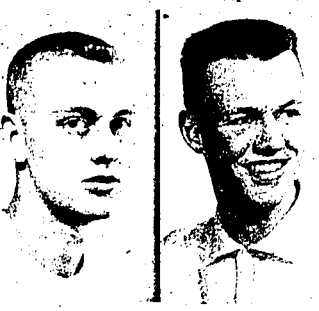

WASHINGTON, April 23 (AP)—Two Pacific Northwest senators yesterday announced the slow pace of Columbia river development to a lack of knowledge by the states of the effects of proposed Canadian diversion proposals on the Pacific Northwest economy.

The contention was voiced by Senators Church, D. Ida., and Neuberger, D. Ore., after Mr. George Z. Cistich, chief of army engineers for civil works, said the lack of any federal agency studying the effects of the proposed Canadian diversion of Columbia river water into the all-Canada Fraser river.

Neuberger agreed. He said he contacted the director in the Fraser to the "really dangerous" Canadian proposal. Ichinger brought the Fraser river into the proposals now under study to gain added flood control storage on the Columbia and to tributaries.

Neuberger said he had proposed a study of the dam on the North Fork in a year and the construction of Bruce Eddy dam on the North Fork of the Snake river.

Dr. John R. Heller, director of the National Cancer Institute, told the Senate appropriations subcommittee that "current studies are substantially increasing our understanding of viruses as a possible cause of cancer."

He said one project supported by the institute has developed a vaccine which protects 80 per cent of mice from a virus-caused disease resembling leukemia.

Whether it would have applied to human cancer, Dr. Heller said, is still the object of research. He added there is no proof that human cancer is caused by a virus.

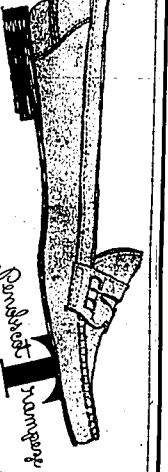

and more to repressive measures against political critics.

The Soviet charge that U. S. bombers were flying toward Russia during World War III did not surprise much. They figured that probably the Russians were in fact worried about operation of planes packing hydrogen bombs and that they also saw an opportunity to put the United States on the defensive on an issue which might eventually come up in a summit meeting.

But Russia's introduction of the problem into the security council came as a real surprise. It should have been evident to Khrushchev that the Soviets picked a perceptively unwise, which is what happened Monday.

Furthermore the raising of the

Issue tended to undercut Russia's propaganda line about her military strength.

The Soviets have been boasting that their ICBMs have turned their apparent worry over SAC's secret to confidence.

All these considerations suggest, state department authorities say, that the Russian action was impulsive and arbitrary, the sort of thing that only Khrushchev could do without consulting, or in defiance of, his advisers.

Where this sort of thing may lead, no one here will predict. As Khrushchev's hardness increases with his power and with the play of world events he may turn more and more to the iron fisted methods he knew in Stalin's days. Yet the temperateness of this impulsive man is not

exactly the same as Stalin's, and this could make some difference.

All in all, however, authorities here would not be surprised if events from here on work in the direction of a powerful new dealignment in Moscow.

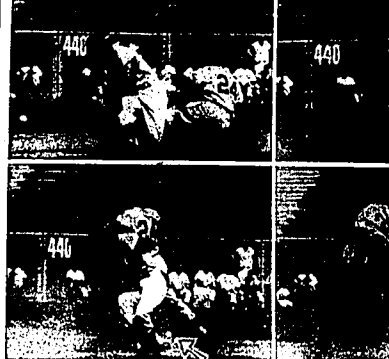

Man Deported To Finland to Be Readmitted

WASHINGTON, April 23 (AP)—The government, after hustling William Heikilla off to Finland, conceded yesterday it acted too quickly and said he can come back to continue his 11-year fight against deportation.

The 56-year-old draftsman was nabbed by immigration officers as he emerged from the San Francisco last Friday and was whisked away by plane to Canada. He returned in Finland yesterday in a snowstorm minus an overcoat or hat and dressed in a summer suit.

Heikilla said he had been kidnapped. He had no luggage and complained he had not even had a chance to say goodbye to his wife or get a toothbrush.

U. S. to Pay Way

Immigration Commissioner Joseph M. Swine authorized Heikilla's return, with the government paying his way. He said he had been in the case: "I have come to the conclusion that an error in judgment was made in not returning Heikilla to his country, D. C. last Sunday."

It was at that time that Federal District Judge Charles H. Clark in San Francisco issued a restraining order to block Heikilla's deportation. He said Heikilla, "although legally deported from the United States, was still in the custody of immigration officers."

The deportation proceedings against Heikilla over almost 11 years have been based on charges that he formerly was a member of the U. S. Communist party. At one time he had an appeal to the supreme court.

Admits Charge

Heikilla was born in Finland of naturalized American parents and came to the United States when he was 2½ years old. He was never naturalized.

In Helsinki Tuesday, Heikilla said he regrets the United States action and would like to return.

"Sure, I was a communist in 1923 to 1932 in Milwaukee," he said. "But from the time I left there for San Francisco I have had nothing to do with politics. I have not had the time. I have just been working. I am a Democrat."
